What can you expect? Wine makers and wine cellars, four wine-growing sub-regions, wide spectrum of wines, wine exhibitions, educational nature trails and wine cycling routes, vineyards of unique reputation and abundantly supplied wine stores. However, before you set off, try to browse through the following pages. This publication is intended to help you find what really interests you in the open country, on wine routes, and among vineyards and wine-growing towns and villages. We will show you the paths of wine throughout the Bohemian and Moravian history. Admire the beauty of old deeds and documents, historical maps, seals and town symbols. Find out about the importance of soil and climate for grape growing, about varieties grown in Moravia. Find out how to choose what you like. We will reveal you the secret of vine growing, teach you how to taste wine properly; and last but not least, we will take you to the four winegrowing sub-regions of znojemská, mikulovská, velkopavlovická and slovácká. Apart from the

basic information and maps, we provide you with a list of most interesting wine-growing destinations in each sub-region. On your visit to South Moravia, you will learn what a unique home was build to wine by Moravian wine makers in the form of decorated wine cellars. Major tourist attractions are described in information boxes entitled "...to top it all". Finally, we will advise you where to go not to miss any of the local attractions regardless of the length of your stay, be it one day, an extended weekend or a week-long journey. In order to truly enjoy your journey to wine with all the delights it brings, we also provide dates of interesting wine-making events that should not escape your attention. However, it would be a strange journey to wine without wine makers opening you the doors of their wine cellars and offering you wine tasting in their cosy atmosphere. THE WINE-GROWING REGION MORAVIA IN NUMBERS

In numbers, the wine-growing region of Moravia includes 16,536 hectares of vineyards which represent 96% of registered vineyards in the whole Czech Republic. The remaining 4% are found in the wine-growing region of Bohemia. The Moravia wine-growing region is the area with the oldest grape growing and wine making tradition in the country. It lies between the 49th and 48th parallel and includes more than 312 wine-growing municipalities and 1,126 vineyard sites farmed by almost 19,000 wine growers. The average annual temperature is 9.42 °C and average precipitation reaches 510 mm. Vegetation period is shorter than in Western Europe, however, in the majority of years it excels in higher thermal intensity of summer months what enables growing those grape varieties that mature later. Maturation is slower and therefore the grapes contain more aromatic agents. The Moravia wine-growing region is divided into four sub-regions: znojemská, mikulovská, velkopavlovická and slovácká.

THE LAND OF WINE SERIES

The publication that you are holding in your hands is a part of a large project focused on wine tourism. Cooperation of the National Wine Centre, Winegrowers' Fund of the Czech Republic, Southern Moravia Region, Tourist Authority South Moravia and the Environmental Partnership brought the edition, which will reliably guide you through the wine-growing regions of the Czech Republic – the Moravia wine-growing region and the Bohemia wine-growing region. The edition also involves maps of individual wine-growing sub-regions in Moravia with an overview of the most interesting places, events and the biggest wineries. Selected materials are available in English.

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BACK TO THE ROMANS

In search of the beginning of the journey to wine, one has to travel to the Caspian Sea area more than 5,000 years ago. Here the vine started its triumphant campaign throughout the world, and since then it accompanied humans on their wandering through life, regardless of race or religion. Vine spread to Asia Minor, Palestine, China and India; the Egyptians grew grapes along the Nile and its delta; and ancient Babylonians, Greeks and Etruscans also knew wine. In Moravia, the beginnings of viticulture are connected with the Romans. At first, the Romans preferred higher quality wines imported from Greece, however, wine growing gradually became established in the Apennines as well. In the 3rd century AD, during the reign of Marcus Aurelius Probus, Roman soldiers started to plant vineyards close to their camps also in colonies north of the Alps. One of the Roman legions, Legio Decima Gemina Pia Fidelis from Vindobona. then built a base on the Roman Hill under Pálava



where the Nové Mlýny reservoirs are located now. The archaeological investigations in 1926 revealed not only stone foundations of the Roman military camp, but also a 28 cm long vineyard knife – a possible proof of first vineyards in South Moravia. With the departure of the Roman legionaries, the art of viticulture had disappeared for long years and further reports on wine growing date back to the time of Slavic settlement.

VITICULTURE IN THE TIME OF GREAT MORAVIA

A blossoming place, rich in vineyards and inhabitants – this is the reputed description of one of the Great Moravian towns by the Arabian traveller Idrisi



who visited the area of today's Moravia and Slovakia at the turn of the 9th century. These words applied to the Great Moravian settlement in Mikulčice, considered one of the centres of the empire. Not only vineyard knives and other tools were discovered there, but also stones of wild forest vine as well as of its cultivated variant. Although wine consumption was the privilege of the highest circles, excavated foundations of eleven churches at the Mikulčice settlement and its surroundings indicate wine was produced primarily for liturgical purposes.

In the early Middle Ages, the development of Moravian viticulture was influenced by some monastery communities, especially Cistercian monks who came from the wine region of Burgundy. It was especially the Cistercians from Velehrad who started to grow wine in compact vineyard sites, but also the Dominicans from Brno, Benedictines from Rajhrad, Templars from Čejkovice, and Premonstratensians who founded the Louka Monastery near Znojmo at the end of the 12th century.

GOLDEN MIDDLE AGES

The ancient traditions were continued by Emperor Charles IV who had the young vine plants brought from Burgundy (village of Chambertin), imbedded in honey not to get dry during the journey. The plants were accompanied by French wine growers who taught the Czechs to take care of vine and make wine. Vineyard and wine codes, i.e. the sets of viticultural common law and legal norms, were also further elaborated at that time. South Moravia municipalities adopted vineyard law from Austrian Falkenstein. In 1351, John Henry, the Moravian Margrave ordered vineyard disputes to be arbitrated by the local mayor office in Hustopeče instead of in Lower Austria; and he also issued a model vineyard code for Moravia in 1355. This code became a model for a similar document issued by Charles IV in 1358. The emperor suggested planting vineyards at suit-



able places in Bohemia and exempted their founders from taxes for 12 years. The first book on wine growing written in Czech by a Prague teacher Jan Had in 1558 describes varieties grown at that time, for example, Vídeňka (Weisser Heunisch), Běl (Gelber Heunisch), Klenice (Goher), Muškatel (White Muscat), Němčina (Pinot Gris), Bronišť (White Traminer) and Topol (Běloočko).

FROM THE 30 YEARS' WAR TO THE 19TH CENTURY

Before the Thirty Years' War wine growing experienced its golden age; in Moravia there were about 20,000 ha of vineyards, and 15,000 ha in Bohemia. Especially in fecund years, the home wine market felt too small. The growth was, however, interrupted by the Thirty Years' War: a half of the vineyards disappeared and was never restored. Some old and neglected vineyards were newly planted only by



the end of the 17th century. Future development of wine growing in Moravia was guaranteed by the fact that besides the big wine cellars of monasteries and manor houses, wineries were also being established by small rural wine makers. Wine growing started to blossom again only after the Napoleonic wars. In 1820, in Moravia there were 29,801 ha of vineyards,

and 2,576 in Bohemia; the area, however, declining unstoppably in following years. At the end of the 19th century, another threat appeared – pests – mites and fungal diseases such as peronospora (downy mildew) and oidium (powdery mildew). A disaster for European viticulture presented especially phylloxera, an insect attacking vine roots. This pest was first discovered in Europe in 1860 and damaged only in France more than a million hectares of vineyards. In the Bohemian lands, phylloxera appeared at the turn of 20th century in Šatov (Znojmo region), gradually affecting vineyards in the whole of Moravia and, during the next decade, decimating most of them irrecoverably.



THE 20TH CENTURY AND THE PRESENT

The only reliable protection against phylloxera was grafting buds of cultivated European vines onto American rootstocks that not only created a thick web of roots, but their sour juices repelled the insects. At that time, the first regional and state vine nurseries were established in order to produce grafted plants and rootstocks. However, despite all these measures, it was not possible to restore the original extent of



vineyards. Only at the end of the 20th century we can speak about further development of wine growing. A single decade was enough for Moravian and Bohemian wines to catch up with the progress that took several decades in other European countries. Restitution of vineyards and wide privatization led to restoration of traditional family wineries as well as establishment of new companies. Considerable changes were brought by the 1995 Wine Act and

the accession of the Czech Republic to the European Union. Thanks to substantial investment in modern technological equipment and new approaches in vineyard care with emphasis on quality rather than crop quantity, the quality of wine considerably improved. The Moravian and Bohemian wine makers were, moreover, able to react promptly to the European taste. This is reflected in the range of produced quality wines with designation of origin that are able to gain recognition at international markets and win a number of awards at renowned world exhibitions. Although the varietal composition of vineyards remains substantially domestic, local wine producers are able to respond successfully to unstable world trends. A hundred of the best wines awarded in the annual the Wine Salon – national wine competition of the Czech Republic can be found at a permanent wine-tasting exhibition in Valtice.

Also in the Czech Republic, wine became part of the modern lifestyle. Its popularity is further supported by wine tourism and special programmes focused on discovering the individual wine-growing areas. The consumption of wine has increased to about 20 litres of wine per person a year in the Czech Republic recently, causing an increase in the area of local vineyards. With the support of the state and the Wind Fund, the total area of vineyard sites has grown from 12,000 to more than 17,000 ha, planted mostly in Moravia.

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VARIETIES

One of the reasons why South Moravia gives birth to wines of original taste and renowned diversity is the unusually rich varietal composition. In local vineyards, it is possible to find 30 varieties of white wines and 26 red varieties listed in the State Book of Varieties. However, one shall not forget that this wide range of Moravian wines is also influenced by the combination of natural conditions and work of human hands. In the Czech Republic, there are more than 700 registered wineries from big companies to small family firms, and thousands of small private wine makers. Therefore, the resulting style of individual wines is not determined only by terroir, diverse terrain, differing soils and microclimate but also by the wine maker with his invention, experience, and application of traditional methods or new trends. In other words, original Moravian wines are everything but insipid and mediocre.



Veltlínské zelené (Grüner Veltliner)

The aromas and tastes of the green-yellow wine reveal the composition of the vineyard's soil. Sometimes it is the aroma of linden flowers that prevails, or of bitter almonds: sometimes the character is spicy, tones of green pepper.



Ryzlink rýnský (Riesling)

One of the best quality varieties for white wines is grown all over the world. The wines stand out with a wide spectrum of aroma tones resembling linden blossom, peaches, apricots or pineapple according to the soil type and a year.



Sauvignon (Sauvignon Blanc)

Significant, globally widespread variety, originally probably from France. It is popular for its variety of scents – from grassy nettle tones over blackcurrant, gooseberry to the scent of peach or exotic passion-



Svatovavřinecké (Saint Laurent)

The most frequent red variety in the Czech Republic providing velvety bright dark red wines of harmonic taste, smelling of a sour cherry, black currant or prune, with a distinct and full taste.

Müller Thurgau (Müller Thurgau)

A variety frequent in all northern wine-growing areas in Europe and overseas. Wines of a green-yellow colour and muscat-fruity aroma with tones of grapefruits or peaches are best young and fresh.



Ryzlink vlašský (Welschriesling)

This fresh green-yellow wine with a medium-full taste and spicy acid is the most frequent variety in the Mikulov area. Fruit tones of black currant or gooseberry prevail, later the aroma of meadow flowers



Rulandské bílé (Pinot Blanc)

Classical variety of French origin, spread over whole Europe, gives elegant wines with a gentle aroma of flowers. In mature wine you can discover aroma of pears. bread crust and hazelnuts.



Frankovka (Blaufränkisch)

The blue variety grown especially in Central Europe. Wines have light and dark ruby colour with purple sparks, in the matured vintages you can reveal a typical pleasant spiciness and blackberry aroma.



CLASSIFICATION OF WINES MADE IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Wine classification system in the Czech Republic is based especially on ripeness of grapes determined by measuring the sugar content in grape juice at the time of harvest. The "ONM" abbreviation stands for degrees of the standardized must meter; 1 degree corresponding to 1 kilogram of natural sugar in 100 litres of must.

VÍNO (WINE)

The lowest wine category made from grapes grown in any EU country.

ZEMSKÉ VÍNO (REGIONAL WINE)

Wines made from local grapes only, with a minimum of 14 °NM of sugar content that can bear a label stating the area of origin, vintage and grape variety.

JAKOSTNÍ VÍNO... (QUALITY WINE)

Wine made from local grapes, grape mush or must with a minimum of 15 °NM. Wine must be produced in the wine-growing area of the origin of grapes. It can be marked by the statement:

...odrůdové

(Quality varietal wine)

Wine made from the grapes or grape must combine at most 3 vine varieties listed in the State variety list or varieties permitted in the EU.

...známkové

(Quality branded wine)

Wine produced by combining grapes, grape must or wines according to a constant formula.

JAKOSTNÍ VÍNO S PŘÍVLASTKEM... (QUALITY PREDICATE WINE...)

Grapes must meet all requirements for the production of quality wines and come from one winegrowing sub-region. No beet or any other sugar can be added to the must. Wines of higher degrees are intended especially for festive occasions or storage.

...kabinetní víno (...Kabinett wine)

Light, dry wines pleasant to drink made from grapes of 19 °NM of sugar content.

...pozdní sběr (...Late harvest)

Quality dry or semidry wines made from grapes harvested with 21 °NM of sugar content.

...výběr z hroznů

(... Selection from grapes, Auslese)

Full extractive wines with a higher alcohol content and sometimes also a higher residual sugar content made from very ripe grapes with min. 24 °NM of sugar content.

...výběr z bobulí

(...Selection from berries, Beerenauslese)

Full-bodied and extractive, semi-sweet or sweet wine is produced from grapes that matured for a long time in the vineyard and reached the sugar content at least 27 °NM.

...ledové víno (...Ice wine)

Rare, very sweet wine made by pressing frozen grapes harvested at a temperature of minimum –7 °C, the must of which has to have at least 27 °NM of sugar content. Grapes must not defrost during pressing. Thus, part of the water stays in berries in the form of ice crystals and the pressed must is very concentrated.

