Modern art, modern love

Robert and Sonia Delaunay

Lecture summary

From 1910, when they married in Paris, until 1941, the year of Robert's untimely death, the Delaunays were devoted both to each other and to creating a new visual language based on their theories of light and colour. Simultanism was the name they gave to the coloured rhythms through which they sought to capture the energy of modern life, working their way towards abstraction. Having spent the First World War safe in Spain and Portugal, they faced a difficult return to Paris in 1921. Keen to reclaim their place in the city's artistic circles and bring their art into everyday life, they moved beyond the canvas and experimented with a wide range of media, including clothing, theatre design, furniture, film, and architecture.
