2 Purpose

The special entry access scheme (SEAS) is an umbrella scheme for applicants applying for courses via the Victorian Tertiary Admission Centre (VTAC), who have experienced educational disadvantage.

SEAS plays a role in the selection of VTAC applicants into courses listed with VTAC for study commencements in February/March. It enables extra consideration to be granted in the selection of students for course entry at Box Hill Institute. It is not however used as a replacement for course entry requirements. Consideration of SEAS may relax some aspects of the specific entry requirements, but not exempt them.

3 Scope

For students applying to Box Hill Institute courses via the VTAC application process only, for study commencement in February/March, where the student has also lodged a SEAS application directly with VTAC alongside their course application with VTAC.

4 Policy Statement

Box Hill Institute will provide all prospective students who have applied for a position in a Box Hill Institute course listed in the VTAC Guide with a fair and equitable selection process that includes the consideration of extenuating circumstances of disadvantage, in the following VTAC categories:

- VTAC SEAS Category 1 Personal information and location
- VTAC SEAS Category 2 Disadvantaged financial background
- VTAC SEAS Category 3 Disability or medical condition
- VTAC SEAS Category 4 Difficult circumstances

The Institute's Disability Action Plan also provides an additional framework for staff in the selection of students with a disability into Box Hill Institute courses, and supports the provision of equity and consideration in the selection process.

SEAS consideration will not exempt prospective students from completing all the requirements listed under the selection criteria section of each course in the online VTAC course guide. Applicants must attend all interviews, sit any required tests, meet prerequisites, submit all required folios, and fill in all required forms and any other selection requirements.

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Fulfilment of all course eligibility requirements (with or without SEAS), does not guarantee an offer.

Applicants must lodge their SEAS application through VTAC once their initial course application is also lodged. Application lodgement is made via VTAC's online application system.

5 Code of Conduct

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the Box Hill Institute Student Code of Conduct.
