

Thank you, thank you, thank you for your support of the One Parish, One Prisoner Ministry (OPOP)! At the time this was written, the OPOP fund reached just over \$11,000 through donations from family, friends, the second collection

and after-mass fundraisers on June 4. While that is short of our goal of \$15,000, it is a testament to your generosity that on our first push for funds, we are more than two-thirds of the way to our goal. Thank you!

In addition to showing up in large numbers to our after-mass events, SEVEN parishioners signed up to help us in some capacity in this ministry with Robert and you wrote nearly 70 notes of encouragement to Robert! When those were delivered to him on Monday, he looked at the stack of envelopes and the art supplies two parishioners brought as a gift for him in amazement! He is extremely grateful and asked us to relay his appreciation to all of you.

If you were not able to attend one of the events on June 4, you can still help us reach our goal of \$15,000. There are posters at the entrances to the church with instructions on how to give and a QR code is also included below for your convenience. These funds will go directly into our OPOP operating account which our Team and the parish have sole control over. We will distribute the funds prudently for Robert's needs as he acclimates to life beyond the tombs.
