


Thank you for considering the Art Gallery of New South Wales for your special day, and congratulations on your engagement!



Naala Nura, south building

Weddings at the Art Gallery's Naala Nura are very special occasions. The dramatic façade of the building, with its Corinthian columns, was completed in 1909 and remains a stunning backdrop for wedding photography. You will have access to our Victorian-era Grand Courts for photographs from 5.15pm prior to the reception.

We can provide the services of our wonderful art guides to take your guests on an arrival tour of our 20th-century galleries and talk to them about some of the key works that have come to shape the Art Gallery's collection. The restaurant and adjoining function room are used for ceremonies and receptions, or receptions only. The restaurant can accommodate up to 116 guests seated or, combined with the function room, can hold up to 200 guests (cocktail-style).



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Art Gallery Restaurant and Function room

The Art Gallery Restaurant has a warm, inviting feel with floor-to-ceiling windows and gorgeous views over East Sydney. The existing furniture is used for receptions and minimal additional styling is required to create an inviting space for guests to enjoy.


Event menus developed by Matt Moran, and delivered by our exclusive catering partner, The Fresh Collective, paired with the stunning location, set the restaurant apart as a space to host your wedding. The adjoining function room is used for the ceremony and pre-drinks and, with its hardwood flooring, is ideal for dancing the night away with friends and family following dinner in the restaurant.

Capacities:

- 116 ceremony
- 116 seated, using existing furniture
- 200 cocktail-style with dancefloor

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Naala Badu, north building

The Art Gallery's Naala Badu has been designed by Pritzker Prize-winning architects, SANAA, with Architectus as executive architect. You will have access to spectacular art, architecture and landscaped outdoor areas for your wedding photography and guided tours of our collection for your guests on arrival.

MOD Dining can accommodate up to 120 guests for a cocktail-style reception. The Meers Hall can accommodate up to 220 guests seated or up to 350 guests cocktail-style. All capacities include space for a dancefloor.







The Meers Hall is the most flexible space in Naala Badu. The hall features timber flooring and floor-to-ceiling windows with views out to the sculpture garden and to the adjacent sculpture gallery and atrium.

The space is suitable for a wide variety of event set-ups and comes with a range of state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment. It is suitable for banquet dinners for up to 220 guests, with space for a dancefloor.

Capacities:

- 350 cocktail-style with dancefloor
- 220 banquet with dancefloor
- 180 on long tables with dancefloor (hiring fee applicable for long tables)




MOD Dining

This light-filled space with its impressive curved roof has views to Woolloomooloo Bay, Sydney Harbour and East Sydney. MOD Dining can accommodate up to 120 guests for a cocktail style reception, with space for a dancefloor.

This space connects seamlessly to the Harbour terrace, providing even more event planning options.

Capacities:

 120 cocktail-style with dancefloor (dancefloor hire is an additional charge)

The spectacular sculpture gallery and adjoining double-height atrium is at the heart of the Art Gallery's Naala Badu. The space features a changing selection of sculptural works and is perfectly located to take in the incredible architectural features of the building.

The gallery can be used for pre-dinner drinks, before a reception in the Meers Hall. It also allows access to the beautifully landscaped sculpture garden.

Capacities:

• 220 cocktail-style before dinner in Meers Hall



Harbour terrace

Overlooking Woolloomooloo Bay, this outdoor space is an iconic destination for entertaining and art experiences in Sydney.


Access to the terrace is included with cocktail receptions in MOD Dining.


Note: Amplified sound is not possible on outdoor terraces. Wet-weather option for drinks is available. Terrace closes at 10pm. Additional catering charges may apply for the use of this space.

Capacities:

120 cocktail-style

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Viewing terrace

With views out to Woolloomooloo Bay, the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney and the Sydney CBD skyline, this outdoor space is a perfect warm-weather option for arrival drinks. Accessible from the Entrance Pavilion, it is the most elevated of the three terraces in our north building, now known as Naala Badu. This spacious area features a small glass canopy for weather and sun protection, casual seating and landscaping.

Note: Amplified sound is not possible on outdoor terraces. Wet-weather option for drinks is available. Terraces close at 10pm. Additional catering charges may apply for the use of this space.

Your questions answered

Can the ceremony or reception start earlier than 6pm?

The Art Gallery closes to the public at 5pm so, to allow us time to set up, we commence ceremonies and receptions from 6pm.

What time do receptions normally finish?

Receptions run for five hours from either 6pm or 6.30pm. If you would like to extend the reception until midnight, please speak to the events team. Additional security charges would apply for extensions.

Can we organise our own suppliers?

Yes, you are welcome to organise your own suppliers or the events team would be delighted to provide a list of suppliers who have worked with the Art Gallery before. <u>Case studies</u> on the Art Gallery website also have details of suppliers who have been recommended by our previous wedding clients.

Are there any styling limitations?

As we are an art gallery, we do need to approve any theming or styling elements in advance of the reception. There are some limitations such as LED candles only, no balloons or confetti canons. Please speak to the events team if you have any questions about styling or theming.

What time can our suppliers arrive on the day?

The Art Gallery events team will liaise with your suppliers in the lead up to organise bump in/out timings and delivery instructions, and answer any questions they may have. They can arrive from 4pm on the day with soundchecks taking place from 5pm for bands or DJs.

Can we organise our own catering?

We have an exclusive agreement with our caterer; and they would be delighted to work with you to tailor a package to suit your requirements. You are welcome to organise your own wedding cake and BYO beverages. Our catering team can discuss cakeage and corkage with you.

Could you please provide example timings?

4pm: Bump in (3pm in Meers Hall)

5.15pm: Wedding party arrival for photographs


5.30pm: Guided tour for early arrival guests

6-6.30pm: Ceremony

6.30-11.30pm: Reception (6pm start available

if ceremony takes place in a different location)

12am: Bump out


