Indians & Cowboys artists

Jitish Kallat (b. 1974) is an emerging Indian artist currently based in Bombay with a strong international profile. He has held four solo exhibitions in India and one in New York. He has also been included in over 25 International group exhibitions including the Fukuoka Asian Art Triennial, Japan (1999) Havana Biennial, Cuba (2000), *Century City* at the Tate Modern, London (2001).

Gigi Scaria (b. 1973) is an emerging Indian artist based in Delhi. This will be his first International exhibition and project. He has held over ten solo and group exhibitions in India, in 2001 he was a member of the organising committee and participant in Khoj International Artists Workshop.

Fiona Foley (b.1964) is of the Badtjala language group. She is a major Australian artist, recognised nationally and internationally, through a variety of prestigious exhibitions, public sculptures, and awards. He has held over 15 solo exhibition in New Zealand, Australia and the USA, including an exhibition at the Andy Warhol Museum, USA. Other important international group exhibitions include, Noumea Biennial (2000), Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles (2000), Frankfurter Kunstverein, Germany (1995). He has been the subject of many reviews and articles in International art journals

Ronnie van Hout (b 1962) is a multi media artist based in Melbourne. He has exhibited internationally in Germany, New Zealand, The Netherlands and also in New York at the prestigious PS1 International Studio program. In 2001 he held a solo exhibition at the Art Gallery of New South Wales.
