VIENNA PARREÑO FEARS OF A JADED DESCENT

During an artist residency at Beijing's Red Gate Gallery, Vienna Parreño chanced upon a history of Chinese emperors who constructed their tombs out of jade and gold thread. It was believed that this would prevent their corpses from decaying. Fears of a Jaded Descent plays on the literal and metaphorical meanings behind this ritual. Parreño has constructed an installation out of large red paintbrushes suspended from the ceiling – stopping a few breathtaking inches above the floor.