...slámové víno (...Straw wine)

Aromatic sweet wines made from well-ripened grapes that are dried on straw or reed mats or hung-up in a well-ventilated space for at least 3 months after harvest. This causes water to evaporate from berries and extractive substances to concentrate in the juice. The must has to reach at least 27 °NM of sugar content. You can already press after 2 months, if the sugar content of the must has reached at least 32 °NM.

...výběr z cibéb (...Selection from raisins, Trockenbeerenauslese)

Very extractive, sweet and rare wine made from grapes with minimum 32 °NM of sugar content. Thanks to an extremely long period of ripening, berries in these grapes usually turned into raisins.

WINE OF ORIGINAL CERTIFICATION (V. O. C., VOC)

The acronym VOC appeared in the domestic wine world for the 1st time in 2009. Then the znojemská wine sub-region introduced the 1st appellation system in the Czech Republic, a system of classification by place of origin, usual for example in France and Italy. These marks are carried by wines only from the 3 most typical varieties of Znojemsko region: Sauvignon Blanc, Riesling and Grüner Veltliner, or their cuvée. Winemakers must meet a number of important conditions for classification of their wine into the VOC system; taste characteristics cannot be covered by a barrel of the barrique type, high residual sugar, alcohol higher than 13.9% or long lying in the yeast. Before the wine is marked with a VOC symbol, a ribbon around the neck, it goes through strict quality control - and then you are ensured that you get exactly what you expect, which is really good and well made wine with flavours and aromas typical for the region. The VOC Modré Hory was born in 2011. The designation applies only to wines from the most typical red varieties: Blaufränkisch, St. Laurent and Blauer Portugieser. The grapes for production must come only from certain tracks and these 5 villages of Modré Hory - Bořetice, Kobylí, Němčičky, Velké Pavlovice or Vrbice, red wines must then mature in wooden barrels for a year and a half. The winemakers from the Mikulov environ started to label their wines with the VOC logo after Znojmo and Modré Hory in 2011. They included 6 wine varieties under the wine of original certification: Riesling and Welschriesling, Pinot Blanc, Gris and Noir and Pálava.

The 4th appellation system from 2012, the association VOC Pálava, includes a single variety – Welschriesling, but the grapes for its production come only from the best positions of Pálava in the surroundings of Horní and Dolní Věstonice, Pavlov, Klentnice, Mikulov and Bavory. The slovácká wine-growing sub-region had its 1st appellation from April 2013. The winemakers in Blatnice pod Svatým Antoníkem can produce wines from Riesling and groups of Burgundy varieties – Pinot Blanc, Pinot Gris and Chardonnay under the mark VOC Blatnice.

THE MORAVIAN WINE ROUTE

The red-marked spinal route of the Moravian wine trails connects the ancient town of Znojmo with Uherské Hradiště, the metropolis of Slovácko. The 285 km long arterial road passes through all the Moravian wine-growing sub-regions and crosses 7 out of the 10 local wine route circuits. 70 wine-growing municipalities and 10 protected nature areas are located along the route.

THE BRNO WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The route starts in Moravany and connects the Moravian metropolis with routes of the sub-regions znojemská and velkopavlovická. It is 130 km long and takes the cyclists for example to Dolní Kounice where excellent red wines are grown, to the Jihlava River valley, the Jihlava River Plain National Park or the Nové Mlýny reservoirs.

THE MIKULOV WINE-GROWING ROUTE

In the south the route passes through the Lednice-Valtice Composed Landscape, it is 84 km long and quite flat, reaching the highest point at the Rajstna colonnade from where it follows the Austrian-Czech border as far as Nový Přerov. In the north it leads through places of the oldest human settlement, the wine-growing region of Pálava and the surroundings of the Nové Mlýny reservoirs.

THE PODLUŽÍ WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The route through the flatland of Podluží is 115 km long, with asphalt roads alternating with dirt roads. In several places it is possible to admire rural architecture of cellars. The southern part of the route leads to two well-known Slavic settlements of Pohansko and Valy u Mikulčic; the northern part enters the forested area of Dolňácko near Kyjov.

THE BZENEC WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The shortest, only 26 km long route follows mostly roads of the 3rd class via the hilly area of the Kyjov Highlands, and near Bzenec and Vracov it enters the vale of Dolnomoravský úval.

The circuit is connected to the Kyjov, Uherské Hradiště and Strážnice wine routes, and part of the route is parallel to the spinal Moravian wine route.

A unique 1,175 km long network of marked cycling routes interlacing all South Moravian wine-growing sub-regions. The project, coordinated by the Partnerství Foundation, involves 230 wine-growing villages and towns. Maps containing information about the route length, altitude profile and road surface are available for each individual circuit as well as the spinal Moravian Wine Route. Information boards and signposts with pictograms identify points of interest and services along the way.

THE ZNOJMO WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The longest route connecting nearly 60 wine-growing towns and villages on 165 km of length. This route is not a closed circuit, but it passes through the most interesting places of the Znojmo wine-growing sub-region. The area along the Dyje River offers flat road sections and fine roads between fields and vineyards. Lovers of rougher terrains will enjoy the Podyjí National Park.

THE VELKÉ PAVLOVICE WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The northern part of the 110 km long, richly branched route leads through a border wine-growing area with attractive terrain and lookout points. From Velké Pavlovice, a lively wine tourist area with a number of open wine cellars, the route continues via the vale of Dolnomoravský úval around the Nové Mlýny reservoirs to the Lednice-Valtice Composed Landscape.



THE MUTENICE WINE-GROWING ROUTE

The Mutěnice area forms the border between the northern and southern Moravian wine-growing sub-regions. The mostly flat, 65 km long route through the gently undulating landscape of the Kyjov Highlands can be divided into two smaller circuits following well passable consolidated dirt roads. There are several short climbs leading to nice lookout points.

THE STRÁŽNICE WINE-GROWING ROUTE

A 101 km long, winding road leading mostly along quiet roads, with about 20 km of consolidated or grassy dirt roads. The flat route rises up only in the White Carpathians foothills and in several parts of the Hlucká Higlands. Thanks to its rich branching, the route connects the Strážnice region with Podluží, Uherské Hradiště and Bzenec wine routes.



For successful wondering to wine we recommend to get maps from our Land of Wine series or directly from the Environmental Partnership project.

THE KYJOV WINE-GROWING ROUTE

85 km long route with a rougher hilly profile presents a challenge for capable cyclists. The route follows the gently undulating Kyjov Highlands and the Chřiby foothills, passing by several lookout points. Several of its branches are connected with routes passing through the neighbouring areas of Bzenec, Velké Pavlovice and Mutěnice.

THE UHERSKÉ HRADIŠTĚ WINE-GROWING ROUTE

An ideal route for a day-long family trip is 75 km long and leads through a gently undulating hilly area along quiet roads and cycling trails. The heart of the route is Uherské Hradiště, the metropolis of Slovácko, from where it heads to Kostelany. In other directions, it is possible to continue to Polešovice along the Morava River or to the south to a spa town of Ostrožská Nová Ves and to Dolňácko.

If the weather is nice, work in the vineyard starts with vine pruning which usually ends in February. In the winery, wine is being prepared for bottling – it is treated.

May

Wine growers treat young vines and fight the pests by careful spraying. They hope for a lot of sun so the vineyards will finish blossoming successfully. It is necessary to cultivate the soil and remove the weeds.

June

The vegetation period begins – after lush blossoming shoots appear. Wine growers tuck in the summer shoots and remove the lateral shoots.

SEPTEMBER - VINTAGE

Grape harvest is the most important part of the wine grower's year. Schedule of harvesting both early and late-season varieties is determined according to weather; ideally, with the content of natural sugars and acids in optimal ratio. From vineyards, the grapes are carefully transported to the winery where they are destalked and crushed.



March

Spring in the vineyard starts with ploughing the soil that protected individual vine plants in winter. The soil is cultivated, shoots are tied to the wire support, and other small tasks are carried out.

July

By pruning the shoots and excess grapes wine growers reduce the load on the vine plants and save their energy for the production of healthy fruit. It is necessary to weed and spray the vineyard.

October

While some stum are already fermenting in cellars, late-season varieties are just harvested. Wine growers watch over the grapes intended for ice wine production.

December

In the winery, wine makers treat and rack wine; some young wines are already prepared for the Christmas table. The first young wines are blessed on November 11, St. Martin's day.

April

In addition to routine work in the vineyard, wine makers evaluate wines, discuss them and take part in local and regional wine exhibitions. Most of the wine has already been treated and is prepared for bottling.

August

The wineries prepare for the upcoming harvest. Inspection in the vineyard is full of expectations. In ideal weather conditions the first harvest can start at the end of August.

November

In vineyards, soil is ploughed to the plants. In the winery, wine makers treat and rack wine.



On St. Martin's day (11. 11.) young wines are drunk under the name "Svatomartinské" for the first time. Events take place throughout the CR to celebrate them. More on www.svatomartinskevino.cz.

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OPEN WINE CELLARS FESTIVAL

The wine festival and the top of wine tourism – these are the most commonly used adjectives of the Open Wine Cellars Festival (FOS). The festival goes through Moravia for the 6th year and every April and November maps what new and good things happened in the wine cellars. A total of 14 festivals presented to visitors the winemakers of the southern Znojemsko, Mikulovsko, environs of Pavlov, Modré Hory, Podluží, Hustopečsko and Rakvice. Their cellars opened within the festival more than 400 small wine makers and big wineries, and that in more than 60 wine villages.



We asked the director of festival, Ing. Juraj Flamik from the Environmental Partnership, for a brief assessment of the future plans: "We are very pleased that the festival has a good reputation among visitors and among winemakers. To first ones it offers a lifetime programme of seasonal visits of winemakers across the whole of Moravia. Visitors appreciate the very peaceful atmosphere of the event, good organization, and mainly nice meetings with winemakers. Winemakers are very satisfied with the cultivation, interest and purchasing power of the festival participants after each festival. Each of them buys wine on average for 1,100 CZK and another two thousand spend in the region on food and accommodation. Winemakers also tell us that many clients have been returning to them for years back. It fulfils our promise that everyone will find their winemaker at the festival. We want to expand the festival places about the winemakers around Blatnička and to persuade the common festival wine villages of the VITIS region, that means Velké Bílovice, Čejkovice and Mutěnice. We want to strengthen the programme particularly with quality local food and culture directly in the cellars. The Open Wine Cellars Festival has had, since 2012, a brother "Víno z blízka" (Festival of Wines from Neighbourhood) – Moravian Wine and Food Festival in Brno. We want to introduce winemakers from 10 large wine villages in 2014. At Christmas

time Festival of Wines From Neighbourhood goes also to restaurants, where will offer uniting it with meals especially from Moravian ingredients."

Spring FOS in 2014 takes place on 26.–27. of April in the Pavlov surroundings. It will invite a quality comparison of wines of 2013 from the winemakers from the Pavlov association, small winemakers from Strachotín, Dolní and Horní Věstonice and also large modern wineries in Popice.

10 garden tasting events within the series of Festival of Wines From Neighbourhood in Brno's Open garden under Špilberk castle in the summer time from May to September. A yearlong season of festivals will end the Festival of Wines From Neighbourhood at pre-Christmas in Brno's restaurants and wine bars.

The festival guests will go again to the cellars of Znojemsko, from Dobšice over Hnanice and Nový Šaldorf-Sedlešovice to Šatov and Chvalovice a week after St. Martin's day, 15.–16. November. Fine wines will be supplemented with quality food under the baton of the best chefs in local restaurants.

Festivals organized by the Environmental Partnership bring new impulses to wine tourism, building on cooperation, and ensure the promotion of Moravian wine as a whole. Throughout their existence they keep the motto "winemakers and their wines – intimately and closely". You can ensure yourself of this in 2014 also.



The festival organizer is the Environmental Partnership, the main partner is the National Wine Centre and the supporter is the Wine Fund. Events in Brno are under the auspices of the Mayor of the city and in cooperation with the city district of Brno centre.

The winner of the year 2013 and the TOP wine destination award winner is the Chateau Lednice Winery – Valtice Underground.

The visitors and winery and wine cellar fans will decide on the winner of next year in autumn 2014.

SOIL

Wine growers know well that chemical composition of the soil and minerals contained in the soil can influence the taste of wine. Especially physical properties of soil, such as the ability to retain water or heat, influence the quality and style of wine. Moravian soils developed on sea and fluvial sediments and loesses.

Together with a diverse terrain, the soils give birth to a wide variety of original wines. Limy soils under Pálava, top-quality vineyards on gravel sub-soils in the Znojmo region, vine grown on clay and humic clayey soils in the area of Velké Pavlovice, sand soils in the Morava river valley, and flysch, ie. layers of clay and sands, in the northern parts of Slovácko provide Moravian wines with a unique character.



CLIMATE

An aphorism about wine says that variety is the mother of wine, location is the father and vintage is its fate. Diversity of vintages creates excellent conditions for the diversity of our wines. Like many other traditional European wine-growing locali-



ties, Moravia lies on the northern border of winegrowing areas. The mild central European climate prevails for most of the year. The crop can be occasionally jeopardized by spring frosts, summer hailstorms or excessive precipitation during flowering; but it is the course of ripening when sunny autumn days alternate with substantial temperature drops at night that gives birth to unique aromatic wines that do not lose fine acid and bouquet substances as a result of an optimal course of ripening and a correctly chosen term of harvest.

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Our wines have a sound

ONDŘEJ BRZOBOHATÝ

The Wine Fund launched an advertising campaign to promote Moravian and Bohemian wines with the theme "Our wines have a sound" in September 2013. The main face of our wines has logically become a personality that is closely linked



with the quality "sound", has a natural charm and charisma and is easily recognizable among the strong personalities of Czech social life, which, as well as our wines, are unmistakable. Moravian and Bohemian wines undoubtedly deserve a personality that is not just a pretty face on a poster, but a personality that has a true and deep relationship with our wines. These two qualities are combined and perfectly

harmonized together in the figure of the famous Czech actor, composer and musician Ondřej Brzobohatý.

Ondřej Brzobohatý was born on the 2nd of February 1983 in Prague to actors Radoslav Brzobohatý and Hana Gregorová. He has been playing the violin since childhood, but his musical education was completed at the Jaroslav Ježek Conservatory, where he studied composition, piano and conducting.

