Stewardship:


"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." MARK 8:34

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

All of us have benefited in so many ways from the ministry of priests who have served us in the Archdiocese of Chicago. Before their ordination, these priests prepared over a course of years to serve us. Today, seminarians, when ordained, will be serving your children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Some are in the pre-seminary spiritual year at Bishop Quarter House in the city. Others are completing their college studies at the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Finally, those in the last four-year phase of preparation, are being formed at Mundelein Seminary.

Supporting vocations to the priesthood is a task that belongs to all of us in the Church. I want to invite you to express that support in four ways: pray for vocations and our seminarians in preparation, encourage those seminarians serving in your parish, urge young men to give their lives in service as priests, and make a financial contribution to support our programs of priestly formation. Prayer, encouragement, recruiting and financial support—all these actions express our gratitude to God for the gift of priestly ministry. These actions also build for the future of our Church and for our children and grandchildren. I would note that given that our seminarians need to invest themselves totally in formation, they are not able to work. Thus, we need to cover the costs not only for their education but other expenses such as health insurance and other personal support.

St. Teresa of Avila Parish Financial Update:

As shown in the table on the facing page, the full year net surplus for fiscal 2024 equaled \$240k. Excluding Investment results, the full year net surplus equaled \$22k, continuing the parish's more than decade long string of positive full year results.

This long track record is only possible because of your generous support. This year's Collections, Fundraising (largely Together in Joy), and Other Revenue all exceeded the prior year and budgeted levels.

The increase in Other Revenue primarily reflected contributions from several of you in May following a capital appeal. These contributions entirely offset the costs of roof and HVAC repairs (\$41k, included in Other Expense). Thank you.

Net Ordinary Expense increased due to an employee opting to participate in the Archdiocese health insurance program and planned salary increases. Higher maintenance costs also contributed to the unfavorable Ordinary Expense variances.

As a result of the above, the \$22k full year net surplus excluding Investment results was somewhat lower than last year but \$51k better than budget. Our plan for the year ahead forecasts a small net deficit, but we will work diligently towards a net surplus. In line with this year's results, Collections are only expected to cover about two thirds of expenses.

Your support of Together in Joy is essential to the parish's success.
