Subject: SEAPA 2025-2027 Annual Transmission Line Maintenance Contract

A Request for Proposals for SEAPA's 2025-2027 Annual Transmission Line Maintenance Project was advertised on September 12, 2024. Three (3) bids were received on October 11, 2024 as follows:

Bidder	City/State	Bid Amount
Northern Powerline Constructors, Inc.	Anchorage, Alaska	\$1,373,709.94
Sturgeon Electric Company, Inc.	Anchorage, Alaska	\$1,752,555.00
Electric Power Constructors, Inc.	Anchorage, Alaska	\$1,909,060.00

A review was conducted and each proposal was evaluated based on experience with Alaska generally and Southeast Alaska in particular in carrying out similar projects, contractor's warranty period, appropriateness of the proposed general approach to the work, capacity to respond to the required work in a timely and efficient manner, competitive pricing, completeness and quality of bid documents, and service level response time.

Based on the review of bids and summary of evaluation scores, staff recommends award of the 2025-2027 Annual Transmission Line Maintenance Contract to Sturgeon Electric Company, Inc. Staff will be available for discussion during the board meeting. Funding for the contract will be requested in the respective FY2025-FY2027 operating budgets.

I move to authorize staff to enter into a Contract with Sturgeon Electric Company, Inc. for SEAPA's 2025-2027 Annual Transmission Line Maintenance Contract for the lump-sum bid of \$1,752,555, plus a 10% contingency for supplemental or emergency work of \$175,255 for the total not-to-exceed value of \$1,927,810.

Subject: FERC Relicensing Services Contract for Swan Lake

A Request for Proposals (RFP) for Federal Regulatory Commission (FERC) Relicensing Services at Swan Lake was issued on September 6, 2024 with proposals due October 10, 2024. The current 50-year FERC license for SEAPA's Swan Lake Hydroelectric Project expires June 30, 2030. SEAPA's effort to seek a new license will involve navigating regulations and requests from multiple federal agencies, consulting with state, federal and tribal agencies, and obtaining environmental clearances in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

Given the number and diversity of stakeholders and their interests and the complexities associated with FERC relicensing, accurately estimating the full scope of the 5-year project in advance was not possible. Relicensing is very much a journey that requires expertise, vision, and flexibility. Therefore, the RFP carefully requested detailed project approach and successful relevant experience of the firm and subconsultants, in the performance of similar projects with an emphasis on projects in Alaska. To evaluate cost without a defined scope, proposers were required to submit a detailed Rate Schedule that included costs for labor, equipment, administrative expenses, overhead, and other costs.

One (1) proposal was received on October 10, 2024 from Kleinschmidt Associates, Inc. of Redmond, Washington. Kleinschmidt has completed studies and compliance activities on more than 50 relicensing projects in the last 10 years and is well acquainted with SEAPA's projects and service areas. Kleinschmidt continues to perform well for SEAPA. Staff recommends award of the contract to Kleinschmidt Associates, Inc.

If awarded the contract, Kleinschmidt will start upon contract execution and will continue until the license is reissued, which depending on regulatory review could be later than the June 30, 2030 license expiration. Since this is a multi-year effort the RFP provided for respondents to provide their rate schedule which includes pricing through 2025 with annual step increases thereafter, until completion of the contract.¹

¹ **Fiscal Note**: The overall budget estimate for the FERC Relicensing Swan Lake project (RR23384) is currently \$3,017,000, of which \$674,000 was budgeted for FY2024.