He is currently performing as an actor in the Radek Brzobohatý theatre, in musicals of the Musical Theatre Karlín and in the television series Gympl s (r)učením omezeným. He devotes himself to composing music for various purposes, concerts or producing work. His repertoire is copyrighted compositions and songs as well as popular cover versions of famous hits. As Moravian and Bohemian wines are social drinks, sociability is close to Ondřej. And so his fans often meet him at concerts of his friends. Ondřej's audience also appreciated his talent with the TÝTÝ Award for Most Popular Actor in 2012 this year. He comes to mind, particularly of the younger generation, as presenter of the 1st year of the TV show Česko hledá SuperStar.

It is generally known about you that you incline towards good wine. Can you tell us about your relationship to Moravian and Bohemian wines and wineries?

In my relationship to wine is also some form of nostalgia, because we spent, with my father,

many memorable moments in cellars of his good friends in South Moravia. With the backdrop of laid bottles, cobwebs and a cold cellar were told beautiful stories that I remember to this day. It was always a powerful experience for me, which attracted me to taste further.

And this leads you to the fact that you became the face of Moravian and Bohemian wines?

Yes, the origin of my relationship to wine is definitely from my father, because he was a great lover and promoter of our wines and transferred it to me also. I am glad that I was approached to become the face of the brand "Wines from Moravia, Wines from Bohemia". I find it a form of patriotism and it is good when I can tell people that our wines are worth it.

What sound do Moravian and Bohemian wines have currently in society in your opinion?

Knowledgeable people know. They know that Moravian and Bohemian wines are good. Those who give mostly to impress, often just out of principle, choose mainly foreign wines. But those who are looking for the best that wine can possibly offer will certainly agree that you can find very good and often unique wine. It is also unfortunate that we kind of forgot to be patriots and are often entertained by anything foreign more than by that we create ourselves in our fertile land and with our own hands. And so I became the ambassador of Moravian and Bohemian wines. I hope that maybe, thanks to my name, people will start asking. And that's enough, because then our wines will start talking for themselves.

It is obvious that you have a really close relationship to wine. Will you tell us which wine you prefer?

I like Moravian drier white wines, I enjoy our pink wine, but I expect that in time I will start drinking red wine mainly, because as my father said, one must come to red wine. Because it is, as he said himself, the milk of elders. And I'm looking forward to it.

SERVICE CERTIFICATION IN WINE TOURISM

Certification generally is a mark of reaching certain quality level, measurable with the help of defined criteria. In tourism certification is a clue for everybody who expects and seeks good quality of services. An enamel tablet with the logo "Vína z Čech or Vína z Moravy – Certifikace vinařské turistiky" (Wines from Bohemia or Wines from Moravia – Wine Tourism Certification) now marks 131 facilities in wine tourism and represents the top class of services. The facilities will get advantages in presentation on a national level. It is an opportunity to set the quality standard even higher and show the best that is in our wine and skills of our wine-makers.

Objective of certification

The purpose of certification is to increase the quality of services in wine tourism and reach a level comparable with the offer of wine tourism in other wine-growing regions in Europe.

The certification objective is to mark the facilities that, thanks to the quality of products and services as well as the historic or architectural value of the buildings, represent the best of wine tourism in the wine-growing regions Moravia and Bohemia.

Certification procedure

Certification is processed by the selection of a facility according to defined criteria. The facilities are divided into five categories: winery, wine cellar, wine store, restaurant with wine and accommodation with wine theme. Each category has individual criteria. For the facilities that involve more types of operation, it is possible to do the advantageous common certification. The owner or keeper of the facility sends a written application for certification to the National Wine Centre. In 2008 pilot certifications were carried out free of charge. Starting from 2009 the price of certification is published in price lists. The certification process is completed by signing the contract between the facility and the National Wine Centre. The facility pays a yearly fee for usage of the certificate label.

Certification criteria require:

- enterprise in the given field according to legislation valid
- hygiene and cleanliness requirements
- relation to the traditional wine culture, historic value or uniqueness of the facility
- required extent and quality of services and a proportion of wine assortment made from grapes grown in CR

The criteria also require classification of the wines offered and presentation of wines from the given wine-growing sub-region. The fulfilment of certifica-

tion criteria is assessed by a person with a written authorization from the National Wine Centre. The board of evaluators then definitively gives a final verdict – the certification granting, or suggestions for repair of imperfections.

Categories for service certification in wine tourism in the winegrowing regions in CR

I. Wineries

Definition of a winery: A wine producer registered at Wine Fund and ÚKZÚZ, which sells at least 3 wines with the approval of SZPI (CAFIA) classification or complying with conditions of the VOC appellation system. It offers retail of own wine directly in a cellar, company shop or any other suitable premises. Wines offered have to be made from grapes grown in CR.



II. Wine cellars

Definition of a wine cellar: An operator offers a sitting area in a wine cellar or above it and sells either wines produced by himself or another producer made from grapes grown in CR. The facility has to have a restroom. An offer involves homemade or supplied cold or hot cuisine. A wine cellar offers supervised wine-tasting and other programmes.

A building part of the wine cellar including facade, surfaces, doors and windows is not degraded by unsuitable elements and materials. A wine cellar is for example a historic building, sensitive reconstruction or quality modern architecture.

III. Wine stores

Definition of a wine shop: A wine shop is a specialised shop that offers especially bottled wine from prevailing producers from CR. It also offers supervised wine-tasting for the public (regularly or by order), or other programmes and provides information to visitors about wine, wine growing and wine tourism. A wine shop has separate and self-contained operational premises; it is not a passageway or any other way improperly connected with functionally different premises.

IV. Restaurant with wine

Definition of a restaurant with wine (including wine bars): A restaurant offers an assortment of quality meals and a sufficiently wide choice of wines produced by local wine makers from grapes grown in CR. An operator guarantees qualified staff and suitable equipment for cultivated wine consumption.

Kitchen is during the serving of hot meals in full operation without limits, it enables serving meals from a menu and to order within usual time (max. 40 min.).

V. Accommodation with wine theme

Definition of accommodation with wine topics:

Rural and town accommodation directly connected with a wine cellar, winery, restaurant with wine and so on. An operator provides also information about services of wine makers and wine tourism in the region.

Rooms for accommodation are at maximum four bedded. Hygienic background (min. shower, WC and washbasin) can be shared max. by 2 rooms. Capacity of an individual accommodation facility is max. 50 beds.

THE CERTIFIED FACILITIES RECEIVES ADVANTAGES AS FOLLOWS:

- The above standard accentuation of the certified facility on the web www.vinazmoravy.cz, www.vinazcech.cz, www.wineofczechrepublic.cz in the address book of wineries, wine cellars and wine stores, in the section "Wine and tourism" and on the interactive map.
- The main promotion tool is the tourist guide "The best from wine tourism in South Moravia" and "The best from wine tourism in Bohemia", which contains an address book of wineries, wine cellars and wine stores with marked certified facilities and a text part about certification.
- The certified facilities are considered to be the elite subjects of wine tourism. The National Wine Centre and the Environmental Partnership prefer these facilities when organising excursions with journalists and in the offer of tourist destinations to the end customers.
- Promotion of certified facilities is carried out with the help of cooperating media, especially the PR Agency of the Wine Fund CR.
- The facilities are marked with the enamel tablets with the logo "Vína z Moravy" / "Wines from Moravia" or "Vína z Čech" / "Wines from Bohemia" and the Czech and English heading "Certifikace vinařské turistiky" / "Wine Tourism Certification" (the tablet has to be visibly displayed on the certified facility).
- Certified wineries and wine cellars can participate in a media-supported competition TOP vinařský cíl (TOP wine destination), in which the winner is determined by the general public.




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wine-growing sub-region **ZNOJEMSKÁ**

1 LOUKA MONASTERY IN ZNOJMO - the monastery, founded in 1190, was for centuries a centre of artistic, economic and spiritual life of Znojmo. You can find here, instead of the Premonstratensian convent, abolished during the Josephine reforms, the Visitors Centre of Znovín today. You will visit the gallery of art work, wine and the coopers museum and courtyard with its preserved Gothic cloister during the tour. The tour of the extensive wine cellar and Romanesque-Gothic crypt below the church, which was occasionally used as house cell for punished monks, is a great experience. Louka monastery is also the starting point of the wine tourist programme of Znovín and one of the Znojmo tourist train stops.

Q GENE POOL OF CR – a collection of wine varieties of the Czech Republic vine gene pool, is planted in Nad sklepy vineyard near the village Vrbovec. It includes 290 varieties – current cultivated varieties and also older and regional varieties, which are not included in the State varietal book. The company Ampelos, the oldest breeding vine station in Central Europe,

founded in 1895, takes care of the collection. You can find the Headquarters of the company in vrbovecké cellar colony, an area of approximately 260 winery buildings, west of the village below the Nad sklepy vineyard.

3 KRAVÍ HORA – The long hill with thermophile and rare heathland vegetation, a historic vineyard, one of the best in the Czech Republic, lies south of Znojmo. The western part passes into the valley of Dyje and to the National Park Podyjí, the eastern part is planted with vines. A nice view of Znojmo opens from the northern slopes.

◆ SOBES – one of Europe's best vineyards lies on the sunny slopes of a rock in the meander of the river Dyje in the heart of the Podyjí National Park. Šobeské wine owes its excellent quality especially to the ideal microclimate. The vineyard is open all year, the tasting stand of the company Znovín Znojmo is open from end of April to late September. | www.znovin.cz

5 NOVÝ ŠALDORF AND SEDLEŠOVICE –

two well-known wine villages south of Znojmo formed shortly after the founding of Louka monastery in 1190 at the fords across the river Dyje. The local residents dug more than 200 wine cellars during six centuries. The most famous area of the Modré Cellars is located on both sides of the road facing south, a historic press from 18th century stands in the centre. The cellars are named after the special sandstone, spread through with layers of blue-grey clay colour. Cellar street in Nový Šaldorf-Sedlešovice, with 200 cellars, is one of the largest and most picturesque in Znojmo. Local winemakers are associates of the Winemakers Guild and their wine can be tasted and bought directly in the cellars of the individual

winemakers. | www.modre-sklepy.cz


6 PAINTED WINE CELLAR – wine cellar decorated with fantastic sculptural paintings excavated in the sandstone slope above Šatov down the road to Havraníky. Although the Painted wine cellar is a wine cellar, wine was never produced or even stored here. It should have served as a private wine room and a place to relax. Both sides of the main halls and walls of the 5 adjacent lounges are decorated with colourful sculptural paintings of mermaids, dwarfs, alpine landscapes and other motifs, created by Maxmillian Appeltauer, a šatovský native. He worked in the Painted wine cellar Sunday after Sunday for 36 years and was even injured in the Second World War, when he lost an arm, which did not stop him. He was holding a container of paint in the left armpit, a brush in the right hand and by the candles attached to his hat, which lit the area in front of him. The cellar is one of the stops of Wine Tourism Programme of Znovín Znojmo. | www.znovin.cz

DOLNÍ KOUNICE – the largest wine locality in the vicinity of Brno is famous for producing red wines, especially Blaufränkisch. You can see the romantic ruins of Gothic convent Rosa coeli, the chapel of St. Antonín and a small Jewish quarter, with cemetery and synagogue, also cellars with underground presses in the Tovární street or in the locations Na Závodí and Za Měšťankou. | www.dolnikounice.cz

is MORAVSKÝ KRUMLOV – town in the deep river meander Rokytná is first mentioned at the beginning of the 13th century. Worth seeing is the surviving sections of wall with bastions, originally a Renaissance prince's house, now the seat of the city museum and gallery, the castle, where for more than 60 years were exhibited monumental canvases of Slovanská epopej by Alfons Mucha, a Jewish cemetery and Augustine monastery with the church of St. Bartoloměj and the chapel of Panna Marie, built in the shape of 7-corned star. The Baroque pilgrimage church of St. Florián with 4 corner towers stands on a high rocky promontory east of Moravský Krumlov. www.mkrumlov.cz

 mains of medieval fortifications and the Jewish cemetery. Remains of buildings of českobratrský church with tower and uncovered original foundations of the church recalls the time when Ivančice was an important centre of the Jednoty bratrské. The Ivančický Hymnal, one of the most beautiful European Renaissance books, was created by a local printer in 1562. Also popular is the permanent exhibition of two local natives, Art Nouveau painter Alfons Mucha and actor Vladimír Menšík. You can taste the wines from Ivančice and neighbourhood every year in late May, when the city holds its Asparagus Festival.

mirroslavští winemakers helped to establish the vineyards in the Znojmo area. The first mention of Miroslav from 1222 is also about the wine. The Czech king Přemysl Otakar I and his wife Konstancie confirmed by written document the dedication of the wine from miroslavské vineyards to the Rajhrad Benedictines. Worth seeing is the castle, 2 churches and the Jewish cemetery from the 16th century. The most famous vineyard trail is Weinperky, lying at the foot of Markův Hill. You can taste the wine from local vineyards at Miroslavský wine tasting in May or at the apricot harvest in July, celebrations recalling the tradition of growing apricots. | www.mesto-miroslav.cz

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11 JAROSLAVICE – a small town surrounded by vineyards lies in a valley stream of Daníž not far from the border with Austria. The Renaissance chateau, Classical church St. Jiljí and several areas of wine cellars deserve attention. The wine cellars, with presses on the western edge of Jaroslavice, are the oldest, slightly younger are cellars in a place called V psím příkopě or U ledárny and two streets at Bažantice. Wines of jaroslavický winemakers can be tasted in August, when the Day of Open Cellars is. A wine rarity is the cellar with the wine archive of company Znovín Znojmo. The mysterious labyrinth of mutually interlocked manually-dug tunnels hides officially the oldest collection of vintage wines in the Czech Republic. Wines from 1945 up to the present are stored according to year in the wine cellar. The real treasure is the last few bottles of Blauer Portugieser 1945.

