Adyen and Life Terra planting 5,000 trees around the continent

The Netherlands, Spain, the UK and Germany welcomed brand new trees in the recent weeks. As part of their volunteering initiative, Adyen adopted 5,000 trees, giving their employees the chance to plant them together. The first 1,400 were put in the ground by the Adyen Dutch team in the Klarenbeek estate, while their Spanish colleagues planted 175 in Quijorna. As for the UK team, they planted +200 trees in a regenerative farm in the heart of the Cotswolds on the National Trust's Sherborne Park Estate and finally the Berlin Team completed Adyen's initiative planting more than 500 tree saplings and shrubs in the South of the city. 
