

Paolo Vineis

Professor Paolo Vineis is one of the leading researchers in the fields of molecular epidemiology and non-communicable diseases. He is Chair of Environmental Epidemiology at Imperial College London (UK) and a member of the prestigious Accademia dei Lincei. Previously, he headed the Unit of Molecular Epidemiology at the Italian Institute for Genomic Medicine (IIGM) in Turin.

His research focuses on the impact of environmental changes, such as air pollution and climate change on human health. Professor Vineis has made major contributions to molecular epidemiology, particularly through the use of omics technologies to measure and understand molecular changes in biological samples.

Beyond research, Professor Vineis is also active in science policy. Since 2019, he has served as Vice President of the Consiglio Superiore di Sanità (Italian National Health Council) and is a member of the Cancer Prevention Europe initiative. He is also Scientific Director of the Regenerative Society Foundation, which brings together companies and banks to test circular economy models and develop evaluation tools.
