

Fraxel Laser Pre & Post-Care Instructions

Pre and Post Care Instructions

- Avoid for the first 24 hours: all make-up and sunscreen.
- Avoid direct exposure to the sun for 2 weeks. If sun exposure is expected, Apply an SPF 40 or higher beginning 24 hours post-treatment. Sunblock helps to prevent pigmentation changes until the lesion is healed. Sunblock helps to prevent pigmentation changes until the lesion is healed.
- Avoid self-tanners.
- Stop the following treatments ONE WEEK prior to procedure: Retinol, Retin-A, Glycolic Acid.
- If you have ever been treated for Herpes Simplex Virus, notify your provider. Your provider may prescribe a medication you will need to take one day prior to treatment.
- Follow the pre-treatment regimen recommended by your provider.
- Avoid strenuous exercise, spa, and sauna for 7 days post treatment.

General Skin Care and Precautions Following Treatment

- Cleanse the area twice daily with gentle cleanser and gently pat dry. Do not rub with a towel or washcloth as the area is extremely delicate while the bruising /red discoloration (purpura) is present.
- Follow the post-treatment regimen recommended by your provider including moisturizers.
- Do not rub, scratch, or pick at the treated area.
- Any discomfort you may have immediately following treatment can be relieved with acetaminophen (Tylenol).
- After the red discoloration disappears, hyperpigmentation (brown coloring) or hypopigmentation (white) may be present for up to 3-5 months. This is rare but if it occurs, use a broad-spectrum UVA/UVB sunblock SPF 40 or greater on the area until the normal color returns.
