

Formation of a New Spirituality Prayer Group

With all the divisiveness and rancor so evident in our culture and in the ways we relate to each other in our differences, I thought one way to anchor this Spirituality Group would be to focus on discovering and deepening our Faith through culture: literature, poetry, art, music, drama, film.

Just to get things going, I thought about reading together a wonderful book by a Trappist monk known for his spiritual teaching: Grace, A Journey To God. This book is such a gift because it explores the grounding and foundation of our life in Christ:Grace. ALL is Grace!!!

I'm hoping to be a participant in this group, not so much the leader. We all can take part in guiding and facilitating. Rooting prayer and faith in culture, plays, movies, art exhibits, spiritual writing, and more seems a way to bring some peace and beauty in these difficult times.

God is the ultimate Beauty and our prayer and spiritual lives are meant to shape us in the beauty Who us God. And God's gift of Grace makes US beautiful!!!!

#### **Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

#### **Understanding Forgiveness**

The parable of the Unforgiving Servant in the Gospel for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A (Matthew 18:21-35) conveys a significant lesson about forgiveness. Though the details of slavery and debt bondage may seem distant, the core message resonates with contemporary readers: God's mercy is abundant, and we must pass that mercy on to others. Just as the king forgives the servant's debt, we too have been forgiven by God, and we are called to extend that same grace to others.

The parable takes a serious turn when the forgiven servant fails to show mercy to another. This harsh act is met with severe consequences, reflecting a spiritual truth: If we do not forgive others, we risk losing the grace we have received. The Gospel calls Catholics to be mindful of how we treat others, recognizing that our actions reflect our relationship with God. Forgiveness is not optional but a necessary expression of our faith.

The Gospel challenges the tendency to quantify or limit forgiveness. Peter's question about how many times to forgive is answered by Jesus with a call to unlimited mercy. God's forgiveness is not constrained by numbers or conditions; it's a boundless grace that transforms us. For Catholics, this is a reminder to approach others with the same unlimited compassion and forgiveness, reflecting God's own boundless love in our daily lives.

#### The Essence of Forgiveness

Forgiveness is central to the readings for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A. Both readings convey that forgiveness is not merely a personal virtue but a spiritual principle deeply intertwined with our relationship with God. It's depicted as a path towards healing and grace, rather than a sign of weakness or concession. As we forgive others, we reflect God's infinite mercy and open ourselves to His healing love.

The readings highlight the reciprocal nature of forgiveness: our willingness to forgive others is connected to the forgiveness we receive from God. In Sirach, we are urged to forgive others if we wish to be forgiven by the Lord. Similarly, in Matthew's Gospel, the king's forgiveness of the servant's debt is conditioned on the servant's willingness to forgive others. This theme calls on us as Catholics to recognize forgiveness as a two-way street, a mutual exchange that reflects our understanding of God's mercy.

kingdom and in our lives.


"A Biblical Walk Through The Mass" begins on October 15! Join us, on Sunday at 8:50 –

On the weekend of September 23/24, the Little Sisters of the Poor will visit our Parish to share their vocation of hospitality to the elderly. St. Mary's Home in Chicago is one of 162 Homes for the elderly poor operated by the Little Sisters in 31 countries around the world.

Acute and considerable continues to be their need for financial support. Virtually all of the current Residents of St. Mary's Home qualify for Medicaid,

and a few receive meager pensions. But these modest funds cover, at best, about half of the annual expenses. The Little Sisters have ministered to thousands of elders in Chicago for 146 years. Your support will enable them to continue their mission of caring for the neediest seniors of every race and religion in a spirit of reverence and of humble service. God bless you!




