### COOLING-OFF PERIOD

Pursuant to BSP Circular No. 857, the TRUSTOR (individual participants) shall have the right to cancel their initial subscriptions or contributions, without penalty, upon written notice to the Trustee within two (2) banking days immediately following the signing of agreement or contract evidencing their participation in the Fund. Further, the net amount of payment or delivery due the TRUSTOR shall be based on the transaction day's NAVPU when notice of redemption, termination or cancellation was received.

### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund intends to achieve for its participants income from a portfolio of preferred shares listed at the Philippine Stock Exchange (PSE) and peso-denominated fixed income securities.

The Fund may invest between 5% and 20% of its total assets in preferred shares.

The Fund's composite benchmark is composed of 40% Markit iBoxx ALBI Philippines 1-5, 40% BPI Philippine Corporate Bond Index and 20% average rate of the most recent 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill auction, net of taxes.

### UNIT PAYING FEATURE MECHANICS

<b>Eligibility for Unit Income Distribution</b>	All registered participants with outstanding investment in the Fund as of one (1) Banking Day (ex-date) prior to scheduled date of distribution shall be entitled to receive their pro-rata share of income through units.
<b>Unit Distribution Frequency</b>	Eligible participants shall receive unit income on a quarterly basis every third Monday of February, May, August and November of the year.
<b>Basis of Units to be Paid-out</b>	The units to be distributed to all eligible participants shall be based on one hundred percent of the collected effective income of the Fund from interest and cash dividends within the three month period, less applicable taxes, fees and expenses. There is no guaranteed income amount for distribution.
<b>Unit Distribution Settlement</b>	Units received by the participant shall be automatically redeemed on distribution date and credited to the participant's settlement account one banking day after distribution date.

### CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process is performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are encouraged to update the resulting profile every three (3) years or if there's any change in his/her personal/financial circumstances. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, or seek an independent/professional opinion when necessary.

### The METRO UNIT PAYING FUND is suitable only for investors who:

- Have a Moderate profile.
- Want income to be distributed on a quarterly basis, and capital appreciation over time by investing in a portfolio of fixed income instruments and preferred shares listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange.
- Recommended investment horizon is at least five (5) years
- Participation in the Fund shall be open to Filipino individuals, resident and non-resident aliens and corporate accounts.

### KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

<b>Interest Rate Risk:</b>	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
<b>Market/Price Risk:</b>	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market prices of bonds and stocks/equities. It refers to the portfolio's exposure to marked-to-market valuation due to market price fluctuations of the bonds and stocks/equities.

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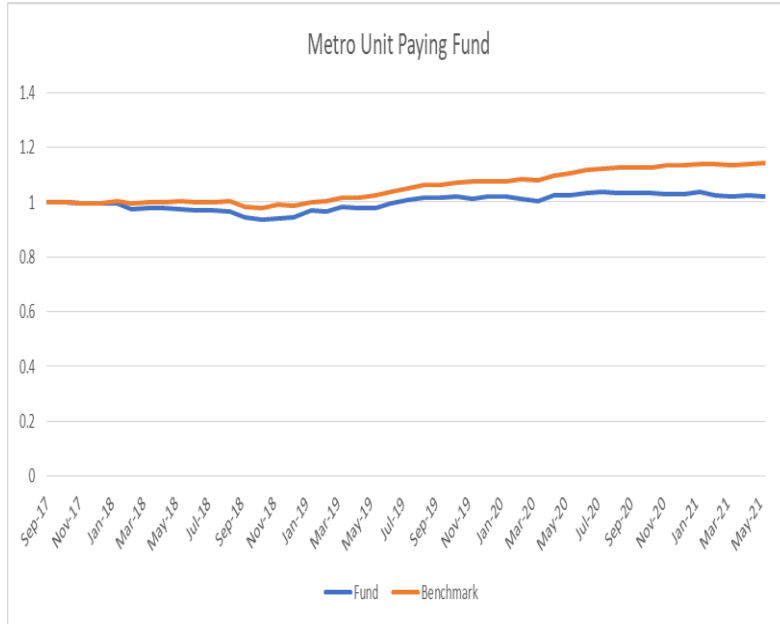

For the meantime, an equivalent benchmark namely, the BPI Philippine Government Bond 1-5 Year Index is being used until a new benchmark is identified.

The Philippine Special Savings Rate General Average (net of taxes) has been discontinued effective 31 Dec 2019; The Fund used, the last available value of PSAVAVE (from January 2020 to September 22, 2020) and the average rate of the most recent 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill auction, net of taxes (from September 23, 2020 until October 20, 2020).

- Repurchase Agreements (Repos)
- Government Securities
- Corporate Bonds
- Other money market instruments that are traded in an organized exchange
- Preferred shares listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange
- Other investments allowed under BSP regulations

## OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

For its second income distribution for the year, the fund paid out 0.89% in May, higher than February's 0.82%. These sums up to 1.70% total payout for the year so far and about 3.77% over the last 12 months.

Local government bond yields in the short to intermediate part of the curve outperformed as it pulled lower by 15-30 bps while the longer dated bonds edged higher by 5-10 bps. Strong liquidity and softer inflation expectations have raised the demand for bonds. Strong demand is seen Treasury bond auctions as both the 5Y and 7Y bond auctions are more than twice to three times oversubscribed. The 5Y auction, re-issuance of FXTN 05-77, was awarded at an average yield of 3.295% slightly lower than last month's print of 3.375% and opened its tap facility to issue additional Php 10 Bn. The 7Y auction, re-issuance of FXTN 07-64, was awarded at an average yield of 3.678% compared to previous month's print of 3.529%. The Bureau of Treasury plans to borrow Php 215 Bn in June, higher than Php 170 Bn plan in May, and stretched its tenor across 5, 7, 10, and 20 years thus influencing higher trajectory of yields in the near term. National debt tally in April was at all-time high of Php 10.99 Trn, 27.8% increase registered in the same month last year. Higher budget deficit ratio is seen for 2021 at 9.4% from 8.9% and 7.7% from 7.3% previously for 2022.

As anticipated, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas kept policy rates unchanged at 2% continuously supporting the economy in its combat against the pandemic. BSP Governor Diokno signaled that they still have enough armory in their toolkit should further easing is needed. Despite this, March bank lending remained weak at -4.3% YoY vs. -2.3% YoY previously. 1Q GDP contracted by 4.2% YoY, sharper than market predictions of 3.2% contraction as risk aversion and movement restrictions continue to delay recovery. NCR and its neighboring provinces have shifted to a less strict "General Community Quarantine with heightened restriction as COVID-19 cases eased. S&P Global Ratings, a major international credit rating agency, affirmed its Philippine credit rating of BBB+, two notches higher than junk status, with a stable outlook.

May inflation registered at 4.5% YoY, well-within the government's forecast of 4%-4.8%, in line with analyst expectations and flat from previous month. Inflation remains elevated led by alcoholic beverages and transport prices, on rising global oil levels, while food prices have abated on temporary reduction of tariffs on pork and rice imports. Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas reduced their inflation estimate for 2021 from 4.2% to 3.9% and raised predictions for 2022 from 2.8% to 3% - keeping it within the important 2%-4% target range.