(D LAMPELBERG CASTLE – the picturesque castle surrounded by vineyards is a popular destination for cycling and hiking. It was built by Jaroslavice castle lord Count Vilém Hompesch as an observation gazebo in 1860. Lampelberg is also the only reminder



of the defunct settlement Ječmeniště. The Lahofer tasting stand is open here from April to September. Lampelberg is connected by an almost 18 km long nature trail with vineyard Šobes from 2012.

(B) LECHOVICE – Baroque pilgrimage church, Navštívení Panny Marie, dominates the village. Lechovice wine Cellars, which have a company store,

wine store, wine cellar and a restaurant, are based in the village. It is possible to visit wine cellars combined with wine tasting. A rarity is the annual auction of champagnes stored for ripening in a stable temperature at the bottom of Vranov dam to a depth of 40 metres.

14 ZNOJMO – one of the oldest Moravian towns with a famous wine-growing tradition represents the symbolic beginning of Moravian wine trails. The oldest monument, the Romanesque rotunda of Panny Marie and St. Kateriny from the mid-11th century, can be found in the former přemyslovci castle, where is one of the exhibits from Jihomoravské museum in Znojmo. The city's skyline is completed by 2 towers - the tower of St. Mikuláš and the 80m high Radniční tower, which was built 1447-1448 by Mikuláš from Sedlešovice. You can see the historic city centre and its surroundings from the gallery. The glorious past of Znojmo wine is recalled by the extensive maze of tunnels and cellars, built from the 13th to 17th century, extending under most houses, streets and squares of the historic centre. From approximately 30km of tunnels, around a 1000m long route is open to the public. You can find many wine bars and shops in Znojmo. The Louka monastery with the Znovín Znojmo Visitor Centre should not escape your attention. New are the restored Rajká vineyards on steep slopes under the Old town and the St. Mikuláš Cathedral. Winery Lahofer plants Sauvignon Blanc, Grüner Veltliner and Riesling here, 3 varieties included in VOC Znojmo. A small educational vineyard with examples of most commonly grown varieties will be here in the future.

The Hosterabice – the ancient wine village is first mentioned in 1200, when the property belonged to the Loucký Premonstratensian. An order of the Knights of Germany lived here from 1237–1486. They are recalled by the Gothic stone building with the preceptories' early Gothic chapel and crypt, part of the rebuilt Baroque parish office. The church of St. Kunhuta with funerary chapel and crypt from the 13th century is a curiosity. Volné pole, the largest vineyard of Znojmo, with a total area of 95.4 ha is located at Hostěradice.| www.hosteradice.cz



Marie Bolestné and a remarkable natural monument – the largest protected heath in southern Moravia – are above the village. A tasting stand of Znovín Znojmo is annually open in Stará vineyard from end of April to late September. The area of wine cellars can be found on the southern edge of the village. They are extremely deep and long, up to several 100 metres, but do not believe the legends that they go to Vienna. Only the extremely fine sand, dredged during the excavation, used tby high-quality house plasters, travelled to Vienna.

THE PODYJÍ NATIONAL PARK – river Thaya is the most beautiful between Podhradí and Znojmo, where the river created a 38 km long, deep valley with a number of meanders. A few dozen kilometres of marked hiking trails for walkers and cyclists are in the park area. You can visit the Information Centre in Čížov, information panels and wooden shelters in case of bad weather are placed at the park's most interesting places. THE ZNOJMO WINE-GROWING ROUTE – "THROUGH THE VINEYARDS OF THE REGION"

- 30 km long cycle path takes you through the vineyards south of Znojmo, Podyjí National Park and a series of wine villages. The starting point of the journey is the Moravian cellar in Šatov where you can park conveniently.

SÁDEK – vineyards, hotel with restaurant, wine cellars, wine store, an amphitheatre and park are part of the Wine and Cultural Centre at Kojetice, which manages the westernmost Moravian vineyards. The educational wine trail, accessible only with a guide, is open from June to September. It will guide you

through the vineyards, where are planted dozens of grape varieties. You will also see various types of growing, support structures and cuts, a curiosity is the plant garden of traditional Chinese medicine.

SATOV – several cellar streets survived in the town, one of them is a 300-year-old Moravian cellar, operated by Znovín Znojmo. The Painted wine cellar is a European rarity, from early April to late October the Czechoslovakian fortress area with infantry log cabin MJ – S 3 Zahrada is also accessible.

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wine experiences





I actually like all good wine

MILAN FRIDRICH

Czech floorball player, Milan Fridrich, plays in the highest Czech male floorball competition for the team Tatran Střešovice. He is the forward and the



team coach. He comes from Znojmo. He played hockey from the age of 7 years for the hockey club HC Znojemští Orli. He started his floorball career in 1999. He transferred to the team FbŠ Bohemians from the Znojmo club in 2003, from where he was chosen by the most successful floorball club, FO Tatran Střešovice, in 2005. He has won 6 titles of Master of the Czech Extra league with this team. He won

the award for the best Czech floorball player of the past season in 2008 and 2010. He is a permanent member of the Czech floorball team. World achievements includes reaching 4th place at the World Championships in Prague in 2008 and a bronze medal for the Czech team at the World Championships 2010 in Helsinki, where he was captain of the national team.

Can you briefly describe to us your journey to floorball? Why did you choose this sport? In the time when you started with it, it was relatively little known in the Czech Republic.

A former hockey teammate, with whom I studied in České Budějovice, told me on a journey in a bus that he was going to Znojmo grammar school to play floorball and whether I did not want to go with him. I had time, so I went with him. Guys lent me the clothes and a floorball stick and I tried training. Then they asked me if I would play with them. And because I had just finished playing hockey and this sport was very similar, I went for it.

What do you like about floorball and what do you do not like about it?

At the start apart from just the game I liked the friendly atmosphere in the team. We were doing other sports and activities together, and to this day, when we have time, we like to meet. What bothers me a bit or I am rather sorry about is, that the generation of players and friends from then is not actively playing today and teammates are significantly younger, and thanks to that have other interests.

What do you consider as your greatest sporting achievement? What would you like to achieve in this sport?

I take as the biggest success the bronze medal in the World Championships 2010 in Helsinki. National team success is always appreciated more. On the club scene, in addition to Czech titles that are becoming more difficult to get, it is the silver medal at the Champions Cup in Mladá Boleslav. I would like to obtain at least one more Czech title or at least successfully start the new young generation in Tatran, and that this team would be still at the very top in the Czech Republic.

How do you relax and where do you get your strength?

For resting there is not much time left. I am trying to devote my free time as much as possible to my family and two small daughters, where I also draw my energy from.

You come from Znojmo, do you have a chance to return there, and how often is it successful?

With the gradual expansion of the family it is increasingly more difficult to find free time and come to Znojmo. We can at least do it every month over the summer. We are not able to do it so much in the season unfortunately and it is more like once every quarter of a year.

How would you describe your relationship to wine? What wine do you like and at which occasions do you indulge?

I was never a big wine aficionado, but wine has got me more and more in recent years. I prefer to open a bottle of fine wine with my wife in the evening, when we put our daughters to sleep, it is also our greatest relaxation.

Which wine varieties are you closest to as a native of Znojmo?

I have to admit that I like sweeter wine. Along with my wife we really enjoy wines from the wineries Vinice Hnanice, Vinařství Kořínek or from Lechovice. Then mainly wines from winemakers associated in the VOC Znojmo, that is, of course, Riesling, Sauvignon and Grüner Veltliner. I must not forget the aromatic varieties such as Traminer, Pálava or Kerner. To sum it up, I have to say, that I really like all good wines.

WINERY AND HOTEL LAHOFER

In the Winery LAHOFER they know very well that care of wine starts in the vineyard because what the winemaker does not do in the vineyard he cannot correct in the cellar. The winery is particular about



producing wine exclusively from their vineyards, about which they care themselves – they have almost 500 ha where they cultivate a wide range of varieties and they are the largest grape producers in wine-growing sub-region znojemská.

You will meet a wide range of mainly white and rosé, mainly predicate wines in elegant bottles of the gun type Weinschlegel under the brand Lahofer. You can taste it in the tasting room of the castle Lampelberg in the middle of the vineyards near Vrbovec, in the Rajská vineyard under the St. Mikuláš cathedral near the historical Znojmo centre, in Hotel Lahofer

in Veselá Street in Znojmo, or during wine events in Znojmo and surrounding villages. The winery also offers a programme called Keep your head – you can buy patronage of specific vine heads by the castle Lampelberg and take care of them. A new possibility is to use the Lahofer cellar in Chvalovice for family or company events.

The most recent achievements of the Winery LA-HOFER is victory in the 8th annual of one of the most prestigious domestic wine exhibitions – King of wines of the Czech Republic 2013. The dry wine (Riesling, late harvest 2011) won the title champion for 1st time.

WINERY ŠPALEK

Josef Špalek founded the winemaking tradition of the Špalek family in Nový Šaldorf. He moved with his family from Valašsko to the displaced part of south Znojemsko in 1945. His son František took over the wine baton and then in 1992 together with two sons



founded a private family winery. They farm on 8.5 ha of vineyards on the eastern slopes of the famous vine track Kraví hora and produce a small amount of high quality white and red wines.

The Winery Špalek belongs among the centrepieces of the domestic wine scene thanks to a variety of specialties in the last twenty years. They make, for example, Šaler liqueur wine, Sur Lie wine, wine produced by the technology of the 19th century called Edelspitz nad prestige cuvée Gryllus. The winery is also a founding member of several civic associations:

the Nový Šaldorf-Sedlešovice Guild of winemakers, the Modré sklepy (Blue cellars) association or VOC Znojmo winemakers association. They have been in the transition period to a BIO-winery since September 2012.

You can see the family Špalek cellar, in the complex of Modré sklepy in the cellars part of Nový Šaldorf, during the various wine events of local winemakers. These include, for example, the January event Open cellars or digging sand for Vienna, May wandering around Modré sklepy or Summer in Modré sklepy, when each week at least one cellar is open to the public from May to November.

Penzion Černý sklep

A guesthouse (** Superior) in the wine-growing village of Dobšice near Znojmo (opened 1. 7. 2010) is found in the historic street with wine cellars. The guesthouse includes a wine cellar – hand dug original sandstone corridor, that serves for storage of wines offered in a stylishly equipped wine bar of the guesthouse – wines made only by the local wineries (Hort, Lahofer, Waldberg etc.). The wine bar also offers supervised wine-tasting. By arrangement it is possible to visit cellars of the local small wine makers. All rooms (double, triple and more bedded) have a bathroom, TV with satellite and minibar. The questhouse is involved in the "Cyclists welcome" project - it is equipped with lockable places for bikes, place for bike washing and tools for repairs. In the vicinity you can find marked cycling routes with wine themes or routes to the Podyii/Thayatal National Park. The questhouse also offers a roofed terrace with a fireplace and barbecue, children's



playground with swings in a paled large garden.



Vinařství LAHOFER, a.s.

A winery was established in November 2003. It owns vineyards on the sites of Babičák, U Hájku and Vinohrady ke Křídlůvkám. A total of 69 ha of vineyards. It focuses on top predi-

cate wine production. On the beginning of 2007 the winery changed name to the Vinařství LAHOFER, a.s. in the connection with building a new wine-growing farmhouse in Dobšice, where the winery move to from premises fragmented over Znojmo.

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



The oases of heavenly peace, places tempting to stop and think – these are the ancient monasteries, former social and economic centres of every region. In some of them they still

welcome the visitors with open arms. You will be heartily welcomed also in the Premonstraterian monastery in Louka near Znojmo, where you can see the Visitors' Centre, Art Gallery, Coopery and Wine-growing Museum and wine stores.

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Pálava, the place with unrepeatable atmosphere stands out sharply from the slightly undulating countryside of the swamp forests by the lower Dyje River. The hillsides of limestone rocks are covered by the thick drifts of loess and calcareous clay, the southern part is characterised by thick layers of sand. Deep loess soil offers the vine a source of a wider spectrum of aliments for the aroma agents and more distinct tones of extract. Therefore, Pálava gives wines with completely different character than other sub-regions and it is an ideal place within the North Panonia lowland. Already the Roman soldiers appreciated that fact and established the first Moravian vineyards. The wine-growing sub-region mikulovská is famous for Ryzlink vlašský (Welchsriesling), which despite of its name has nothing in common genetically or historically with Ryzlink rýnský (Riesling). The VOC Pálava, which is presented precisely and only by Rhine Riesling, was established in 2012.

In Pálava it gives fresh wines with a higher content of pleasant acids and the unmistakable mineral content. Müller Thurgau and Chardonnay do well there too. The soil with more clay in the Dunajovice Hills is suitable for the typical Mikulov variety - Veltlínské zelené (Grüner Veltliner). The Valtice region is also ideal for Neuburské (Neuburger) and Sylvánské zelené (Sylvaner Green). The environs of Pouzdřany give excellent Ryzlink rýnský (Riesling), Tramín (Traminer) and Pálava. Red wines are represented by Svatovavřinecké (St. Laurent), Zweigelt and Frankovka (Blaufränkisch); newly planted French varieties Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot have a promising future there. You can follow the brand VOC Mikulov from 2011 when choosing a Mikulov wine. It marks the wines made from six typical varieties produced under established rules.

There are many places you must visit. Significant towns connected with wine are Valtice with the famous Wine Salon of the Czech Republic and the Mikulov chateau with an interesting wine-growing exhibition with a giant wine barrel. The real pearl is the Lednice-Valtice Composed Landscape, enrolled in the UNESCO World Heritage List as the largest artistically composed landscape in the world.

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wine-growing sub-region MIKULOVSKÁ

1 WINE SALON OF THE CZECH REPUBLIC IN VALTICE - the wine salon is located in the cellar of the monumental Baroque castle in Valtice. It is a permanent tasting exhibition of best Moravian and Bohemian wines. The collection is selected annually in the contest The Wine Salon - national wine competition of the Czech Republic, the highest and the most all-encompassing national wine competition. Wines registered in the Salon must be made exclusively from local grapes and must pass the system of nomination exhibitions. 100 wines get the right for their bottles to be signed with the mark Wine Salon of the Czech Republic every year. The wines are then presented to the public in Valtice, each of the exhibited samples has complete information about the wine and its producer. You can taste all of the opened samples or you can choose a wine tasting accompanied by a sommelier in the tasting programmes.

