



What is NEIS?



New Business Assistance with NEIS



- New Enterprise Incentive Scheme (NEIS) is delivered by a network of 21 providers across Australia.
- Funded by the Commonwealth Government (DESE)
- People interested in running their own new small business could be eligible to participate in the NEIS program and become selfemployed business owners.
- Has been operating since 1985.
- A total of 8,600 NEIS places are available nationally each year.



How Does NEIS Support You?

FREE small business management training

 Certificate III in Entrepreneurship and New Business (BSB30220)

FREE business plan development support

FREE business mentoring and ongoing advice

- Five mentoring sessions
- Access to expert team of skilled and experiences small businesses owners to help your business achieve success.

IF Eligible (Eligible Income Support Recipients ONLY)

- NEIS allowance (39 weeks)
- Rental assistance (26weeks)



NEIS Eligibility



- Be at least 18 years of age (when signing your NEIS Agreement) (over 65's pension recipients allowed)
- Not be prohibited by law from working in Australia
- Not be an overseas visitor (eg working holiday or an overseas student)
- Not have participated in NEIS in the past 12 months
- Not be an undischarged bankrupt
- Be available to participate in NEIS training (if relevant)
- Work the proposed new Business (usually 35 hours per week)*
- > Retrenched workers in the last three months of their employment
- Serving members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF), and eligible family members, with an identified transition date
- Existing micro-business owners impacted by COVID-19 who need help to keep their business running &/or to refocus their business

^{*}Those people with partial capacity may work less hours. Those engaged in employment or accredited education up to 25 hours per week or have a documented caring responsibilities will need to commit at least 25 hours per week to their business





What Sort of Business Is Allowed?

- Not currently operating on a commercial basis
 - (Exception: An existing micro-business owner/sole trader seeking to refocus their business in response to COVID-19)
- Must be commercially viable
- Not involve a purchase or takeover of an existing business (no Good Will)
- Be lawful and compliant
- Capable of withstanding public scrutiny
- Not likely to bring the Commonwealth into disrepute
- Located and operated solely within Australia (suppliers can come from anywhere)
- Able to secure and maintain appropriate business insurance





Allowed Business Continued...

Evidence of the potential commercial viability

- Suitable skills/qualifications and/or experience
- Ability to obtain licences/permits and suitable insurance
- Adequate market research to demonstrate a market opportunity
- Access to sufficient finances to commence operating
- Committed to making the business work (passion)
- Capacity of the business to meet profit targets by the end of the first year

Business partnership

- Both NEIS and Non-NEIS partners are allowed
- At least 1 NEIS partner must attend the training program
- NEIS eligible partners must 51% control of the business
- A partnership agreement is required to be provided with the business plan

Assessments & Business Preparation

Centrelink Payments (if eligible)

NEIS Allowance (up to 39 Wks) Eligibility Requirements

Rental Assistance (up to 26 weeks) Eligibility Requirements

NEIS Training is a 13 week approved activity from Centrelink which starts from Day One of training





Topics Covered in the Training

- Introduction to Small Business
- Investigate & develop the Business idea
- Marketing Research & Planning the concept
- Legal, Risk, and Administrative issues
- Pricing, Costing and Break-even
- Taxation
- Financial management
- Personal Organisation
- Business planning



The course is a compulsory requirement for participating in NEIS



NEIS Contract



- 12 month contract between participant and the Department of Employment, Skills, Small and Family Business.
- NEIS provider will liaise with the participant to make sure the NEIS contract obligations are met.
- Participant needs to have an approved business plan by the NEIS provider to proceed to this stage.
- Eligible participants would receive a NEIS payment for up to 39 weeks and also rental assistance up to 26 weeks.
- Monthly contact and quarterly reporting is mandatory for the participant during NEIS contract.
- Individual mentoring will be provided during the NEIS contract by the NEIS provider.



Details on NEIS Payment



- NEIS Allowance Currently \$629.50 per fortnight (if eligible)
- Equivalent to the JobSeeker allowance (single 22 or over, no children rate)
- NEIS Business Income IS NOT means-tested (even if you are making \$10,000 p/wk in your business!)
- You will be paid fortnightly for up to 9 months (approx. \$12,300)
- External Earnings
- Can earn up to double NEIS allowance each fortnight (eg: casual job) You can earn up to \$7,449.60 gross per quarter from non business income
- Calculated each financial quarter (based on number of NEIS payments each quarter) Your actual earnings should exceed 75% of projections, as per your business plan at the end of the 2nd and 3rd quarters
- Rental Assistance
- Paid for the first 6 months (up to 26 weeks) if eligible (Max \$142.80 p/w)



NEIS Payments Continued



- Pension recipients
- Parenting payment (Single) & Disability Support pension recipients, and volunteers receiving a DHS/DVA income support payments (no job search requirement) may:
 - Remain on current payment of choose to transfer to NEIS Allowance
 - Payments are means-tested you need to report business profit
 - Transfer at commencement, or anytime within the first 39 weeks of NEIS assistance.
- Parenting/Family allowance recipients
- If your current income payments are higher than the NEIS allowance rate a request for a 'top-up' can be made.
- You will need to discuss your eligibility with Centrelink/Services Australia



Now What?



•	Attend an information Session 🗸

•	Enrol, attend and complete small business training
•	Submit your business plan for approval
•	NEIS Agreement signed – commence NEIS Assistance
•	Commence your NEIS business (insurance) and NEIS allowance (if eligible)
