- ATTENTION SCHOOLS: Prior to entry registration, schools must request a login name and password from The Fair's Competitive Exhibits office. School passwords used last year are still valid and can be used again. Click here: School Password for a request form to fax or email.
- Go to thefair.com, click GET INVOLVED and then ENTER A COMPETITION. Look for Creative Kids.
   ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION button will be available beginning June 1.

 At TOP RIGHT of screen, click <u>Sign In</u> and choose your Type:

for *Individuals* choose <u>Exhibitor</u> for *School Classes* choose <u>School</u> for *Other Groups* (Homeschool, 4-H) choose <u>Quick Group</u>

**Exhibitors:** Register using your First Name and Last Name and create a password (write your password down or make sure it is something you will remember for future use.) Fill in requested information. When entering a school name, choose INDIVIDUAL. Click Continue. Click Create Entries.

**Schools:** Choose your school name from the drop down list and enter your school's password (\*see above.) Fill in requested information. Click Continue. Click Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries (use School's password when adding individual exhibitors.)

**Quick Groups** (Homeschool, 4-H, etc.): Register using your Group Name and create a password (write your password down or make sure it is something you will remember for future use). Fill in requested information. Click Continue. Click Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries.

- · For each entry item:
  - Select a <u>Department</u> (ex: <u>Creative Kids Art</u>)
  - Select a <u>Division</u> (ex: <u>Painting Div. 100</u>)
  - Select a <u>Class</u> (ex: <u>Class 1000 Tempera Ages 6</u> through 10)
  - *IMPORTANT:* Fill in the <u>Description</u>, in detail, for the item you are entering (ex: Red and green tulips not just tulips).
- When you have completed entering all your items, click Continue and follow the instructions. There is no entry fee; click Check Out to continue past Review of Cart screen.
- Fill in "yes" at the statement to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Premium List and click Submit.
- At the end of the entry process and your cart is confirmed, you will be prompted to print out your receipt and upload your images, videos or PDF's. Continue by following the instructions.

### CREATIVE KIDS INFORMATION

Creative Kids offers an opportunity for children ages 6 – 15 years old to exhibit their creativity and skills..

#### **RULES**

- Entries need to be completed online and required images, videos or PDF's be uploaded by 10 pm (PST), Friday, June 26, 2020. Print a copy of your online entry summary/receipt. There is no entry fee.
- 2. This is a **virtual show ONLY**. Mail-in entries will not be accepted.
- 3. Exhibitors must be at least 6-years-old and have not had their 16th birthday, i.e. ages 6 15 years old.
- 4. All entries must be the handwork of the exhibitor. They must have been finished within the past two years. No article may be entered a second year.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to ONE ENTRY PER CLASS; i.e., one watercolor and one oil painting. All items will be placed in the most suitable division and class by Fair personnel.
- All entries will be judged from uploaded images, videos or PDF's, only. Please ensure your uploaded submissions are the best possible quality. Each uploaded items must not exceed 8MB.
- 7. **Group Projects** must be registered under a group name (ie. Mrs. K's class, Dynamic Duo, etc.). Participant's names can be listed in the description field at the time of entry.
- 8. Judges are selected from professionals or highly accredited amateur artists working within their field of expertise. All judges decisions are final.
- 9. Entries will be judged and displayed virtually.
- 10. The Fair reserves the right to reject any work it finds objectionable.

#### **AWARDS**

All items will be judged using the Danish System. This means each item is judged against a standard - not against other entries. Each entry is evaluated and given a placing; first (blue), second (red) or third (white). More than one first, second or third may be awarded per class. No premium money will be awarded. Each Creative Kids Department having at least three exhibitors will have a Grand Champion rosette awarded to the most outstanding entry of that department. In Departments that have more than one division, a Best In Category ribbon will be awarded. There must be at least two blue ribbons in that division to be awarded a Best In Category.

- Word choices and Sentence fluency

- Conventions grammar, punctuation, spelling, etc.

#### Haiku:

- Three-line verse with 5-7-5 syllable line count.
- Haiku may reflect insight or sensitivity to nature or natural phenomena.
