Staff to have completed the relevant section in the staff training manual.  Staff to always bring enough water to put out campfire when required.  Allow the wood to burn completely into ash which won't be able to hold any internal heat.  Drench fire with water. ... Use a shovel or stick to stir the ashes around and leave the stick in the fire.	Safety brief required at all times for every new group participating.	1x2 = 2