2 VALTICE UNDERGROUND – labyrinth of 11 wine cellars: extensive historical cellars reveal the extent of Valtice vineyards and importance of the local wineries. Valtice Underground was adapted into wine cellars as well – from the rem-

nants of a Franciscan monastery from the 13th century. The CHATEAU LEDNICE WINERY cellar labyrinth is over 800 m in total length and offers wine tasting, guided wine tastings, company and private events for up to 300 people. You can taste attributive wine originating from the Lednice-Valtice area. Valtice Underground is open to the public year-round, in high season daily.

3 EXHIBITION OF HISTORIC WINE PRESSES **VALTICE** – when you arrive in Valtice, you will see the impressive baroque Church Nanebevzetí Panny Marie. You will find a museum of viticulture, horticulture and the environment in close proximity to the church on the main square. It is a branch of the National Museum of Agriculture in Prague, which celebrated its 120th anniversary in 2011. Exhibitions document the development of market gardening and fruit growing, viticulture and viniculture in the Czech lands. You can see mainly herbal and historical examples of types of seeds, of vegetables and flowers, logs of wood, moss and cones. An attractive part is devoted to the environment where the magical landscape of the Lednice-Valtice is the focus. The museum also charts the evolution of flower growing with a demonstration of flower bonding, and paraffin models of fruit and vegetables.

For those that love wine and can admire the technical beauty of monuments, an insight into a winery is prepared. Wine presses from the 18th and 19th century belong among the most valuable objects, mostly fully functional. The museum got them from different Břeclav winemakers. You will see wine barrels with volumes specified in the original rates, and small tools used in olden times -grinders, baskets, pipets and more. | www.nzm.cz

4 SECONDARY SCHOOL OF VITICULTURE

IN VALTICE – Valtice could not be called the capital of wine without a specialized school. About the establishment of the farmer-winery school, which operates under the name Střední odborná škola vinařská a Střední odborné učiliště zahradnické. It was established in December 1872 and teaching began in November 1873. Students come here from all over Europe. The uniqueness of this institution underscores the fact, that it is the only secondary school in the Czech Republic, throughout its existence, that teaches about the wine and viticulture industry.

S FACULTY OF HORTICULTURE OF MENDELU LEDNICE – You can study gardening, horticulture and garden and landscape architecture in Lednice. The only university in the Czech Republic that teaches wine and viticulture is part of Mendel University in Brno. 6 CHATEAU AND CROSS WINE CELLAR VALTICE

– Valtice attractions would not be complete without the famous wine cellars. The chateau cellar, with a capacity of 600,000 litres, originated around 1430. The cross-cellar with a capacity of over 1 mil litres, 120m long and 100m wide is from 1640. The Vinné sklepy Valtice uses both of the cellars for aging the wine, it is one of the largest producers of wine in Mikulov wine region. You can discover more than 500 cellars used by the lovers of wine in the streets Vinařská, Sklepní, Josefská, Růžová and Polní. | www.vsvaltice.cz

serve with an area of more than 300 km² includes the massive limestone cliff Pálava with its highest peak Děvín (549 m), the ruins of several castles and water meadow countryside in the basin of the rivers Morava and Dyje. Unique forests with meadows, wetlands, blind branches and pools near Lednice smoothly pass into the large landscape park with a castle in the style of English Gothic. The park paths lined by Baroque avenues among fields, ponds, orchards and vineyards lead to Valtice, once the seat of the famous family of Lichtenstein, or to the ancient

Mikulov, where it is just a short bit to the cave in the belly of the hill Turold. If you receive an invitation to visit the Biosphere Reserve Dolní Morava, you will enjoy exploring one of the most beautiful cultural landscapes in the world. Dolní Morava offers a varied beauty of nature with a number of plants and animal species, many historical sights, fine wines and centuries-held folk traditions to visitors. The Worldwide Network of Biosphere Reserves is a varied mosaic of unique areas that UNESCO have inducted under the programme, Man and Biosphere. The classic reserve differs not only in its focus on conservation, but also by its beneficial human activities in the countryside, leading to a positive and sustainable development. In the Czech Republic there are currently six biosphere reserves – Šumava, Krkonoše, Křivoklátsko, Třeboňsko, Bílé Karpaty a Dolní Morava.

unique examples of country Baroque. The wine cellar houses, nineteen of them, are historically protected, built by the small owners of the vineyards. The entrances to the presses, which continues into the cellars, are on the ground floor of the houses. Richly decorated shields, similar to the peasant farms in the village, are inspired by the architecture of Mikulov and reveal how rich the wine-growing village of Pavlov was. A traditional part of the wine house is also

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the niche for a statue of a saint, usually the patron of winemakers St. Urban. The space to sit with guests is in the presses now. Accommodation is available on the floors of houses where winemakers once lived with their families. You can see an ancient spindle wine press from 1851 on the road to Mikulov on the edge of Pavlov. | www.obec-pavlov.cz

WINE EXHIBITION ACROSS THE CENTURIESIN MIKULOV – You can see the largest exhibition in the CR, devoted to the history of viticulture and winemaking at the castle. Barrier-free exhibition with lots of interactive elements and descriptions in Braille was officially opened in June 2012 in the renovated Baroque stables. A visitor passes from Egypt to the present contemporary environments, where you can see rare originals and replicas of documents,



books and wine gadgets. The exhibition's variety interests visitors of all ages and interest groups. Contemporary music sounds throughout the space. The exhibition includes 8 film screenings; you can start one of them by a ride on a bike. | www.rmm.cz

PAVLOV NATURE TRAIL – 3 km long nature trail with 7 interceptions will introduce you to the best of Pavlov. You come to know the local vineyard and terroir of Pálava, you will learn about the history of local wineries and typical varieties of vines. The trail was prepared by Pavlov together with the association of winemakers Vinitores Palaviensis. Pavlov's wine-

makers also hold a traditional spring exhibition of wines, summer of open cellars and November day of open cellars. You can visit the wine cellar, located in the arched cellar below Pavlov town hall.

(i) PERNÁ CULTIVATION STATION – Ing. Josef Veverka worked almost thirty years as a major breeder in the cultivation station, based at the southern foothills of the Pavlov hills. Under his leadership such varieties as Pálava and Aurelius arose. The station was privatized in the early nineties, its owner and operator is doc. Ing. Miloš Michlovský, CSc.

(D MIKULOV – St. Kopeček with the Baroque pilgrimage St. Šebastian church and baroque castle, the Regional Museum in Mikulov seat, with an extensive wine exhibit is a dominant of the major wine centre. Permanent exhibitions also show an art book in the Baroque castle library and Dietrichsteins' picture gallery, the family that lived in Mikulov from 1575 to the end of the Second World War. You can visit the Deitrichsteinská tomb in the square. A Jewish monuments complex with an accessible Horní synagogue in Husova Street recalls that Mikulov was for centuries the spiritual, cultural and political centre of Moravian Jews and in 1851 also the seat of the Moravian rabbis. A nature trail with 13 stops will take you

(B) WINE ACADEMY VALTICE – you can go to Valtice not only because of the wine but also because of the education. The Wine Academy Valtice offers several types of courses that allow familiarization with wine, special technology and modern trends and knowledge of wineries in various parts of the world. After completion of the courses it is possible to write a final themed work and pass a sommelier exam.

DOLNÍ DUNAJOVICE – The first vineyards near the village were founded at the beginning of the 13th century and Dolní Dunajovice is, with more than 300 registered winemakers, the largest wine-growing village of the Mikulov sub-region today. An area of several dozen wine cellars with a view of massive Pálava lie to the west of the village. Their fronts stand



(B) NOVOSEDLY – one of the five largest domestic wine villages. Areas of vineyards with an area of 432 ha are part of the largest vineyards in the Czech Republic, which in total, with vineyards in Brod nad Dyjí, Dolní Dunajovice and Nový Přerov, are over 1,000 ha and this creates an almost continuous vineyard area. You can see the ground presses with granaries, multi-storey presses and sunk cellars with brick facades in the area of dozens of cellars Na jámě. Year-round wine tasting are offered, for instance, by Wine courtyard Kovacs and Wine Marcinčák.

tween the towns Mikulov and Valtice on the bank of the largest Moravian pond Nesyt. The famous vineyards owe their quality to limestone bedrock, the mirror effect of the Nesyt pond and position in the alluvial plain, and shelter from the north by Pálava and several hills. You will see a tasting stand with seating, which offers wine tasting of Sedlecká wines on the cycle path near Nesyt in summer.

THE VALTICE WINE-GROWING NATURE TRAIL

– 5 km long nature trail starts before chateau Valtice and ends at Valtice Underground. You can go by foot or bicycle with the exception of the park around the castle Valtice where cycling is prohibited. 16 panels of information will educate you about the happenings in the vineyards, with a history of domestic wine and vine growing in the Mikulov wine region. The vineyard of the Specialized secondary wine school is an interesting point, different varieties of vines are planted here and a different types of cultivation and drag are introduced. The trail will lead you to a medieval wine cellar in the castle gardens and to the colonnade Rajstna. A beautiful view opens onto the north, nearby Pálava, floodplain forests, forested slopes of Chřiby and the Bílé Karpaty from the roof terrace.

TRAIL – 3.5 km long educational wine trail Stará hora begins above the village Novosedly on the road from

Dobré Pole to Drnholec between 2 stone pylons. It will guide you through the vineyards on Stará hora, they are taken care of by the novosedelské winery Wine Marcinčák. 11 panels are devoted to the history and present of growing vine, vine varieties and correct wine tasting.

TRAIL – Mikulov is the starting point of a 20 km long route with 17 stops, which will introduce you to the wine traditions of the region under Pálava. The path leads through Pálava across Bavory to Perná, then continues through Horní and Dolní Věstonice to Pavlov and Klentnice, villages that lie under the ruins of Sirotčí castle. The route takes you also to Mikulov's castle and a permanent archaeological exhibition in Dolní Věstonice. You can go by foot, bicycle or car. www.mikulov.cz



THE LEDNICE-VALTICE LANDSCAPE – the area near Břeclav is registered on the list of World Cultural and Natural Heritage by UNESCO as the largest artistic renderings of landscapes in the world since 1996. I am fascinated by wine culture

RADIM FIALA

Actor Radim Fiala comes from Brno. He graduated from the conservatoire and JAMU in the subject



of drama acting. He began his acting career at the Brno theatre Husa na provázku, where he remained for 14 years, and in 2006 he moved to Prague. He played dozens of theatrical characters in Brno. His most famous films are Tmavomodrý svět, Tobruk and Stůj, nebo se netrefím. From the television we know him mainly from the series Ordinace v růžové zahradě, where his character Dr. Hanák has be-

come one of the most popular. His hobbies include cooking, travelling and he is a wine lover.

It is known about you that you like Mikulovsko and Pálava. Is this true? By what did this region enchant you?

Even as a kid I saw, when visibility was good for us from Bohunice, the peaks of Pálava. Later, most school trips were in this direction. And then when I was mobile and independent accompanied by someone older, my steps logically led right here. I have a lot of friends here, Libor Lípa, Roman Janeček, Hynek Pavlačka, Laco Garaj, Mirek Korek and many others and I'm sorry that I do not have more time to be here more often. Irrespective of the fact that Pálava is one of the few endemic places in our country. I call here a little Toscana. Do you know a prettier sunset than from the Dívčí hrady or Svatý kopeček?

Which kind of wine do you like? Is one your

This is quite a tricky question. I would not want to look suspicious when I say that I do not mind any variety. Whether it is Neuburg, Frühroter Veltliner, Sauvignon or Pálava. I prefer red wines in recent years, because I see a phenomenal jump forward. I have my favourites among the wines and also winemakers. And there are small winemakers and also established brands among them

Do you have any experience working in the vineyard? Can you imagine yourself as a winemaker?

Unfortunately I have not had the chance yet. But I hear from my friends very often that it is slavery! But the idea of myself as the one who has something to do with wine is extremely tempting! One of my dreams is to have a cellar, where I could meet with friends, family, and if there was a vineyard, it would be dreamland!

On which occasions do you like to sit with wine?

They always say that with friends for better discussion ... But when I have a taste for wine, I simply drink it! I'm trying to unite it with the food I cook, or will serve. But it often happens that when I'm cooking there is no wine left. Otherwise, I am fascinated by wine culture and I love wine tasting! It is always possible to find the perfect opportunity to open a bottle of good wine!

What in your life led you to acting? Who or what affected you in your professional and private life the most?

It is curious how often this question appears! Every time I answer it, I realize that the path to this profession was quite tortuous, although quite predictable. As a small child I went to a Pírko. Then I went to the Brno Conservatoire and then JAMU. Mr. Ladislav Lakomý, who taught me at the Conservatoire, used to tell us that theatre is a hard life. Prof. Alois Hajda from JAMU tried to instil in us that theatre has to be done with love. Petr Scherhuafer in Divadlo na provázku taught me, what's what! The movies influenced me probably the most in my life. As a kid I went to the cinema in Bohunice, which had no name, the building was just indicated as a cinema, and the front two rows were a sort of unstuffed folding seat and the rest were various chairs of all shapes and colours. And then I went instead of to school completely by accident to a film with Robert De Niro, it represented a total shock for me! Films like The Fighting Sullivans, The Magnificent Seven, Tootsie, Once Upon a Time in America or Cinema Paradiso will stay with me forever.

Is there any role that you would like to get in the future?

I do not strictly have a dream role. But belonging to the club of actors that played 007, that would be something! Maybe even in our country there will once be a brave man who will dare to breathe life into some Czech 007.

What for you is the most important thing in your life?

The older I get, the more I realize that life is the most in life that can happen to us. And of course family, friends, health and wine!

WINERY KOVACS

Winery Kovacs was founded in 1997 and is located in the wine village Novosedly. You may know them as partners of the movie Doktor od jezera hrochů or Babovřesky, for each film a special wine edition was produced. In addition, its founder Miroslav Kovács



appeared on television with director Zdeněk Troška in the show about wine called Wine Odyssey.

