

Targeted and Guided Services for Beginning Principals 2024

Evaluation Associates Te Huinga Kākākura Mātauranga are contracted to provide support for beginning principals. The service we are providing has two key features, targeted support and guided support. Please find below an outline of the key components of the service for your information.

Targeted Support

The targeted service is provided through individual principal advisor support. You will be assigned to a principal advisor who you will be in regular communication with. They will provide your scheduled targeted support and be available to respond to your queries.

The advisor will provide you as a beginning principal with personalised, contextualised and responsive support that is intended to build your confidence and capability as a principal. Our principal advisors are all experienced principals who will help you to understand the role of a principal, your particular school context and system level requirements in Aotearoa New Zealand, in order to be able to lead your school effectively.

You can expect to be supported in areas such as:

- Building your knowledge, understanding and practice in your principal's role
- Bringing effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- Identifying and accessing relevant opportunities in the guided supports and selfdirected resources (as they are developed for the Ministry)
- Engaging in learning conversations with a trusted principal advisor who will listen, advise, coach and challenge as appropriate
- Connecting to networks of colleagues and further support within the system and wider sector
- Engaging with key leadership resources that reflect leadership within Aotearoa New Zealand
- Developing and actioning personal professional learning goals

Service Delivery: Guided

The guided services are facilitated by the regional team of principal advisors in conjunction with other experts as appropriate. These are collaborative learning opportunities with other beginning principals either face to face or virtual. Your assigned principal advisor will support you to identify, prioritise and access the guided opportunities outlined below.

Face to Face				
Communities of Practice (CoP)	Local groups of up to 10 beginning principals from across the sector. Meet for up to four hours a term as determined by group e.g. 2 hrs X 2 or one 4 hr meeting. It may be fully face to face or partly virtual. A local principal advisor will facilitate the group meetings. They are an opportunity to build relationships and collaborate around local shared areas of interest or need as agreed by the group.			
Regional Biannual Hui	Each beginning principal will be able to attend two full day regional hui in the year, one in late May and another in the September/Oct break. These will be regional hui based on the 12 Ministry regional groupings, with some cross-regional meetings such as Secondary. There will be three offerings each time to choose from: year 1 & 2, year 3 and secondary. The hui will be facilitated by local principal advisors. The hui will include opportunities to broaden peer connections regionally, deepen understanding of essential elements of principalship and create strong regional connections with the Te Mahau team and other support agencies.

Virtual workshops	You will be able to attend six different virtual workshops over 2024 in regional groups. These will be offered in terms 2, 3 and 4. The content will be focused on the operational aspects of your principal role and where appropriate will be aligned with the time of year. Each workshop will be 1 ½ hours. The first workshops topics and timing for term 2 will be shared in term 1. These will be facilitated by regional principal advisors who may have experts leading session as appropriate from Te Mahau, ERO, NZSTA etc.			
Virtual Interest/sector groups	Each term we will offer up to three opportunities in each region to join a virtual session focused on particular interest or sector groups. The groups will be determined in conjunction with regional Te Mahau staff. Term 1 groups: U1/2, Tumuaki Māori, Pacific Principals
