ALL CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY, DIVISIONS, and INSTRUCTIONS must be followed to ensure your ENTRIES can be accepted for judging.

Judges are selected from professionals or highly accredited amateur artists working within their field of expertise.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

All woodwork or woodcarving for entry must be delivered to and picked up from the Washington State Fair. Walk-in entrance is through the Gold Gate. If you have heavy or oversized items you may drive to the **Pavilion** through the Gold Gate, on entry and pick up days. Please mark your calendar with the "Release" dates. **ITEMS WILL NOT BE STORED IF THEY ARE NOT PICKED UP. ANYTHING REMAINING AFTER WEDNESDAY, SEPT. 25 WILL BE DONATED TO CHARITY OR DISCARDED.**

ELIGIBILITY

- All woodwork or woodcarving entered must have been made by the entrant. The submission of another person's work is not allowed.
- Should questions arise concerning the eligibility of an entry, The Fair's decision will be respected as final. The Fair assumes no liability for breaches of copyright by exhibitor.
- All woodwork must be finished within the last two years.
- No article can be entered a second year.
- If you have won Best In Show for two consecutive years in a division, you will not be eligible to enter that division for one year.

INSTRUCTIONS

- See step-by-step online entry registration instructions on page 3. Fill out registration forms and pay online by 10 pm on August 14. Bring a copy of your printed online registration summary/receipt with your items on receiving days.
- Each entrant shall be limited to ONE ENTRY PER CLASS as to enter more would result in competing against oneself.
 Entries may be reclassified by staff or judges.
- Entry fee: **\$6.00 per piece in all division**s. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- All pieces intended to be hung must be delivered ready to hang.

CONDITIONS

- Each artist acknowledges that their woodwork or woodcarving will be displayed in public and there is no guarantee or assurances of any kind for the protection of the woodwork or woodcarving. Although every precaution will be made to safeguard the items, the Washington State Fair will not be responsible for theft, damage (including glass breakage) or loss of entries.
- The Fair reserves the right to not accept any material or remove any material from display at any time, for any reason and at their discretion. Items not displayed will be held in a secure storage area and the entrant will be called prior to The Fair opening.
- Entries cannot be accepted or returned by mail or common carrier.

WOODWORKING

Some things judges consider:

Finish: Appropriateness of finish, skill and quality in finishing.

Artistry: Perspective, form, proportion, balance, dramatic impact and originality in interpretation of subject. Use of grain, color, knots, etc., to enhance the carving's appeal.

General Impression: Overall effect, impact and intrinsic value.
