SHEEP SHOW RULES

- 1. An exhibitor must enter a minimum of three (3) sheep in one breed to have their entry accepted. Entry fees must be paid at the time you submit your online entries (\$6.00 per head). ANY CHANGE IN ENTRIES MUST BE MADE WITH THE SUPERINTENDENT OR SHOW STAFF BEFORE THE DAY OF SHOWING. SUBSTITUTIONS MAY BE MADE ONLY WITHIN THE SAME BREED AND CLASS. Entry fees will not be refunded unless superintendent is presented with a veterinary certificate stating health reason for cancellation.
- 2. All out-of-state sheep and goats are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, with a statement saying they are free of clinical signs of sore mouth, foot rot and caseous lymphadenitis, and all rams over six months of age require an entry permit number. All sheep must have official Scrapie Identification.

All animals must meet Fair health requirements. Fair veterinary personnel will examine all entries and exhibition animals to insure freedom from ectoparasites and symptoms of contagious or infectious diseases before animals are penned. **Blankets/Covers on sheep must be removed for veterinary inspection.**

Exhibitors must submit vet check-in slip to the Superintendent or designee of their livestock department in order to proceed to livestock barn. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Please see the link for the veterinary regulations for out-of-state **exhibitors** in the front of this book.

3. Animals are to be delivered to assigned pens 7am - 12pm on Wednesday, Sept. 20, 2023. Any late arrivals must be cleared with the superintendent, or space will be forfeited at 12pm. Please call the Fair's Competitive Exhibits Office, 253-841-5074 if you will be late or will be scratching your entry. Due to space constraints, penning will be very full for 2023. There will be a waiting list managed by the superintendent.

PLEASE...Check your registration papers with the superintendent or staff AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER YOUR SHEEP ARE STABLED.

- 4. <u>All animals must remain in barns until their designated</u> <u>release time as set by The Fair and department</u> <u>superintendents.</u> Failure to do so could result in forfeiture of premium money and, potentially, the privilege to show at future livestock shows.
- Sheep must be removed from pens after 10pm on Sunday, Sept. 24, 2023 or by 12pm, Monday, Sept. 25, 2023. Any arrangements made by exhibitors for sale or delivery of animals must be transacted off the grounds, and sheep cannot be left in pens for pick up.



6. Straw for bedding and hay will be provided by The Fair. First straw will be in the barn. The hay and straw storage shed will not be open to exhibitors.

NOTE: <u>The superintendent recommends exhibitors bring</u> <u>first night's feed with them</u>. Hay and straw bales shall not be used for purposes other than feed and bedding.

- 7. Exhibitors will receive four one-day gate passes for each five head entered.
- 8. SHEEP MAY NOT BE BLANKETED BETWEEN 9AM AND 10PM, EXCEPT BEFORE THEY ARE SHOWN.
- 9. All sheep and goats (including lambs and kids over 60 days) must be registered by the appropriate association and have ownership recorded in the name of the exhibitor no less than 30 days before show date. All entries, if required by the breed association, must have the ear tag of the breed association in ear. Sheep must have an ear tag or tattoo matching at least one number on their registration papers
- 10. Animals must be entered and shown in the name of the registered owner.
- 11. There will be a limit of two premiums in the individual classes, and one premium in the group classes, per exhibitor. An exhibitor is defined as any individual or farm or partnership in whose name the sheep is registered.
- 12. The base date for birth dates shall be Sept. 1. Animals must show appropriate lamb or yearling teeth. If there is a doubt of the age of any animal, the judge will decide age by examining the teeth of that animal.
- 13. LAMBS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO FALL AND SPRING DIVISIONS, EXCEPT WHERE NOTED (i.e. Specials). DATES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

For the following breeds:

Columbia - Corriedale - Dorset - Shropshire Hampshire - Rambouillet - Suffolk - Southdown Horned Dorset - Merino - Romeldale - Natural Color B (fine) - Katahdin

Fall Lambs: Sept. 1 - December 31 Spring Lambs: January 1 - August 31 All other breeds are:

> Fall Lambs: Sept. 1 - January 31 Spring Lambs: February 1 - August 31

An individual exhibitor may enter a total of eight sheep per breed, whatever sex or age; lamb or yearling.

 All sheep and goats entered in young flock, get-of-sire, or pair lots must also be entered in an individual lot. Get-of-Sire and Young Flock must be bred and owned by the exhibitor. One "BEST PAIR" entry per exhibitor, per breed.

- Any breed with only one exhibitor will automatically go into Division 716 "OTHER WOOL BREEDS" or Division 731 "OTHER MEAT BREEDS". PLEASE CHECK POSTED SHOW SCHEDULE TO CONFIRM WHEN 'OTHER' BREEDS ARE TO BE SHOWN.
- 16. PLEASE NOTE: NCWGA has Class Divisions A & B. Animals for group classes may not be interchanged between divisions A and B to create a Best Pair, Young Flock, Flock, etc. They must be shown in the division in which the individual animal was entered.
- 17. All sheep and goats should be clean and well fitted. Animals should be fit in accordance with individual registry association rules. Animals not in show-worthy condition will not be allowed in the barn.
- 18 All judges' decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories as seem proper to the judge.
- 19. Winners of "Young Flock" must show in the competition for the Washington State Cup. When showing in all other breeds, each breed is expected to show in the Washington State Cup event.
- 20. Open class exhibitors must make their own arrangements for accommodations.
- 21. Animals may not be walked on or off the grounds because of serious environmental concerns directly related to animal waste. Any animal (except horses) that cannot be transported in a solid bottom carrier must be removed in a truck, trailer, or similar conveyance.
- 22. Eating in the barns vs. E. coli O157:H7 Exhibitor Cooperation Needed. Again this year our barns will not only have signage reminding Fair guests to "Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area", but also "Please refrain from eating in livestock areas".

