The challenges of urban planting

The majority of Life Terra's planting events take place in rural areas, but sometimes we attempt to restore nature within more densely populated areas too. For this type of plantings, a series of challenges can arise, due to the presence of visitors who can accidentally hurt the young trees.


What is a Miyawaki forest?

As mentioned above in this newsletter, planting in urban areas can present several challenges and urban forests require much maintenance. A way to make urban forests more resilient is to implement the Miyawaki method, which forces the trees to grow quickly, which in turn helps the forest sustain itself in its growth without much external help. Miyawaki forests can also turn unused lots of land into a new green area for your city. Learn more about what Miyawaki forests are in this video.
