Recent Project Activities

18 Million trees in Europe reached!

At Life Terra we are proud to continue seeing an increase in the number of new trees geolocalised in Europe. Thanks to the support of our planting partners, landowners, and other organisations across Europe, we have now reached the impressive number of over 18,000,000 trees registered on the Life Terra platform!

Together, our impact is stronger! We will continue working to have an even larger one.



New implementation countries: Austria & Switzerland

April marked the start of Life Terra's participation in the reforestation efforts of 2 new countries, Austria and Switzerland.

Together with Lavera Naturkosmetik, we indeed planted trees for the first time in these 2 alpine countries: in both cases, young primary school students were taught the importance of nature preservation and restoration by getting their hands dirty on the field. To support us, we were lucky to be able to count on the help of Wald4Leben (in Austria) and of There for Trees (in Switzerland).

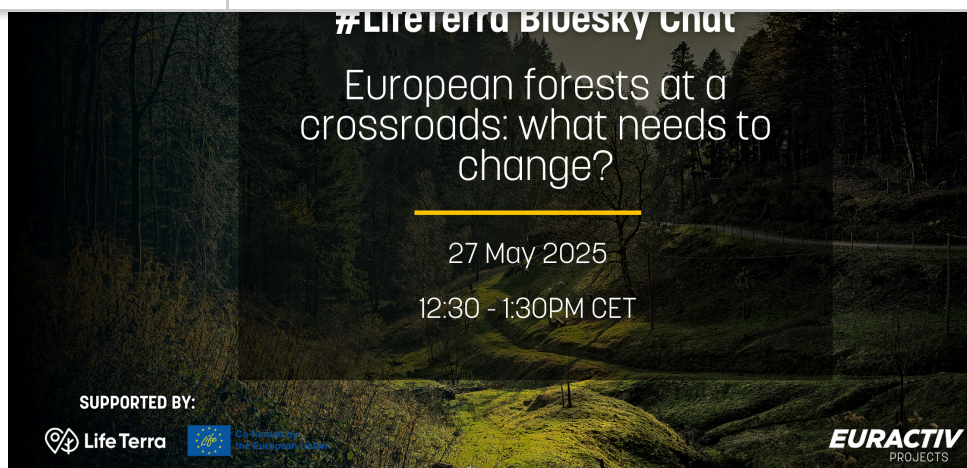
