More than 40 species of bats that eat insects live on Luzon. A few species live in houses and other buildings, but most mosquitoes in a night, and others eat beetles and moths that are major pests of crops. Many live only in forest, and are part of the web of life in natural habitat. Most are highly beneficial to humans, and only rarely carry disease or cause problems. The species shown here are representatives of all the families and most of the genera that live on Luzon, but only half of the species are shown. All are shown at several times their actual size.



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