The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in most areas of the barns.

SHEEP SHOW ADDITIONAL AWARDS

"THE WASHINGTON STATE FAIR CUP"

The perpetual trophy, along with a keepsake plaque, will be awarded to the exhibitors who show the best wool breed young flock and the best meat breed young flock at The Washington State Fair. The Washington State Fair Cup event will be held at 5pm Saturday, Sept. 23, 2023.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD

A premier exhibitor award will be given in breeds with at least two exhibitors entered in their division, with at least 12 head total for the breed. The winner will be determined by the amount of prize money accumulated by the exhibitor's six highest placings in individual classes in the division.

SHEPHERD'S AWARD

In order to reinforce pride in the quality of the open sheep exhibit, The Fair offers an appropriate award to the exhibitor in the sheep barn who is judged by Fair staff, using the following guidelines, to best promote the sheep industry.

SPECIFIC POINTS FOR JUDGING THE SHEPHERD'S AWARD:

- Courtesy to the public and to Fair management
- Cooperation with other exhibitors
- Neat appearance of attendants
- Sheep kept properly fitted
- Sheep fed and watered regularly
- Pens kept clean and dry
- Aisles kept clean and open
- Educational value of exhibit
- Feed and equipment stowed neatly
- Promptness in show ring

EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY AWARD

This award promotes the wool and sheep industry to the public. To present an attractive display, as well as to educate the public and promote the sheep and wool industry, premiums will be awarded to exhibitors. Only Washington State Fair ribbons, rosettes and awards should be displayed. Displays will be judged on the following criteria:

General Appearance:

appeal, neatness and total picture presented

Creativity:

use of color, material and ingenuity of presentation

Educational:

display should tell a story about breeds, wool or commodities produced or used in home or commercial settings

Exhibitor:

communication with the public

Suggestions:

- Pictures and posters that promote the sheep and wool industry.
- An interactive table top display
- Incorporate the Washington State Fair theme for the year.

Microns 24.9-17.7, Fine and Half: Rambouillet, Merino, etc., 60s–80s

Microns 27.8-24.9, Three Eighths: Columbia, Corriedale, etc., 56s–58s

Microns 30.9-27.8, Quarter: Most of the down (meat) breeds, 50s-54s

Microns 34.3-31, Low Quarter: Romney, Border Leicester, etc., 46s–48s

Microns 40-34.4, Common and Braid: Cotswold and Lincoln, 44s and Coarser

FLEECE SHOW RULES

- Fleeces must be delivered between 11am 6pm to Barn M on Wednesday, Sept. 20, 2023. Attendant will give exhibitor an entry tag for each class. THESE MUST BE REVIEWED AND COMPLETED BEFORE THE FLEECE WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- Fleeces must remain on display until release time 8pm Sunday, Sept. 24. Fleeces may remain until 12 pm Monday, Sept. 25. The Fair will not be responsible for fleeces after that time.
- 3. Fleece must be shorn from sheep and goats owned by the exhibitor.
- 4. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth. The definition of 12 months shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade.
- 5. Exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums per class, and limited to entering a total of four breed classes.
- 6. Exhibitors may not enter the same fleece in the Fleece Show and Handspinning Fiber Show.
- 7. Ram or wether fleeces may be shown in designated classes and commercial classes.
- 8. Fleeces may not be tied. Present the fleece in large, clear plastic bags with no tears.
- 9. Natural colored fleeces entered in breed classes, Division 750 and 751 cannot be entered in the natural colored fleece classes Division 753 and 755. Natural Colored fleece division will be judged according to criteria established by the Natural Colored Wool Growers Association.
- 10. All judges' decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories, as seem proper.
- 11. A Best of Show plaque will be awarded to the best overall entry in the Fleece show.

There must be one tag for each class in which fleece will be shown. Classification will be based on breed. Classes will be established for any breed with two or more exhibitors. Fleeces may be entered from the white purebred classes, in divisions 750 and 751, or entered only in this division. Fleeces must have a tag filled out for each class in which they will be shown, entry fees apply.

HANDSPINNING FIBER SHOW RULES

- 1. Fibers must be delivered between 11am 6pm to Barn M on <u>Wednesday, Sept. 20, 2023</u>. An attendant will give you an entry tag for each class. These must be reviewed and completed before the fiber will be accepted.
- Fibers must remain on display until release time, <u>8 pm on</u> <u>Sunday, Sept. 24, 2023</u>. Fibers may remain until noon on Monday, Sept. 25, 2023. The Fair will not be responsible for fibers left on grounds after that time.
- 3. Fibers must be produced by the exhibitor and shall not be more than 12 months, or less than 6 months growth.
- 4. Exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums per class.
- 5. Exhibitors may not enter the same fleece in the Handspinning Fiber Show and Fleece Show.
- 6. No ram or wether fleeces may be shown except in designated classes.
- 7. Fibers may not be tied. Present the fleece in a large, clear plastic bag.
- 8. All judges' decisions will be final. Judge may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories as seem proper.
- 9. A Best in Show plaque will be awarded to the best overall entry in the Handspinning Fiber Show.
