The summer of 2023 has been one of the harshest for Mediterranean countries, with severe heatwaves and forest fires inflicting damage to humans and natural habitats.

In Greece, more than 172,630 hectares, about 1% of Greek land, were burnt, including unique habitats and protected areas of great importance.

Our Greek beneficiary, Centre for Research & Technology Hellas (CERTH), shared with us the situation of one of the most important National Parks in Greece, the forest of Dadia, which was severely burnt this summer.
