INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Investor Fund is a USD-denominated equity Unit Investment Trust Fund structured as a feeder fund and aims to provide market returns from a representative portfolio of stocks that comprise the US Equity Market by investing at least 90% of its assets in the iSHARES CORE S&P 500 ETF. The Fund's benchmark is the S&P 500 TR 4 JAN 1988 (SPTR Index).

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process is performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are encouraged to update the resulting profile every three (3) years or if there's any change in his/her personal/financial circumstances. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, or seek an independent/professional opinion when necessary.

Market/Price Risk: The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market prices of stocks/equities. It refers to the portfolio's exposure to marked-to-market valuation due to market price fluctuations of the stocks/equities.

Liquidity Risk:



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INVESTMENT POLICY

- A. The Fund may be invested and reinvested in the following instruments:
- USD-denominated units/shares in collective investment schemes subject to the conditions under BSP Circular 767
- USD-denominated deposits
- Other traded money market instruments
- Other USD-denominated Investments allowed under BSP regulations

B. The Investor Fund may invest a minimum of 90% of its fund in the Target Fund and a maximum of 10% in cash, deposits and other money market instruments. The investment of the Investor Fund in any Target Fund shall not exceed 10% of the Total Net Asset Value of the Target Fund.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Global markets remains resilient amid Covid-19 Delta variant posing risk to growth outlook as vaccinations continue to be effective in preventing critical complications among patients; with some countries already announcing booster programs to support further re-opening of their economies. Even though peak rate of growth have passed, August economic data still indicates expansion which allowed global equities to post positive returns. Furthermore, late month rally for the equity markets was boosted by Federal Reserve Chair Powell's comments during the annual Jackson Hole Symposium; his dovish tone and emphasis on cautiousness about scaling back monetary support was well received by the market.

US equity market continued its upward trend; reaching new highs during the month mainly attributable to improving labor market and notable corporate earnings. Moreover, Senate's passage of the bipartisan infrastructure bill which includes a USD 550 Billion investment in physical infrastructure over five years provided the needed optimism amid declining consumer confidence. The labor market added 943k jobs in July, higher than both the initial market estimate and prior month's print; unemployment rate dropped to a pandemic low of 5.4% coming from previous month's figure of 5.9%. Growth stocks outperformed value stocks as inflation moderated; US inflation rose by 5.4% year-on-year in line with both market expectation and prior month's print. However, slower increase of 0.5% was seen month-on-month due to lower prices of used cars and apparel. Core inflation which excludes food and energy prices rose by 4.3% year-on-year (vs 4.5% prior month) and 0.3% month-on-month (vs 0.9% prior month).

The target fund grew by 3.03% month-on-month; technology sector leading the way with positive economic outlook fueled investor preference for growth stocks; Paycom Software Inc which develops and designs software solutions reported robust 2Q earnings expanding by 57% year-on-year on the account of cross-selling products among existing users and additions of new clientele. Financial sector also recorded strong gains as earnings of major banks return to pre-pandemic levels. Energy sector lagged for the month weighed down by prospects of additional OPEC+ supply and potential damages brought by Hurricane Ida.
