From The Finance Council:

St Teresa's fiscal years run from July 1 to June 30. The Parish's net surplus (inclusive of investment earnings/losses) for the first half of fiscal 2023 (the six months ended December 31) equaled \$27k, \$172k below last year and \$18k above budget. For purposes of further analysis, results are segregated between Net Ordinary (typically recurring activities) and Net Other (less frequent activities, such as bequests) in accordance with Archdiocese of Chicago reporting guidelines.

The unfavorable variance versus last year resulted primarily due to current year Investment losses versus prior year gains and higher Other Expense (largely a deposit for a new kitchen stove and other capital expenditures). Net Ordinary results declined \$7k versus last year, as the impact of lower net Fundraising revenue (largely Together in Joy) was partially offset by higher Other Revenue (a one-time contribution in support of the Food Pantry and Loaves and Fishes dinners) and lower Expenses (largely lower Salaries and Benefits due to open staff positions).

The small favorable variance versus budget resulted from higher Net Ordinary results, partially offset by Investment losses. The higher Net Ordinary result was due to lower Expenses (open staff positions) and higher Other Revenue (one-time contribution), partially offset by lower Collections. Last year's Collections were depressed in the first half but rebounded in the second. Also, while Net Revenue from Fundraising was essentially at budget, it was at the lower end of the more recent historical range.

Looking ahead, the budget for the second half of the year already anticipated a net loss, as fundraising income from November typically funds the operating loss in the second half of the year. However, during 2H 2022 we experienced a material increase in collections that has not been sustained in 1H 2023 as planned. If the first half level of FY 2023 Collections persists, the Parish is at risk of experiencing its first full year operating loss (excludes investment gains and losses) in over a decade.

We have sufficient cash reserves to weather this risk but will temporarily defer filling two open staff positions for the time being. The second half plan also includes \$25k in discretionary support for Refugee Ministries as part of our Avila in Action program. A decision on proceeding with this expenditure has not yet been made.

Thank you for your continued support of St Teresa's. If you have capacity, please consider increasing

your level of giving; our Food Pantry, Loaves and Fishes dinners, Refugee, Prison, and other ministries

depend on your time, talent, and treasure. Finally, please encourage your family and friends to return to

Mass. While we are proud of the work done by St. Teresa's outreach ministries, the celebration of the

Eucharist is the heartbeat of our thriving community.
