#### LET'S BREAK THE CHAINS TOGETHER ON JUNE 4TH AFTER ALL MASSES OPOP FUNDRAISER FOR TEAM ROBERT



Many of you have been asking how can we help our One Parish One Prisoner (OPOP) ministry? We are ready to answer that question.

June 4th is our moment. Please join us for St. Teresa's first OPOP Fundraiser for Team Robert which will take place after the Masses on June 4th in the Parish Center lobby. (Team Stephen's Fundraiser will occur in the Fall closer to his discharge date.)

Did you know that St. Teresa and one other parish (ICSJ is the other) are the only parishes in the Archdiocese to be selected to be in this ministry. We are the pilots or guinea pigs, so to speak and it has been a ride. The goal is to have OPOP spread to other parishes and grow the program. It's success kind of depends on us.

St. Teresa is sponsoring two prisoners to assist in reentry. Robert is the first to reenter after over 20 years. A lot has changed since he was incarcerated in 1997 and he will need financial assistance to begin to live in today's world. Robert has no family on the outside. He hadn't had a visitor since 2011 until our OPOP team visited him. Just imagine that - no one visiting you for over 11 years. He took a chance and applied to be involved in our OPOP program. His only connection with the outside world is St. Teresa of Avila parish.

Please join us after all masses on June 4th to celebrate this ministry and to raise funds to get Robert on his feet for the first months of his reentry and to help him build a financial safety net while he gets gainful employment. We estimate that this may cost somewhere between \$10,000 and \$15,000 as Robert literally has nothing. OPOP will be involved in budgeting and planning for Robert's expenses. If there is a surplus, we will utilize the proceeds for our other incarcerated friend, Stepen, when he is released. If your are unable to attend the June 4th fundraisers after each Mass, please consider donating through Give Central. The QR code to assist in the donation process is below. We could not have this ministry without the support of our generous parish. We are all members of the OPOP ministry! Thank You, Team Robert.


