

RHINOPLASTY

Rhinoplasty, otherwise known as a nose job, is a surgical procedure in which a patient's nose is reshaped. The reshaping may be performed for necessary medical reasons to correct breathing issues, or merely to improve the overall appearance of the nose for aesthetic purposes. A rhinoplasty procedure will differ according to each patient's specific situation.

WHAT CAN A RHINOPLASTY CORRECT

- An overly large or disproportionate nose
- A nose that is too wide
- A bump on the bridge of the nose
- A large, bulbous, upturned, or drooping nasal tip
- Excessively flared nostrils
- A crooked or off-center nose
- Asymmetry due to a previous injury
- Breathing problems



TYPES OF RHINOPLASTY

REVISION RHINOPLASTY

Revision rhinoplasty is about restoring form and function to correct aesthetic and functional complications from one or more prior rhinoplasties, or to correct less than ideal results from previous nasal surgery.

ETHNIC RHINOPLASTY

Ethnic rhinoplasty is a surgical procedure that is performed to correct what you dislike about your nose, while preserving its cultural characteristics. Because noses look different from background to background (including Asian, African-American, Middle Eastern, Latino, etc.), factors such as skin thickness, bone density, nostril size and placement, and nasal bridge length must be considered when performing this highly customized surgery.

TEENAGE RHINOPLASTY

By surgically altering the nose structure to ensure optimal facial balance, proportionality, and symmetry, a teenage rhinoplasty can empower younger patients to sail through these turbulent years without feeling self-conscious of their nose.

FUNCTIONAL RHINOPLASTY/SEPTOPLASTY

Functional rhinoplasty, also known as a septorhinoplasty, corrects abnormalities that obstruct nasal breathing. By correcting these problems, functional rhinoplasty helps patients breathe much more easily, thereby enhancing quality of life. These issues can be due to a birth defect, a deformity that has developed, an injury that has occurred, or trauma to the nose. Symptoms may include:

- Impaired breathing
- Nasal congestion
- Reduced sense of smell
- Dry mouth
- Nasal drip
- Chronic sinus infections
- Sinus pressure headaches
- Severe nosebleeds



Your Rhinoplasty procedure is performed on an outpatient basis at our state-of-the-art, AAAASF certified surgical facility. Depending on how complex the surgery is, Dr. Mentz will take an open or closed approach to a Rhinoplasty.

The open approach is considered to be a more invasive surgery that is better suited to those with larger noses, as well as to those with severely asymmetrical or crooked nasal bridges and nasal tips. During this procedure, an incision is made across the narrow strip of tissue that is between the nostrils. This allows perfect visualization of the nasal tip cartilage for contouring.

The closed approach, on the other hand, is better suited to patient's with smaller, more symmetrical noses; typically "closed" rhinoplasties reshape the tip of the nose, shorten the nose's length, and shave down the dorsal humps. Unlike open, the closed technique hides incisions within the nostrils.

Through the incisions, Dr. Mentz will re-shape the bone and cartilage in order to resculpt the appearance of the nose. He may alter the position of bones to make it look narrower or straighter, or he may build up some areas by using bone or cartilage from the nose or other areas of the body. The skin and tissues are then reshaped over the new nasal structure.

The closed technique leaves no scars at all, while the open technique does leave a scar, but is virtually undetectable.

Dr. Mentz can improve and refine the shape and proportion of the nose to provide a better balance between facial features. Whether you're bothered by a bump, drooping nasal tip, or the shape and size of your nostrils, Dr. Mentz provides the best Rhinoplasty in Houston and has extensive training and experience to deliver a more harmonious aesthetic form to the nose through a rhinoplasty.

RHINOPLASTY RECOVERY AND WHAT TO EXPECT

Rhinoplasty recovery is a gradual process. It could take up to a year before your final results are fully evident.

Swelling and bruising can be substantial and take a considerable amount of time to resolve. Your nose will continue undergoing changes for months as it settles into its new shape.

Throughout the healing process we utilize minor in office treatments such as steroid injections to help decrease swelling and to speed up or enhance recovery. Dr. Mentz and Nadia, his PA, will assess your recovery on an ongoing basis during follow-up appointments. These appointments are essential to monitor your healing progress and ensure you are taking all appropriate steps toward a healthy recovery and a beautiful result.

5-7 DAYS POST-OP

Nasal splint and blue stitches near nostrils are removed.

Clear dissolvable stitches remain inside the nose that become less bothersome around 5-8 weeks post-op

1-3 WEEKS

Potentially large amounts of bruising, swelling and asymmetry. Begin taping the tip nightly to help reduce swelling. Use Afrin and Flonase proactively.

3 WEEKS

Light exercise can be resumed

6 WEEKS

Rigorous/high impact exercise can be resumed

5-6 MONTHS

Patients begin to see minimal swelling and what the final results will look like and continue up to 1 year.


















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



























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






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












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
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
























RHINOPLASTY FAQ



Q: Is a rhinoplasty painful?

A: You will be given anesthesia to make you more comfortable during the procedure. The surgery itself does not involve pain. After the procedure you may experience some discomfort in the initial stages of healing. Your symptoms can typically be moderated with pain medication which is typically not needed for long.

Q: At what age can I receive a rhinoplasty?

A: In order to undergo a rhinoplasty, the nose must be finished with its growth. This typically happens at around 15 or 16 for girls and around 17 or 18 for boys. Teen clients must have parental consent, as well as a clear understanding of the procedure and its risks and a willingness to follow the doctor's instructions before and after surgery.

Q: What other procedures can be combined with a rhinoplasty?

A: In some cases, Dr. Mentz may also recommend a chin implant to further enhance the facial profile and harmony between facial features. A chin implant corrects the appearance of a weak chin to give the chin a stronger, more defined contour.

Q: What can I expect on the day of surgery?

A: Rhinoplasty is performed under general anesthesia. After the procedure, Dr. Mentz will put a small splint on your nose. He almost never uses nasal packing or internal nasal splints. If you wear glasses, they should be taped up and away from the nose to avoid putting pressure on the surgical site. You will spend an hour or so recovering from

anesthesia before discharged to go home. You will need someone to drive you due to residual effects of anesthesia.

Q: Are there any dietary restrictions after a rhinoplasty?

A: Right after your cosmetic surgery, we recommend that you start with a liquid diet only. The next day, you may begin a soft food diet consisting of mashed potatoes, applesauce, steam-cooked vegetables, etc. You must avoid foods that require excessive upper lip movement.

Q: What are the possible risks of a rhinoplasty?

A: Complications arising from a rhinoplasty are rare and, when they do occur, are usually minor. These may include infection, nosebleed, or a reaction to the anesthesia. Some patients may experience recurring nosebleeds or numbness in or around the nose. Small asymmetries can occur when repairing crooked noses and have the highest rate of revision. In general, a rhinoplasty is considered a very safe surgical procedure.

Q: My nose feels numb after a rhinoplasty. How long does it take to go away?

A: After you have a rhinoplasty, it is not uncommon to have some numbness at the tip and under the nose. This is due to cutting some small nerves in this area and happens whenever you cut through the skin. In almost all cases, this will resolve itself between six to eight months after your rhinoplasty, but it can take up to a year in some cases.


