'I must go over the ground again', wrote the British author Edmund Blunden in his memoirs. To understand the Great War, you have to stand in the **landscape** where it took place. In this program several tools are used so youngsters will be able 'to read' the former battlefields:

- The drawings of the British cartoonist Dave Chisholm.
- (Dave worked for 25 years as a cartoonist for 'The Sunday Times' and 'The Daily Telegraph')
- **Tablets** with areal pictures of the First World War, used during the guided walk.
- Visit to the restored Yorkshire Trench & Dugout.
 (the only British trench in the Ypres Salient preserved in its original location with concrete sandbags and duckboards).
- Personal stories and testimonies of the men who were there (and still are).
