Students are responsible for supplying their own cedar bark and must have weaving experience prior to this class.

Students will learn basic twining and other techniques foundational to cedar bark weaving. This class counts toward a Certificate of Merit in Weaving and is a prerequisite for all upper level weaving classes.

Dorica Jackson is recognized for her high level of mastery and the intricacy and precision of her work. She has been weaving and teaching to help regrow this art form since a time when few carried knowledge of Chilkat weaving. Students will learn the basics of Chilkat weaving and complete a small Chilkat square. This class counts toward a Certificate of Merit in Weaving.

Students experience hands-on techniques and gain knowledge of traditional art and culture of our area's First peoples. Open to students grades 6th-12th.

SPRING BREAK YOUTH REGALIA: TUNICS

Regalia creates a strong continuum through history and tradition, and resonates with the past in its design. Janice Jackson will teach how to create a wool tunic, develop and plan the appliqued design, and adorn the tunic with buttons and beadwork. Open to students grades 6th-12th.

This class will introduce students to three-dimensional formline design, design transfer basics, and the tools and techniques of Northwest Coast carving. This class counts toward a Certificate of Merit in Carving and is a prerequisite for all upper level carving classes.

Kandi McGilton is a weaving student of master weavers, Delores and Holly Churchill, focusing on the endangered Annette Island style of Tsimshian basketry. In this class students will focus on the unique and subtle intricacies of plaiting. Students are responsible for supplying their own red cedar bark. This class counts toward a Certificate of Merit in Weaving.

INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCE CARVING: FRONTLETS

The Northwest Coast frontlet was traditionally worn by high ranking individuals for ceremonial occasions. The frontlet features the owner's house or clan crest carved in high relief, and is traditionally part of an elaborate headdress. Renowned Tlingit carver Tommy Joseph will guide students through the steps of this challenging project from design, to basic form, and finishing details. This class counts toward a Certificate of Merit in Carving.

CHILKAT-STYLE FORMLINE DESIGN (VIRTUAL / IN-PERSON)

Heritage Center since 1979, teaching classes in carving, engraving, design, history, as well as the Island Carvers Canoe workshop. Students will study formline design created specifically for Chilkat weaving. This class can be taken virtually or in-person, and count toward a Certificate of Merit.

CEDAR BARK HARVESTING

Debbie McLavey will teach students the process of gathering and preparing cedar bark for weaving, and safe and sustainable harvesting practices for current and future generations. Students will be in the field learning to identify trees, gather cedar bark, and treat and process raw materials to prepare cedar bark for weaving. Students must have weaving experience. This class is a requirement for a Certificate of Merit in Weaving.

DEVIL'S CLUB GATHERING & PROCESSING

Merle Hawkins will teach students the importance of Devil's club and the process of gathering and processing the plant. Students will be in the field learning to identify and harvest, then return to the classroom to process the wood for use in such projects as jewelry and the bark for its medicinal properties.
