

A. Highlights At-a-Glance

During the past 6 months, we have made significant progress in furthering our more established objectives while making headway in others.

Please find below some of the key highlights and memorable speaking points for this interim period:

- Officially opened the Cambrian Spiritual Centre, a multi-faith space on campus
- Received approval to launch three-year BBA first college in Ontario to do so
- Received referral to Postsecondary Education Quality Assessment Board for the Applied Psychology Degree, the next step toward adding our 4th degree at Cambrian
- Opened the **newly renovated Fireside Lounge** in the Student Life Centre
- Secured \$350,000 in industry investment for BEV lab
- Achieved a total of \$2.5M in private philanthropic giving, the highest total in Cambrian history
- Received an Industrial Research Chair grant from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation to support Dr. Nadia Mykytczuk's groundbreaking research in biomining. Valued at \$750,000, this five-year grant from NOHFC will be matched by industry partners that include Vale, Glencore, Teck Resources, and Bac-Tech Environmental.

- Received funding through nursing expansion program to increase support for simulation
