People are slowly coming back to Mass and a number of people keep connected through our live-streaming the 10:00 am Mass. As we continue to move out of the pandemic, we are learning new ways to evangelize and reach out to let the Good News of Christ be proclaimed. And we continue to teach the beauties of the Catholic faith to our children in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program.
