## Lecture summary

Learn about the exploits of Māori hero Hōne Heke through the work of Arthur David McCormick, an Irishman who visited Aotearoa New Zealand briefly and may have been sympathetic to Heke's actions against British rule. On three occasions in 1844, Heke cut down the British flagpole in Kororāreka as a part of a wider rebellion. He became a symbol of Māori identity and sovereignty, and McCormick's 1908 work became an iconic New Zealand image.
