Virtual Technology
The work of Juliana Wong

Gallery 4A is pleased to present the work of Canberra-based artist Juliana Wong. Her ambitious installation comprising hundreds of LED lights form a complex web of lights within the gallery space. The constant flickering of these tiny red lights combine to form arbitrary patterns and words. This work resembles a technologically responsive painting.

Wong's installations using interactive technology are an attempt to present the intangible. In an untitled work last year she constructed a room that interacted with the audience, speaking to each viewer as they entered a darkened room. the voice taunted each viewer saying that they should not go any further into the room.

Juliana Wong was born in Hong Kong in 1974. She is a recent graduate from the Canberra School of Art and has held exhibitions in Chicago and Canberra.

This is the second in a series of three exhibitions which explore current installation practices in Australian art. Titled "Signs and Wonders", this project also includes work by Suzann Victor and Regina Walter.
