Keolis conceives and deploys efficient, low-carbon mobility solutions for the benefit of each community

France

Keolis reinforced its footprint in France in 2024 through a series of new contract wins or renewals. These achievements underline its status as a trusted partner to public transport authorities and its commitment to low carbon and universally accessible mobility.

Keolis reinforces its presence in Île-de-France

Keolis bolsters is position as an unavoidable operator in the region with the award by lle-de-France Mobilités of metro line 18, its third line to date following the previously awarded lines 16 and 17. Another milestone for Keolis in the Paris region: the Group becomes the first third party operator of bus routes in the 'first ring' of the Paris suburbs by winning a contract for 42 lines in the Marne et Brie area.

Keolis wins contract to manage buses and trolleybuses in Greater Lyon area

The Lyon metropolitan authority awarded Keolis a sixyear contract renewal for the operation of its network of 136 bus routes including eight trolleybus lines. Keolis Bus Lyon, which becomes a mission-driven company, has signed up to supporting SYTRAL Mobilités in achieving its societal, social and environmental goals. The firm aims to cut its greenhouse gas emissions by 27% over the period. To encourage inter-modality and green mobility, adaptations will be made to certain routes to allow bikes on board.



Northern Europe

New strategic contracts illustrate the trust shown by public transport authorities who rely on Keolis's low carbon expertise to support the energy transition of their public transport networks.

Keolis renews its contracts and deploys its largest electric bus fleet in the Netherlands

Established in the Netherlands since 1999, Keolis has reinforced its foothold with the award of another 10-year contract by the Province of Utrecht for the continued operation and maintenance of its Utrecht bus network. It includes the deployment of more than 250 electric buses, the largest e-vehicle fleet operated by Keolis in the Netherlands.

Keolis adds to its positions in Denmark with the acquisition of Anchersen A/S

Keolis consolidates its position as a major urban and regional transport player in Denmark with the acquisition of Anchersen A/S, a local passenger transport company. The Group takes over its contracts, welcomes 600 new employees and expands its fleet with 130 vehicles, more than half of which run on electricity. With its operations in the country dating back to 2000, Keolis now employs more than 1,500 people and runs 450 buses.

United Kingdom

With a presence in the UK hailing back to 1997, Keolis is a major and trusted transport operator.

KeolisAmey retained as operator of Docklands Light Railway automatic metro in London

Transport for London has reappointed KeolisAmey to operate and maintain the Docklands Light Railway (DLR) automatic metro in London. Already the longstanding operator of the network since December 2014, the joint venture between the Keolis Group (60%) and the British group Amey (40%) will continue to run this key segment of London's transport system for a further eight years, beginning on 1 April 2025.



Manchester: Keolis to continue operating the country's largest network through to 2027

Keolis Amey Metrolink has earned a three-year extension to its Metrolink tram network contract, first awarded in 2017 by Transport for Greater Manchester.

The contract for the largest tram network in the UK, which comprises seven lines and more than 100 km of track, will thus run until 2027. Peace of mind and safety on board will be the focus of particular attention with the increased presence of security officers on the network and the signing of a partnership with the Greater Manchester Police Force.

Middle East/Asia/Africa

Keolis continues to develop in Asia, Africa and the Middle East. The Group caters to the mobility needs of fast-growing megacities through a combination of expertise and innovation.

Record service resumption on Dubai metro

Keolis MHI, which since 2021 has been operating Dubai's tram network and its metro, which is the world's largest automatic network, displayed its know-how and responsiveness to unprecedented flooding that hit the city in April 2024. Following this extreme rainfall, four stations and a tunnel were submerged, putting 50% of the network out of order. In only three weeks, service was able to resume thanks to the mobilisation of teams and international experts from Keolis, and the deployment of innovative solutions.

Keolis breaks new ground in its development in China

Keolis has taken another step forward in its development in China with the May 2024 launch of the Dujiangyan tramway in Sichuan province, in the southwest of the country. Following two years of infrastructure construction and rolling stock manufacture supervised by Shanghai Keolis, the first line, which calls at well-known tourist sites, was opened to the public. The contract was awarded in May 2022 and is the Group's second operations contract outside of Shanghai.

Australia

Keolis has been operating and maintaining bus, tram and rail networks in Australia for 15 years, carrying millions of passengers every year. In 2024, Keolis Downer renewed several contracts with PTAs in South Australia. Western Australia and Queensland.

Renewal and extension of several contracts in Australia

The Australian Department of Infrastructure and Transport renewed its confidence in the Keolis Downer joint venture by renewing or extending three of its regional bus and coach services. Keolis Downer received a 9-year contract running to 2029 in Murray Bridge, while the Hornibrook and Kalamunda bus contracts were extended to 2028 and 2029 respectively.

North America

A leading transportation player in North America, Keolis is expanding its presence in Canada. It has gained a foothold on the Canadian rail market as a member of the consortium selected to build and operate the first high speed line in the country.

Keolis grows in Canada

Already an established bus and coach operator since 2002, notably in Montreal, Quebec City and Ottawa, Keolis has just doubled in size in the country with the acquisition of two west-Canadian established commercial divisions of Pacific Western Transportation. With 550 buses and coaches, the Transit and Motorcoach divisions run urban transport services in 23 municipalities in Alberta and British Columbia, and intercity services in the same provinces and Ontario.

As part of the Cadence consortium alongside CDPQ Infra, AtkinsRéalis, SYSTRA, SNCF Voyageurs and Air Canada, Keolis will also be a contributor to the largest rail project in Canada: the Alto high-speed railway, which will cut journey times between Quebec City and Toronto from five hours to three. Keolis will harness its public transport operator expertise and customer experience know-how for the benefit of a project that is set to reshape the future of long-distance travel.

Renewal of a bus contract

Present in the US since 2010, Keolis has signed a new five-year bus operation and maintenance contact in Victor Valley (California). The network, which has 34 routes including four intercity, carries approximately 1.7 million passengers per year. Keolis operates around 1,200 buses in the US, nearly 300 of which in the state of California.