He established a company philosophy, which is led by the motto "art in wine", identified a target, direction and path that the winery will take. The main objective is particularly high wine quality.

You will find Vinařský dvůr Kovacs (Wine Courtyard of Winery Kovacs) on the edge of Novosedly in the direction of Dobré Pole; the company wine store and wine restaurant and guesthouse is open here the whole year. Together with the winery they

offer tastings, culinary experiences and gourmet gastronomy combined with their own wines. The winery farms on 35 ha of vineyards spread over Novosedly and surroundings. The company produces up to a quarter of a million bottles of characteristically clean, bold and distinctive wines.

Winery Kovacs is also dedicated to wine tourism, agro tourism, cycling tourism and hipotourism. They participate in many important national and international competitions, festivals and fairs and you may also meet their wines at various social and gastronomic events.

WINERY GOTBERG

Two purely modern wine houses – Sonberk and Gotberg grew up among the Stará hora and Popice vineyards over a few years. Young Brno architect, Martin Bukolský, earned the trust of winemakers



at Gotberg. It was a lucky choice: the building was awarded the title Construction of the South Moravian Region, 2009, in the category of industrial and technological structures. So you will not find a traditional wine cellar, get ready for icy shades of concrete, iron and glass.

Winery Gotberg bet on high quality predicate wines. And even though this has been on the wine map only briefly, it has confirmed its reputation, through many medals from national and international competitions, that wines from Moravia can afford comparison with foreign wines. Winery Gotberg has won awards in Israel, Britain, Belgium, France, Italy, Austria

and the United States. The quality of local wines is underlined by the fact that the entire grape production occurs in a bio regime and all wines are made from wholesome organic grapes gently processed in a modern operation.

A beautiful view of vineyards and the Pálava hills opens from the terrace of Gotberg, a tasting room, offices and guest house hide in the interior. You can stop by for a glass of wine and then continue through vineyards by bike or foot or spend the night in a comfortable room surrounded by vineyards the whole year.



primordial gem of our ancestors **VĚSTONICKÁ VENUS**

An abundance of game and a favourable climate attracted the first inhabitants of South Moravia half a million years ago. Archaeological findings from a number of places confirm that the mammoth hunters, the 1st farmers and cattle breeders lived here. Villages of metal workers of Bronze and Iron Age arose here. Findings confirm the presence of Romans, Celts, Germanic tribes and nomadic Huns and Vandals.

Dolní Věstonice has become famous because of systematic surveys of archaeological sites from the Early Stone Age. Prof. Karel Absolon, a researcher in the area of caving and archaeology led them 1924–1938. The little sculpture of a Palaeolithic beauty was found in the remains of a fire at the top of a prehistoric place between Dolní Věstonice and Pavlov on 13. 7. 1925. An unknown creator moulded it from a mixture of clay approximately 25,000 years ago.

The Věstonická Venus statue, 11.5 cm tall and 4.3 cm wide at the hips, is not only unique in the world, but it also gets recognition as the oldest ceramic work in the world. The original is in the possession of the



SMALL STRUCTURES

When walking through the romantic landscape between Valtice and Lednice you will discover many small structures. They all date back to the beginning of the 19th century and their builders placed them into the landscape as precious pearls.

Janohrad – Romantic artificial castle ruins with several grand halls, a perfect replica of medieval castle ruins.

Minaret – A 60-metre-tall look-out, one of the biggest structures of its kind in the non-Islamic countries, from the highest gallery you can sometimes see even the spire of the church of St. Stephen in Vienna.

Temple of Three Graces – The Classicist sheltered colonnade south of the Prostřední pond, hall with a mosaic floor, sculpture of three ancient goddesses chiselled from one piece of stone.

Nový dvůr – The large farmstead in the Empire style, since the end of the 19th century the noble riding horses have been bred there, racecourse nearby.

Apollo's Temple – A small structure with eight Doric columns by the dam of the Mlýnský pond, the attic gable decorated by the scenes from mythology.

St. Hubert – The open Neo-Gothic chapel in the middle of the forest glade.

Rendez-vous (Diana's Temple). A big structure in the shape of the Roman victory arch, interiors are accessible

Colonnade at Rajstna – A monumental Classicist structure above Valtice with a look-out terrace, decorated by figures from the ancient mythology.

Border Chateau – Classicist residence on the historic border between Moravia and Lower Austria.

Pond Chateau – The Empire styled lodge, which since 1926 has housed the first biological research station in Moravia.



Lookout tower U KŘÍŽKU IN DRNHOLEC

A new 11m-high tower with an observation deck at a 9.9 m height was opened in June 2012. It's placed in the vineyard U Křížku, in a place with a nice view of the surroundings. A floodplain forest Drnholecký luh, Austrian castles Falkenstein and Staatz, border hill Langewarte and village Wildendürnbach with wine cellars area on the hill Galgenberg are visible from the tower to the south. To the east you will see Drnholec, Pálava and a place where the Dyje flows into the Novomlýnské lakes.

Lednice – chateau in the style of English Tudor Neo-Gothic with a large park, centre of the Lednice-Valtice Composed Landscape, UNESCO site.



Major cellar upgrading took place in 2008–2009, when Vít Dočkal bought new technology for the processing of grapes, the system of controlled fermentation and bottling, and introduced modern methods of vinification. Wines from Vít Dočkal are almost exclusively predicate, the winemaker himself prefers semi-dry or semi-sweet, and lightweight with a typical "Pálava" bouquet of foreign

fruit or blooming meadows. You can taste it in the newly renovated Dietrichštejnský dvůr (Dietrichstein courtyard) in the Bulhary centre. The family wine cellar from the Habán time is located close to the accommodation apartment building "Nad Sklepy".

Winery Vinné sklepy Valtice was at the birth of winery in Valtice. The city was owned by many noble families, and then in the 14th century it came under the ownership of the significant princely Lichtenstein family. Lichtenstein recognized that in South Moravia are excellent conditions for growing grapes and producing wine in the early 15th century. The winery was built on the model of the French wine dominion "Château". By its character, focus and size was built for one of the most prominent Austria aristocratic families of Lichtenstein a unique wine unit of the European

The Chateau cellar AD 1430 with a capacity of almost 700,000 l was built more than half a century before Christopher Columbus discovered America. The large cross-vault cellar AD 1640 with a capacity of over one million litres was built in 1640. Both cellars are used today as in the past for storing and maturing the best Valtice wines that indicate the highest quality wines – CHATEAU VAL-TICE. The Chateau cellar is accessible to tourists.

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






wine-growing sub-region **VELKOPAVLOVICKÁ**

1 SLAVKOV – a city, whose name in German form is Austerlitz, is known thanks to the Napoleonic Battle of Austerlitz (2. 12. 1805) to the whole world. The truce between France and Austria was concluded after the battle in the baroque castle. You can see historical interiors, the remains of the former early Gothic commandery of the Teutonic Order, preserved in the deep underground of Austerlitz castle. The golf course of the Golf Club Austerlitz extends to the park. The Peace Memorial, Art Nouveau stone chapel, a memorial of wars and their victims, is on the hill above the village Prace. The decisive fights of the battle took place here. The building with multimedia exhibition of the Brněnska Museum and a café is in the surrounding park area.



The Peace Memorial Ceremony set to honour the dead as the climax of the commemoration anniversary of the battle every year is at the turn of November and December.

2 KRUMVÍŘ – the first historical mention of the village is from 1350. Although Krumvíř has a scratch plough and wine knife in its seal, the

written mention of the wine tithe is from 1723. The series of cellars are the pride of the village, many of them have a painted porch. Krumvíř is also famous for pottery, wood carving and scratched egg production. You can come for example to visit the folk festival Kraj bez stínu or costumed feast of St. Bartoloměj.

3 BRNO – the 1st written record of Brno's vine-yards is from the 13th century. Vineyards were planted around the slopes of uptown Brno, many of them have various attributes of wine-grapes, wine knives and baskets in their logos. Grapevines even once grew on the southern slopes of Špilberk, but when the castle became a military baroque fortress, its slopes had to remain bare for defensive reasons. Špilberk, the most famous prison of the Habsburg monarchy, is the seat of the Brno City Museum now. The casemates with a prison exhibition are one of the most attractive tourist sites.

The Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul and the Old Town Hall belongs to another dominant of the city. The local arched passage, with the famous Brno dragon, is decorated with a beautiful late-Gothic stone portal. You can see a bird's eye view of the historic centre from the town hall tower with Renaissance gallery.

You will also find Villa Tugendhat in Brno. A masterpiece of functionalist architecture from the German architect Ludwig Mies van der Rohe from 1929–1930, which was registered on World Heritage List of UNESCO in 2001. Modern architecture lovers admire Brno's Exhibition Centre, which is thanks to a unique collection of functionalist architecture, one of the most elegant exhibition areas in the world. Automotodrom Masaryk Circuit, the venue of the annual motorcycle Grand Prix, golf course in Jinačovice,

the zoo or museum of prehistory pavilion Anthropos represent Brno as a city of entertainment and leisure. Bystrc, Chrlice, Maloměřice, Medlánky, Obřany and Tuřany belong to the winegrowing villages. You can find smaller vineyards in the Vinohrady district, where nearly all the streets of modern housing are named after the wine villages of South Moravia.

4 HUSTOPEČE – EXPOSITION – vineyards around Hustopeče were among the largest in the Czech lands in the past. They were owned by the nobility, monasteries and wealthy citizens from Brno and Olomouc. The city used to have its own, very famous, horenský (wine) court against whose decision it was not possible to appeal. It stood on the place of today's bank, where you can still see the original stone coat of arms on the facade.

The citizens had the wine cellars under their houses like elsewhere. The Renaissance house U Synků, below which 2 parallel cellars have survived, on the upper part of the square is from 1579. You can see the permanent wine exhibition of Hustopeče with wine store in the stylishly renovated underground. Exhibition, opened in 2003, serves to promote the winemakers of the wine-growing sub-region velkopavlovická. The panels describing the yearlong work in the vineyard, winemaking and history of Hustopeče are here with contemporary objects, used for treating vineyards, wine production and storage. Both cellars are equipped with wine boxes where the local winemakers have the opportunity to exhibit their wine samples. The space for wine tasting is completed with information panels about each variety of grape grown in the Czech Republic. If you want to taste Hustopeče wine, you can choose from several wine tasting programmes, or go to one of the wine attractions. A range of them is held in Hustopeče – Wine competition about the Hustopeče seal, expedition through the André region, stum festival or celebration of St. Martin's wine and geese. You will discover a quaint curiosity in the courtyard of the house U Synků – a sandstone sculpture of wine yeasts. The circumference is 167 cm and it is 69,230

times bigger then the live original. Hustopece has

gained the Czech record for the biggest art prints of

and Sv. Anežka Česká dominates Hustopeče. Its predecessor, the late-Gothic church of St. Václav, was damaged during the Second World War. The new church, an interesting two-storey building in the shape of a spiral, was ordained in 1994. Copies of saved architectural elements of the old church are integrated into the interiors, the peak of the tower is decorated with a stylized St. Václav crown.

because of the dominance of blue varieties, which due to the locality's open position to the south has almost 1900 hours of sunshine a year. The best red wines in Central Europe are produced here because of this. Velké Pavlovice is written into wine history mainly due to the breeding station, which created 4 new essentially Czech varieties. Aromatic Pálava and Aurelius represent white varieties, Agni and André, wine with aroma of forest fruits, blue varieties.



André was bred by crossing varieties Blaufränkisch and Saint Laurent in 1961, named after Ch. K. André (1763–1831). He founded the 1st association for fruit breeding in the world in Brno, and sparked the interest for obtaining new varieties of crossbreeding. You will discover a grape press from 1816, a variety of ancient wine cellars and presses, which give the town and surrounding vineyard countryside its

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unique character, in Velké Pavlovice. The Baroque granary, a construction of a technical nature from 1770–1780, is the most interesting architectural monument of the town besides the baroque Church Nanebevzetí Panny Marie and several small religious monuments. You can go on a short trip to St. Urban chapel, which stands only a few hundred meters from the Slunečná tower in the vine track Nadzahrady or to the modern cellar streets, which grew at the foot of the most famous velkopavlovická vine track Staré hory in 2012. The designer of fun "la gaudiwaser", drunken cellars playing with all colours, is Josef Veverka.

(5) KOBYLÍ – a hectare of vineyard was more expensive than 20 ha of fields here, according to documents from the 14th century. Deep and long ancient wine cellars scattered throughout the village and old wooden presses show the high wine production. The wine cellar street Suchořádská zmola belongs to the most interesting places. Once there used to be ravine, it collapsed after heavy rain in 1900. The mu-



seum of Kobilí history and its inhabitants shows that today's life of the village is closely associated with viniculture and viticulture. You can see a permanent exhibition of traditional small-scale wine production with a wine store offering wine tasting of local winemakers. | www.kobyli.cz

ČEJKOVICE – the 1st written reports on the village from 1248 are associated with the existence of a fort built by members of the Order of the Knights Templar. Templars started to cultivate vine and built a Gothic fort with extensive cellars with a length of 650 m, one of the largest in the Czech Republic. Marvellous legends have always been told about the height, width and length of the Templar cellars and many of them have survived till now. Armed men on the horses and fully loaded carts could pass through the tunnels. You cannot see the secret corridor, which should lead from Čejkovice to Slovak's Skalice, but the wine cellar, used by Templářské cellars for storage of vintage wines and maturation up to 350,000 litres of wine in oak barrels and barriques are open. The former Templar ford is used as a hotel, you can taste and buy the best wines from Čejkovice and surrounds in the Castle Wine Gallery. They say that Čejkovické wine cellars are among the elite wine buildings in the region. They are concentrated in several locations. The traditional centre is the street rising from the road from the village Čejč toward the Kopeček, the other cellars with presses are located by the cycle path towards Vrbice and under the vineyards on the eastern edge of the village. Tomáš Garrique Masaryk, founder of Czechoslovakia, spent part of his childhood in Čejkovice. A small museum is in the house where his family lived.

