

CHINESE NEW YEAR, SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA: CINEMA ALLEY, 4A Centre for Contemporary Asian Art's (4A) annual street cinema returns this summer. CINEMA ALLEY brings the best in contemporary video artwork from around Australia and Asia to the streets of Chinatown, Sydney on Friday 3 February 2012 from 8pm.

Cinema Alley ushers in the Chinese New Year with a celebration of significant video art from around the Asia Pacific region including China, Thailand and Vietnam, and further afield from Iraq and Iran. It is presented as part of City of Sydney's 2012 Chinese New Year Festival.

Aaron Seeto, Director of 4A says, "Cinema Alley has introduced new audiences to contemporary Asian art and engages with Sydney's diverse audiences all in celebration of contemporary Asian culture. Cinema Alley sparks further discussion and interest in the Asia-Pacific region. This year's line up includes some of the most significant video art practitioners, from Apitchatpong Weeresathukul, whose work won a Palme d'Or at Cannes, to Miao Xiaochun's 3D digital animation. It also includes a number of Australian practitioners, Peter Alwast and Nasim Nasr."

The event has a 600-seat capacity and as in previous years is expected to sell out quickly. Cinema Alley brings together Sydney's communities, and contemporary video art expression in an exciting open air cinema on Parker St, in the heart of Chinatown. This year the theme of *Double Vision* includes a lineup of two-channel (two screen) and single-channel video which create a layering of images and sound in a unique visual experience. The moving image will be experienced in renewed ways, both thought provoking and generating different experiences from conventional cinema.

Sydney laneway bar, Grasshopper and Kirin beer have teamed up to support the event offering guests food and drink at the Cinema Alley Bar at 7pm prior to the 8pm screening.

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The Last Judgement in Cyberspace (2006) introduces new points of perspective in Michaelangelo's famous fresco in 3D digital animation form.

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












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



小巷电影院是一场免费的公众活动, 但须提前预约。

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












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
