

# **Medication Information**

# **PRIOR TO SURGERY:**

Please review and follow the medication information below. This list of medications is put together according to the hospital guidelines and has been reviewed by Dr. Srinivasa.

## **ALL PATIENTS**

- If you are taking IBUPROFEN Please stop 1 week prior to surgery.
- If you are taking OZEMPIC Please stop taking 2 weeks prior to surgery.
- Additional medications to <u>stop taking 2 weeks prior to surgery</u> are: TRULICITY,
   BYDUREON BCISE, BYETTA, VICTOZA, SAXENDA, ADLYXIN, & RYBELSUS.

## In addition:

#### **FLAP PATIENTS**

 If you are taking TAMOXIFEN or LETROZOLE - Please stop taking 2 weeks prior to surgery.

#### **IMPLANT PATIENTS**

- You will be prescribed MUPIROCIN OINTMENT. You are to apply the ointment (using a
  q-tip) inside your nostrils twice a day for 3 days prior to surgery.
  - Why? This is because a lot of us have MRSA. Applying this ointment helps minimize that and decrease risk of infection.

## **AFTER SURGERY:**

## INPATIENT PROCEDURES

 Your medication is prescribed by your doctor at the time of your discharge from the hospital.

## **OUTPATIENT PROCEDURES**

• Your medication will be called into your pharmacy prior to your surgery.

## **IMPLANT & FAT GRAFTING PATIENTS**

You will also be prescribed antibiotics. Please start the first dose after dinner.

#### PAIN MEDICATION

Pain medication will be sent in electronically by Dr. Srinivasa as they are controlled. Please review the information provided below:

- Use the prescribed narcotic pain medication as directed on the bottle.
  - If the pain is not severe, you should take plain Tylenol or Motrin instead (if not contraindicated by other medical conditions).
- If you were prescribed Norco (Hydrocodone-Acetaminophen) or Percocet (Oxycodone Acetaminophen), make sure to monitor the total amount of Acetaminophen (Tylenol) within a 24 hour period.
  - DO NOT exceed a total of 4000 mg of Acetaminophen (Tylenol) in 24 hours, this will cause damage to your liver health. <u>Each tablet of Norco and Percocet</u> includes 325mg of Acetaminophen (Tylenol).
- It is normal to feel slightly more pain and stiffness on the 2nd or 3rd day after surgery, but after this point, your pain should continue to improve each day.
- Taper off the narcotic pain medication as the pain decreases typically starting on the 4<sup>th</sup> day after surgery
- If a muscle relaxant was prescribed, use this intermittently between pain medication doses to help with tightness and muscle spasm.

#### OTHER MEDICATIONS

- Stool Softener
  - If you experience constipation as a common side effect of taking narcotic pain medication, try over-the-counter stool softeners such as Colace, Miralax, or Dulcolax at your preferred local drugstore.

# **IMPORTANT INFORMATION:**

Please call the office at (818) 336-1295 if you have any of the following symptoms:

- Fever higher than 101°F
- Sudden and rapid swelling at the surgical site
- Bleeding you believe to be excessive
- Persistent nausea/vomiting or inability to keep fluids down
- Pain not controlled by prescribed medications
- A foul odor or increasing redness/swelling/drainage at your incisions
