


Lenten Project:

During Lent, many of us think of things to give up, or discover different ways that one can give back and donate their time, talent, or gifts. This Lenten Season, we encourage you to especially remember those that have less than us, and in some cases, nothing. As you are aware, we have an influx of refugee's trying to get resettled in Chicago; in fact there is expected to be 3 time more refugees this year than in past years. We currently partner with an organization called Exodus and we have committed to welcoming a handful of new families into their homes this year.

Starting on Ash Wednesday, we will have a cross displayed in the front of church. The cross will have nails on it, and attached to each nail, are items that a family would need when moving into a new apartment.

We encourage each family to grab 1 nail to take home and display during the season of Lent, to remember not only the Lord's suffering, but those who have suffered persecution in their own country and have fled to the US to build a new life. We ask that you buy the items listed on the nail, and return the items by March 17th to the parish. The items must be new, and you can return them unwrapped and drop them off in Bins in church.

This is a wonderful activity to do as a Family during Lent, and you can involve your kids and encourage them to assist in picking out items to purchase.

If you prefer to do this online, or when we run out of nails, we have a QR Code listed that is tied to an Amazon Wish List for the refugees (provided below). You can scan and purchase items that will be shipped directly to the rectory.

Six Month Finance Update:

St. Teresa's net surplus for the first half of fiscal 2024 equaled \$122k (\$75k excluding

Investment results), reflecting the timing of Together in Joy. However, absent Together in

Joy, the parish operates at an average weekly deficit of ~\$3.7k. As a result, the full year

budget and our most recent estimate for fiscal 2024 (the year ended June 30, 2024) anticipates a modest loss excluding Investment results.

For purposes of further discussion, results are segregated between Net Ordinary (typically recurring activities) and Net Other (more infrequent activities) in accordance with Archdiocese of Chicago reporting guidelines.

Net Ordinary: Net Ordinary results (excluding Investment earnings) equaled \$65k, \$37k below last year and \$15k below budget. The unfavorable variances reflect higher expenses and below budget Collections, partially offset by higher net Fundraising, mainly due to Together in Joy.

The unfavorable year over year ordinary expense variance partly reflects lower than actual employment charges from the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1H22 due to payroll processing issues. These issues were known by the parish staff and Finance Council at the time and corrected by the Archdiocese during 2H22.

On an underlying basis, parish staff received salary increases during 2023, and one employee newly elected health coverage, but the number of employees remained the same during both years. In addition, the business manager and religious education roles continue to be held open to save costs.

The unfavorable budget variance for ordinary expenses results from unbudgeted health insurance costs and higher than planned maintenance costs, including the replacement of sound equipment for music and HVAC and oven repairs.

Net Other: Net Other results equaled \$11k, \$28k higher than last year and \$32k better than budget. The favorable variances largely result from the timing of capital improvements spending. Roof repairs are currently planned for the second half of the fiscal year.

Looking Ahead: As noted above, the full year budget and our most recent estimate for fiscal 2024 anticipates a modest loss (excluding Investment results). However, the parish has a long track record of full year net surpluses, which we are striving to maintain. If you have capacity, please consider increasing your weekly contribution. Also, please encourage your family and friends to attend Mass in person.

Thanks for your continued support to St. Teresa's. Your commitment through attendance at Mass, the weekly Collection, and our annual fundraising event are critical to the Parish's success.


Friday February 16th, 2024 the Friday morning Communion Service returns at 8:00AM.