8 BOŘETICE – FREE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF KRAVÍ HORA – Bořetice, like other villages in the area, has a wine tradition. The first written mention of the surrounding vineyards is from 1361. Bořetičtí began to build cellars directly under the vineyard slopes, because between the village and vineyard slopes Kraví hora was a lake unto 1835. It is said that winemakers went to the cellars and vineyards in boats and the poorer ones had to paddle in a washtub.

A large cellar area is the pride of Bořetice till now. You can count about 260 wine cellars in double rows that gradually form a cellar village with several streets. You can go through the Horní and Dolní Frejd (so called hedges that once fenced the upper and lower border of the vineyard), Hliníky and Zahraničí. 15 m



high wooden tower, which recalls the village's victory in the national round of the competition Village of the year 2005, have stood above the area of wine cellars between Bořetice and Němčičky since summer 2006. It easily accessible on foot or by bike from the cellar area.

Bořetice recess Free Federal Republic of Kraví hora attracts the attention of visitors. The local winemakers declared it to promote Bořetické winery in 2001. The Republic has a government, president, constitution, anthem, emblem, flag, postage stamps and currency and established contacts with neighbouring countries, such as the Valašské Kingdom.

• MODRÉ HORY (BLUE MOUNTAINS) – the 31 km long circular route will take you through the land-scape, which is the legendary heart of the Moravian red wines production. The path, whose length can be adjusted according to your own taste, combines the wine villages Bořetice, Kobylí, Němčičky, Velké Pavlovice and Vrbice where blue grapes varieties are grown on more than half of the vineyards.

MUNICIPAL WINE-GROWING ROUTE OF NĚM-

ČIČKY – The 8 km long circuit will introduce you to the history of viticulture, vine tracks in Němčičky and attractions around the planting and cultivating of vines. You can visit the places with unique views of the surroundings by bicycle or foot. The route follows the Moravian wine trail and is completed by 4 information panels with maps. You can also visit the pilgrimage place of local winemakers, the chapel of St. Antonín, and the wine cellars in the street Za humny. | www.nemcicky.cz

most villages on Velkopavlovicko is truly unmistakable and the tower of the neo-Romanesque church of St. Jiljí is possible to see from a distance of several tens of kilometres. Two locations of the local cellars were built in an interval of several centuries. The older colony Na sklepech, which consists of two lower floors of wine buildings in the village, originated in the second half of the 17th century. The wine cellars Stráž are better known, arranged in 5 terraces below the church, each level has its own name: Na

vyhlídce, Podkova, Pod kostelem, Pod větřákem and Pod novýma. The first corridors were dug at the turn of the 18th and 19th century, presses with a stone facade were added in the middle of the last century. Local peculiarities are the Gothic pointed arches.

12 ROUTE THROUGH THE REGION OF ANDRÉ

– trail named after the red wine variety leads from Hustopeče over Starovičky, Velké Pavlovice and Bořetice to Vrbice. New lookout tower on Kraví hora attracts tourists in Bořetice, unique ancient cellars at Vrbice, breeding station where the variety André arose in Velké Pavlovice. Nearly 19 km long trail with a quality surface is suitable for cycling, but you can go by foot as well.

B THE VELKÉ BÍLOVICE NATURE WINE-GROWING TRAIL – trail, with views of the most extensive complex of vineyards in the Czech Republic, is 5 km long and copies the cycling Velkopavlovická wine trail and familiarizes you with the history of viticulture and vine tracks near Velké Bílovice. Walk through



the cellar area with 650 cellars, divided into 3 parts: Půrynky, Pod předníma and the most famous Belegrady. Nice view of Velké Bílovice and surrounds opens from the top of Hradištěk, where a chapel dedicated to St. Václav, St. Urban and St. Cyril and Metoděj stands. www.velkebilovice.cz | www.velkebilovice.com

VĚRA KOUBOVÁ

The translator Věra Koubová studied English and German at Charles University in Prague. She specializes in German literature and is considered



one of the best translators from German into Czech, with translation of Nietzsche, Kafka and others to her credit. In 2005 she was awarded the Jungmann prize for her translation of the poems of Franz Wurm. She also devotes much of her time to photography and has had a number of solo exhibitions, as well as publishing several volumes of photographs. Věra Koubová also works for radio, creating and

performing in literary-musical programmes. In 2013 she was awarded the Magnesia Litera prize for her translation of a verse collection.

You were born in Klobouky u Brna. How much of your childhood did you spend there? What are your feelings towards the region today?

Not every one who lives in Klobouky is lucky enough to have been born there. Even my mother, a Klobouky lass to the core, was born down the road in Brno. But I was impatient, so instead of my mum being rushed to the maternity ward in town, the local midwife was called away from her jam-making to help with the birth at the mill. And there at the mill I spent the most beautiful part of my childhood: the holidays. That's why my feelings are nothing but good ones.

What about your memories? Does the countryside around Velké Pavlovice have a special meaning for you?

My childhood memories are confined to the area around my grandfather's mill, which he was not allowed to run when I was a child, though the communist authorities did let him and his family live there. There was a railway line that went past the house on an embankment. We had a good view of it from the swing in the garden: shunting carriages, locomotives engulfed in clouds of steam, the squeaking and screeching of wheels on the tracks - seductive sights for a little girl on her swing dreaming up stories about a snorting monster. I adore the St. Lawrence's Day fair, visits to our lovely aunt Jitka, the fruit-laden trees in the orchards, and the artfully trained vines on the gently sloping hillsides, like in Tuscany.

Last year I was in the Lednice-Valtice area several times on 'business' as a Czech producer for a German film called Here in Paradise. It was shot in Valtice and Lednice and there was a whole sequence about the viniculture students at the Faculty of Horticulture in Lednice.

Did your birthplace affect your life or the lives of your loved ones? Are any members of your family winemakers? Are you a winelover yourself?

I always used to be rather proud of that funny name: Klobouky (in English, 'Hats'). Then, quite recently, I read in a book that it actually refers to the hat-shaped hills of the surrounding hills. For me Klobouky always meant first and foremost those wonderful, brightly-coloured folk costumes, and the music and songs that go with them. And song without wine was unthinkable. Our family was musical too: dad is a cellist, and his brother sings and plays keyboards at village dances – I love those languid Moravian melodies - and both of them are great wine conoisseurs. My uncle in Dambořice is actually a winemaker and wins prizes for his wines.

Which wine do you prefer, red or white? How important is wine at your family gatherings?

We drink almost only red at home. After the Velvet Revolution I was so glad to see labels with the names of winegrowing areas I'd known in my childhood. For a while there was one Klobouky wine that was sold in a tall, slender bottle which I'd have bought for the shape of the bottle alone - and for reasons of local patriotism, of course. My husband and I set aside a special time for wine every evening at around 11 o'clock, when he turns off his computer and I shut the darkroom door.

Is there any of your work you feel really good about? Something you know has been well received by your peers?

There is undoubtedly a close link between wine and love, and the sense of being in love is expressed vividly in the poetry collection by the German writer Richard Pietrass, Traumsaum (in English, 'Dreamrim'). As you mentioned, the literary establishment liked my translation and awarded me the Magnesia Litera translation prize. I like this book because it was very difficult to translate, and I never could resist a challenge.

VINSELEKT MICHLOVSKÝ

Vinselekt Michlovský grows vines on about tour of operations accompanied by an expert inter-120 ha of vineyards mainly around Pálava. Farming in integrated production adds 11.5 ha in an organic viticulture system, especially in Přítluky, Perná and



Klentnice. Miloš Michlovský's aim is to have 25 ha in bio production in the future. The company buys other grapes from long-term suppliers that observe required criteria. Annual production exceeds 1 million bottles. Their wines are becoming, in the long term, champions of nearly all domestic competitions. They are regularly displayed in Wine Salon of the Czech Republic in Valtice and also celebrate achievements in the world. The organic wines have also received awards at exhibitions in Germany, France, the United States, etc.

For those wanting to know how top wines from Miloš Michlovský arose, the winery offers a sophisticated

pretation and of course tasting of selected wines. You can also taste the wines at the traditional presentation and professional tasting.

Vinselekt production is done partly through the "HORECA" system, where wines are offered in the lines Vinum Palaviense, Chateau Dowina, Harmony, and also a private line Archetype, Haus wine, PAR, etc. More than half of the production is sold in retail. Their own marketing line is developed for each retail chain, but always with the clear and visible logo Vinselekt Michlovský.

towards Němčičky is Hotel Kraví hora, which focuses on conference and wine tourism.

The hotel offers accommodation in 34 rooms with a total capacity of 72 beds, in each can be added an extra bed or cot. You will find there a stylish nonsmoking restaurant with a children's corner and a summer terrace, involved in the project Czech Specials, or taste Czech cuisine, and a modern gourmet restaurant. Bučovice – Renaissance chateau with stylish interiors and garden, unique arcaded courtyard with fountain. **Bořetice** – wine-growing village with a large complex of wine cellars under the Kraví Hora vineyard.

Vrbice – wine-growing village with picturesque wine cellar colony "Pod strážním kopcem".

Židlochovice – Baroque chateau, once a popular summer house of the first Czechoslovakian president T. G. Masaryk. Extensive English style park with a game park. **Velké Bílovice** – the biggest wine-growing village in the Czech Republic with 714 ha of vineyards, wine cellar colonies Belegrady and Pod Předníma, wine-growing nature route.

The bigger part of grapes for wine production are purchased from regular suppliers exclusively from Velké Bílovice. They produce 12 white and 11 blue grape varieties. The Vladimír Tetur winery opened its representative modern hall, with controlled humidity for red wine placed in barrels from French coopery SEGUIN MOREAU, in 2008. The Vladimír Tetur winery produces bottled quality and predicate wines, including wine barriques. It focuses on aromatic wines such as Moravian Muscat and Irsai Oliver, which have won several gold and silver medals, for instance at the Valtice wine markets, the Grand Prix Vinex, Weinparade in Poysdorf, at the Muvina competition in



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wine-growing sub-region **SLOVÁCKÁ**

1 VELEHRAD – an important spiritual centre is also one of the most important pilgrimage places in the Czech Republic. The 1st Great Moravian archbishop, St. Metoděj, had his headquarters here according to legend. The 1st Cistercian monastery in Moravia arose at Velehrad in 1205. Its founder, the Moravian margrave Vladislav Jindřich, named it after the nearby village Veligrad. The 100 m long five-aisled basilica, once the largest church in the Czech lands, is decorated with many paintings, banners and valuable gifts of pilgrims from around the world. Baroque carved choir pews and the organ from the 18th century belong to the art treasures. The area of the courtyard, lapidary and chapel of St. Cyril and Metoděj, colloquially



called Cyrilka, are part of the pilgrimage area. Velehradská basilica was named Basilica Minor by Pope Pius XI. in 1927, Pope John Paul II. awarded the Golden Rose, a rare gift, which are boasted by France's Lourdes, Mexico's Guadalupe and Poland's Czestochowa, in 1985. The main pilgrimage takes place on 5th July on the feast of St. Cyril and Metoděi.

2 BZENEC – one of the first wine cooperatives was formed in a city with a long wine history. Its awareness comes mainly from the trademarked wine from Riesling called Bzenecká Lipka, which smells like flowers of the thousand-year-old linden in the castle park. You can still see it Bzenec, apparently the oldest tree in Moravia with an estimated age of around 900 years. You can see the ancient wine cellars, for example, in the cellar street in Baráky or under Starý hrad hill. The wine cellar area Na Těmické originated at the end of the 20th century.

RYJOV – when visiting the city you should not miss the Renaissance chateau with grafitto decoration, today the seat of the National history museum with ethnographic exhibitions, and a charming Renaissance town hall in Masarykovo Square. The winery with a hundred years' tradition remains in the cellar streets in Nětčice, the row of cellars in Vývoz, Boršov and viticulture buildings Na Šištótě in the street U Sklepů. You can see a permanent wine exhibition in the cellar U Petra, they also offer wine tasting and wine sales from several Kyjovsko growers. The Slovácký rok festival happens in Kyjov once every 4 years, one of the most important ethnographic festivals in Moravia.

4 PETROV – PLŽE – area of historic wine cellars on the western edge of the village Petrov stands out for its distinctive ground plan and visual character. Plže was mentioned already in the 15th century, built by the winemakers only with local and family help. They are embedded directly into the hillside and have no parts above ground, their width is usually around 3 m, length 15 m, rarely 20 m and more. A layer of clay above the cellar helps to maintain good indoor

climate, important for wine quality. Baroque cellars with white lime plaster and slovácké ornaments create a street with 2 village squares that serve as community centres. You can find the oldest and artistically valuable objects around the top of the viticultural area. Plže was announced as the first village reserves in the Czech Republic in 1983.

The wine breeding stations were established in the village in 1922. Varieties Moravian Muscat, Olšava or Amos come from here. The centre of polešovické viticulture is the area U sklepů near the church and you can find more wine cellars in the Hřbitovní Street, at Zbořiska, at Zábraní and in the picturesque ancient streets Maruša. You can taste polešovická wines at the wine open cellars festival with the announcement of the results of wine competitions TOP wine of Slovácko in September, Slovácké feasts in October and at the wine blessing in December. | www.polesovice.cz

6 PRUŠÁNKY AND NECHORY – wine village Prušánky also has its own wine cellar village Nechory, it lies approximately 1 km from the village under the same-named vine track. The area with 450 wine cellars is divided into upper and lower Nechory, it has a square, a few streets, and even the guardian spirit Ochechula. | www.obecprusanky.cz

TUPESY – a village famous for its pottery and ceramics. You can visit the permanent exhibition of small farmers' dwellings with examples of local pottery production in one of the oldest houses. You will become familiar with the current technology of ceramic production, and your can try turning the potter's wheel, modelling and painting mugs or other goods with coloured glazes from your own imagination in the new workroom.

3 MILOTICE – The Baroque palace is an architectural gem of Milotice, once residence of the Serényiů family. Tour of stylish interiors livens up the temporary exhibitions, the chateau wine gallery visit or walk around the French garden and adjacent pheasantry. You will discover wine village Šidleny with approxi-

mately 250 wine cellars about 2 km southwest of the village under the Náklo hill. Atmosphere of Šidleny is completed by small sacred objects, and a traditional feast and wine tasting are often held here.

