12:00 pm **Lunch provided – lunch discussion- Decision making**  
1:30 pm BC Tour. Terrain intro tour- recognizing avalanche terrain, weather impacts, field obs of impacts, route finding Beacon drill  
3:30 pm Back in bounds.

### Day 2 – Route finding, companion rescue and decision-making in the BC

8:30 am Meet guides on the mountainside of the Tram dock, next to the RPK3 Restaurant deck.  
8:45 am Discuss avalanche hazard forecast, recent avalanche events, and weather forecast. ID concerns for the day  
9:30 am – BC tour- beacon rescue, route-finding, decision-making discussion (biases?), companion rescue  
12:00 pm **Lunch provided**  
1:00 pm BC Tour 3 + 4- continue practice  
3:30 pm Back in bounds.
