Australian Art to Japan

An exhibition of new work by four leading Australian artists is to be presented at the Australian Embassy in Tokyo in December. **Bright and Shining** includes paintings by established artists Lindy Lee and Tim Johnson, and emerging artists Victoria Lobregat and Natsuho Takita.

Bright and Shining is part of a new program designed to introduce contemporary art within the Australian Embassy. The exhibition by Gallery 4A was selected from nearly twenty proposals by a panel of prominent Japanese art critics and curators.

A forum will also be organised to co-incide with the opening of the exhibition. Participants include Australia's Melissa Chiu, curator of Gallery 4A and Japanese curators and critics.

Melissa Chiu, curator of Bright and Shining commented,

"This is a wonderful opportunity for Australian artists. To show their work with the support of the Australian Embassy means a lot also for the presentation of a vibrant Australian culture."

Yukiko Shikata, curator at Canon Artlab and one of the selection panelists stated: "Gallery 4A represents a departure from the traditional style of art gallery - it's activities are not limited to simply the exhibition of artwork: it serves as an exciting communication space."

Gallery 4A is an initiative of the Asian Australian Artists Association inc. a non-profit organisation established four years ago to promote the work of younger Asian and Australian artists