BLATNICE POD SVATÝM ANTONÍNKEM – a village under the northern foothills of Bílé Karpaty is a famous place of pilgrimage. The pilgrimage chapel of St. Antonín Paduánský on Blatnická mountain was built in the late 17th century by Prince Hartnam of Lichtenstein as a thanks for curing his son. The pilgrimage tradition together with the varied beauty of slovácké costumes inspired painters such as Joža Uprk, who is also the author of the picture on the main altar in the church of Sv. Ondřej. The trademark wine Blatnický Roháč made Blatnice famous. It is named after the vine track Roháče. It is made from Riesling, Pinot Blanc and Sylvaner and as the 1st








museum in addition to wine tasting in the Janošek Cellars. Traditional events are Mutěnice wine days with closing the mountain, held the 1st weekend of September, and the Kateřinské feast in November. www.mutenice.cz

(1) VELETINY – The character of the village with vine, grapes and wine knife documents centuries-old wine tradition. A complex of clay and brick presses with no cellars, called "búda" from the 18th to 19th century, has been preserved in the Stará hora area. Winemakers pressed wine, stored barrels and tools to cultivate the vineyard in this building, one of the oldest buildings of its kind in Slovácko. They still maintain cultural traditions and ancient customs, such as carolling of the Three Kings, parade of carnival masks, etc. in the village. | www.veletiny.cz

D VLČNOV – Ride of the Kings is held in Vlčnov annually on the last weekend of May, the oldest and most famous Slovacko folk festival. A procession of the royal entourage, accompanied by a number



of riders on horses, has a unique atmosphere. The event is full of beautiful costumes, famous Vlčnov doughnuts and wine tasting. You can see the biggest collection of listed vineyard buildings in the Czech Republic in Kojiny pod Starou horou. You can taste the local wines in an authentic environment directly in the wine cellar of one of the winemakers by agree-

ment. You can visit the ethnographic exhibition in a rustic house No. 57, documenting the living and farming in the 19th and 20th century and the Museum of folk distilleries. | www.vlcnov.cz

B STRÁŽNICE – from the sights of the former rich market town, protected by a moated castle, it is worth seeing the bastion at the former Veselská nad Skalická gates that have survived from the original medieval fortifications. The National Institute of Folk Culture resides at the castle, you can see the collection of folk musical instruments. Another big attraction is Strážnické museum – Museum of a South Moravian village. It includes a set of wine-growing structures with original equipment and vineyard, the only domestic exhibition of its kind. A part of the traditional International Folklore Festival in June and harvesting of grapes in September happen at the museum every year. 18 km long trail through strážnické vineyards will take you around the town.

THE MORAVIAN MUSCAT ROUTE – All cyclists and wine lovers are invited for one day event On a Bike through Uherské Hradiště vineyards each spring and autumn. Start of the event is at the main Masaryk Square in Uherské Hradiště in the morning, the route leads along the trails around Slovácko wine cellars with the door wide open and the offer of local wine tasting. One route is 25 km long Moravian Muscat trail, which introduces you to the history of the creation of the Moravian Muscat variety in Polešovice. It teaches you to recognize the wine varieties in the vineyards and offers a number of panoramic views of the surrounding vineyards. The trail leads through Kunovský wood to Kostelany nad Moravou, Nedakonice and Polešovice, where Moravian Muscat was bred. From here it continues through Vážany, Tučapy and Boršice to Zlechov and returns to Uherské Hradiště via Staré Město.

THE PINOT BLANC ROUTE – 45 km long circular route begins and ends in Uherské Hradiště. It takes you to places where the traditional burgundy variety is grown. It leads through Staré Město, Zlechov, Tupesy, Velehrad, Jalubí, Traplice, Dolinu, Kudlovice and Babice. | www.uherske-hradiste.cz



16 UHERSKÉ HRADIŠTĚ – the city is the heart of the Slovácko, a region famous for peculiar folklore, dulcimer music, good wine, beautiful costumes and a number of well-preserved folk traditions. The Baroque Jesuit church of St. František Xaverský and the New Renaissance town hall with the ceremonial hall decorated by Jožka Uprk paintings domitate the main Masarykovo square. The pharmacy U Zlaté koruny, hotel Slunce where the rennovation revealed many interesting architectural details, and in the courtyard a modern mall belongs among the preserved Renaissance houses. Slovacké museum attracts visitors to the permanent exhibition devoted to Moravian folk culture, and vineyards with a wine shed and burgher wine cellars in the town part Mařatice. You can taste the local wines every year in September, when Slovácký wine and open sights festival are held, or at St. Martin's consecration of the wine in November.

TWHITE CARPATHIANS – an extremely valuable natural landscape has survived in this area. It has been carefully cultivated by harmonious coexistence between man and nature for many centuries. In the protected landscape area of Bílé Karpaty, included among the European UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, a large amount of valuable habitats have managed to have been kept such as meadows in the beautiful nature reserve Čertoryje or extensive meadows and woods with a small number of protected and endangered species of plants and animals in the Jazevčí nature reserve. The highest peak of Bílé Karpaty is Velká Javořina (970 m). | www.bilekarpaty.cz

(B) SUDOMĚŘICE – vineyards in the most southern slopes of the Bílé Karpaty in the Sudoměřice area are just a few metres from the border with Slovakia in the area known as Stará hora, about 3 km from the village. You can see the Starý potok wine area, a street of about thirty wine cellars right behind Sudoměřice. The amphitheatre and chapel of St. Urbana from 1997 is in the area. The local specialty is the wine Frašták, refreshing wine made from Balkan variety Kadarka white. The functionalist tipple on the Baťa canal also belongs among the local attractions. The technical building, in the typical Baťa style from 1939, was used to transport lignite coal from railway

cars to the river boats that took them to the plant in Otrokovice. The tipple serves as an observation tower, with the possibility of an interior tour with expert commentary, today. A marina with boat rentals and refreshments is in the vicinity.

(P) VRACOV – smaller farmers devoted to viticulture in Vracov in the past, and because of a lack of resources for own cellars, the tradition of common cellars was born. They served several families. For example, in the oldest cellar street in local part Baráky were 20 cellars where 600 winemakers farmed in 1926. Because of this amount it was important to organize everything well and vracovské cellars have always been a "second city hall" – it was even possible to solve the problems that everyone argued about at



the town hall here. We can call cellars number 14 and 15, in the middle of colony, Parliament. One of its parts is the 70 m long Senate, one of the longest cellars in Baráky. | www.mestovracov.cz

MORAVSKÁ NOVÁ VES – typical wine cellar village, with carefully maintained streets and approximately 170 wine cellars. The Rosé wine tasting in May, Open cellars day and the St. Jakub feast in July, harvesting of grapes with a parade of the variety Cabernet Moravia in September, young wine show in November and Wine blessing in December belong among the traditional events.

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wine will make my journey pleasant

MIROSLAV MALINA

Academic painter Miroslav Malina is considered as one of our best contemporary painters. This graduate of the Academy of Fine Arts returned



to his native town after graduating. He portrays his mental world by characteristic and unique combinations of lines and colours in the paintings. Malina's pieces, set on the border between painting and sculpture, enchant by their playfulness. He devoted himself to illustrating in the 90s, but his interest also expanded to the work of stage designer, and the result is a collaboration with the Slovácké theatre. He presents his works at

many author's exhibitions. His images have wandered within collective exhibitions to France or the United Arab Emirates. His work is owned by galleries in Uherské Hradiště and Hodonín, and also the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic.

When did you realize that you wanted to pursue painting in life? Did your surroundings support you in it?

As a child I scribbled what was in the range of my hands, particularly albums, as my parents say. Now seriously. After the preparatory year at the AVU in Prague. My whole family supported me, especially parents. Soon my wife and father-in-law joined. Well, then also the surrounding area.

What would you like to achieve in your life?

To be at the right time in the right place. Every day, as I live, is something to achieve. For example, pay off the mortgage.

Your life is associated with Uherské Hradiště. How do you evaluate the change over time? What would you compliment and what would you like to change?

The change in time would take place, even if I could not influence it. And because I live in it, I have frequent and uncritical views of what is happening in my town. But I have many friends who go to Hradiště and I have to say they are excited about the city.

Is the wine country where you live reflected in your work?

I do not consider myself a landscape painter, but I had an opportunity to attend a symposium where landscape literally swallows you. For example Brittany or the Alps. And then again you are in Slovácko and you carry the soil with you.

Do you like to sit with friends with a glass of wine? Which do you like most?

I love to. Already because the opportunities are fewer and fewer. If they are, I can enjoy them. My wines are white - I'm not an expert, but I think I recognize which wine is delicious. I love all Pinots, Traminer and from red, Sevar got me.

With which opportunities do you connect the drinking of good wine?

It's not just a vernissage, symposium or friendly meetings. Wine is in my case also a bonus to look forward to in my successes, even failures. Wine is my companion in my work.

How do you see the connection of your birthplace with wine? What does it mean for you personally?

At secondary school we often discussed over a cup of wine in the Mařatice wine cellars, particularly in the cellar U Andělů. Wine mediated meetings of many interesting people for me. When we were drinking it was almost always something positive there.

What is your biggest source of inspiration?

It offers itself, but it is not wine. In my case, it's imagination or creativity if you want. Wine often will make the journey to discovery and affirmation of what I want to say by the image pleasant

Do you have a motto by which you seek to live? What would you say to the readers of this interview?

I would certainly have found some, but I'm not much for it. Yet people at Slovácko are patient and hardworking – two truths, without which even a painter cannot make images.

What place do you think a visitor of Slovácko should not forget? Where would you take a visit to see the beauty and magic of Slovácko?

Beautiful places on Slovácko are many. Wine cellars in Mařatice, Chřiby Mountains. I would take a visit to Buchlovice. We could start in the beautiful park of Buchlovice castle, where we would visit the castle wine cellar and buy a bottle. With it we would follow the trail to Buchlov castle. Here we will drink the wine, and then we do not have no other choice than to quickly return to the castle cellar. And of course, in a large park to enjoy a unique French style garden – or perhaps an English park?

WINE BLATEL

Blatnice pod Svatým Antonínkem is a picturesque Slovácko village. According to legend, Prince Svatopluk drank local wine and according to surviving records it was transported to Prague and Vienna in the 13th century. A quality Burgundy variety is plentifully grown here today and perhaps because of that the local vineyards are called Burgundy of Moravia.



A considerable part of the vineyard, 189 ha of the total 284 ha in Blatnice, is managed by the company Wine Blatel, founded in 1990. Among the varieties are Riesling, Müller Thurgau, Moravian Muscat, Pinot Blanc and Chardonnay. The company is the largest domestic grower of Merlot. The wines of this variety are often awarded at prestigious exhibitions.

You can taste this wine, for example, during the May event Putování po blatnických búdách (Wandering

amidst Blatnice's wine cellars) or Day of open cellars, when in Blatnice pod Svatým Antonínkem annually approximately 30 cellars are open. Wine Blatel is also involved in summer travel around Blatnice open wine cellars. At least one cellar is open in the Stará hora area of wine cellars, approximately from mid-June to mid-September, every Friday evening and Saturday and Sunday afternoons. You will find the winemakers schedule on the information board in the village or on www.vinariblatnice.cz.

KOSÍK – WINERY FROM TVRDONICE

A day without wine is like a day without sunshine – they certainly cannot complain about the lack of it in Tvrdonice. The wine village is the centre of an area called Podluží and is a few miles from Břeclav, on the sunny plains of the Morava River.



The history of the winery began a hundred years ago when great-grandfather Kosík founded his 1st vine-yards in Dolní Bojanovice. Grandfather Kosík continued the family tradition in Mikulčice and then Cyril Kosík, father of the present owner, even in Tvrdonice. Originally a small operation, it has gradually grown into the present form. The total area of vineyards now reaches 17 ha, the company processes up to 100 tons of grapes per year and produces 80,000 litres of quality and quality predicate wines. The harvest is processed with modern technology in a newly

built plant. Also a guesthouse is part of the winery. Wines from the winery Kosík have won numerous medals at national and international exhibitions and are regularly included in the Wine Salon of the Czech Republic. Wines from Kosík family recently got 7 medals at the Slovak exhibition Víno Bojnice 2013, 3 medals at the international exhibition of Central European wines Vinoforum 2013 in Pardubice, plus a selection of Pinot Noir grapes became a champion of rosé wines at Gallery of Pinot Wine in Kyjov.

TOURIST DESTINATIONS IN SLOVÁCKO

Bata Canal – unique canal on the Morava River from Kroměříž to Hodonín. Sightseeing boat trips, boat hire, regular boat transport.

Buchlov and Buchlovice – Early Gothic castle on the crest of the Chriby Mountains, in the town below is the Baroque chateau in the style of Italian villa with a large garden.

The White Carpathians – Protected Landscape Area and UNESCO biosphere reserve. The highest peak of South Moravia – Velká Javořina (970 m), cycling and hiking routes, nature trails.

Petrov - Plže - picturesque complex of wine cellars at the edge of Petrov village, in 1983 declared to be the first rural preservation zone in the Czech Republic.

Mikulčice - National cultural memorial, a large settlement from the times of Great Moravian Empire and one of the possible seats of the dukes with archaeological exposition and a sightseeing tour.

Nechory - picturesque village of wine cellars with a square and several streets near the wine-growing village of Prušánky.

Milotice – Baroque chateau complex with French park and pheasantry. Found west of the village is the wine cellar colony Šidleny.

Strážnice – open-air-museum of south-eastern Moravia, chateau with park and exposition of folk music instruments, former Jewish ghetto with a ritual spa, synagogue and cemetery.

Velehrad – significant pilgrimage place, alleged seat of the first Great Moravian archbishop St. Methodius. Uherské Hradiště – historic centre with several churches, permanent exhibition in the Slovácko Museum dedicated to the traditional culture in Slovácko. In Maratice quarter a complex of imposing burgess cellars with vineyards.

MILOTICE

One of the most beautiful Baroque chateaux in the Czech Republic with a riding school, horse stables and two orangeries is surrounded by the French park and pheasantry with several small structures.
