# FOCUS OF LEARNING

Please ONLY sign up for an appointment if your child is in their pre-school year. EVERY pre-school child in this age category must have a review appointment at this stage of their development. Sign up sheets will be on the Parents Notice board from Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February.

If you cannot find an appointment time to suit you a member of the health visiting team will be in touch with you directly to arrange a home visit.
