














HIS Modal is of amountly distinctive interest, being the first, and almost only one, assurded for a galfant action performed, not in actual workers : the month, in the printed diploma, " For comptement hencers in the presence of the correst, baring been struck out, and the following substituted, " For comptement particle under correst stance of great danger"

The elecumstances of the case were as follows ---Daring the Femine troubles in Canada, it became necessary to forward a large supply of ammunidim--including aj barrols of garspowders--Brom Quebec to Lake Erie, ander such precations that only some of the highest Railway Orficials were awate of the nature of the consignment. This was placed in charge of T. O'Hea, and three other packed men of the Rife Reigades--and the trucks were statched to a passengue train, conveying some 800 German immigrants sensitivat.

On the oth June, 1866, as the train drew into a by-station-Durwille, not far from Quebec-O'Hes motiond that one of the tracks was on fire, and gave the alarm, telling the contents of the trucks, and calling for assistance, in the Queen's name. According to his statement, the Railway Officials, and a company of infantry, which was drawn up in the station-yard-as well as his three comrades - withdress he a sale distance. O'Hen, having found a bucket, and a short ladder, and water not far off, mounted the burning track, 10 times. single-handed, and entirely without assistance, and successful in entinguishing the firs, a task which occupied him almost an hour, while his comprehen. and the others, nore shouting to how to conce hack.
