From Fr Frank:

August 28, 2023

I am writing this on the Feast of St. Augustine, one of the Church's greatest theologians from the fourth and fifth centuries. His spiritual depth continues to shape and inform contemporary theological thought throughout western Christianity. The following are words from Augustine's greatest work, Confessions, a deeply personal account of his conversion to Christ after living a very self centered life, even fathering a child:

"Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unloveliness, I plunged into the lovely things you created. You created me but I was not with You. Created things kept me from You. You called, You shouted, and you broke through my deafness...you dispelled my blindness. You breathed fragrance on me, I drew breath from You and now I pant for You. You touched me and now I burn for peace."

These words could be prayed over and reflected upon for hours on end for they speak an experience each one of us relates to. Conversion to Christ is a life long journey of encountering the God who dwells within, a living breathing spirit of love that we allow to lie dormant as we pursue happiness on everything OUTSIDE of ourselves.

What lies "outside" is truly good and beautiful since being created by God, but they can't bring salvation. Only the living, pulsating presence of God, dwelling within the very heart of our souls and spirits, once "tapped into" and given freedom to possess us, can transform and transfigure our very beings.

Labor Day:

The Parish office will be closed on Monday September 4th in observance of the Labor Day Holiday.



Parish Finance Update:

St. Teresa's fiscal year ended June 30, 2023. This year's net surplus equaled \$35k (\$26k excluding Investment results). This result maintained the parish's long track record of annual net surpluses excluding Investment results, but fell \$46k below the prior year level, largely due to lower Collections

and Fundraising revenue. The shortfall in revenue became apparent early in the fiscal year, and the Parish deferred filling two open staff positions and planned Avila in Action grants as a result.

For purposes of further discussion, results are segregated between Net Ordinary (typically recurring activities) and Net Other (less frequent activities) in accordance with Archdiocese of Chicago reporting guidelines.

Net Ordinary Results: 2023 Net Ordinary results, excluding Investment results, equaled a surplus of \$27k, \$26k lower than last year. As noted above, lower Collections and Fundraising (largely Together in Joy) revenue were only partially offset by lower Expenses (largely Salaries and Benefits).

Net Other Results: 2023 Net Other results equaled a loss of \$1k, \$20k lower than last year. The decrease reflected higher Capital Improvements (largely replacement of the Parish Center range) and Extraordinary Expenses (roof repairs) only partially offset by higher Other Revenue (a contribution for a portion of the range cost and One Parish One Prisoner collections).

Investment Earnings: The Parish shifted certain assets to the Archdiocese's Growth Fund in February2021. The Growth Fund involves more risk and greater volatility than our prior investment in a CD but is expected to generate higher returns over the long-term. The current year gain reflects the overall net increase in the value of equity and fixed income assets during the year.

Looking Ahead: Earlier this year, we reviewed and approved the budget for fiscal 2024. The coming year's results are planned at roughly break even. To control costs, the two open staff positions are assumed to remain open. We also anticipate further roof repairs will be required. Thanks for your continued support to St. Teresa's. Your commitment through attendance at Mass, the weekly Collection, and our annual fundraising event are critical to the Parish's success.
