Become your best with VDSS

What is VDSS?

The Vocational Education & Training (VET) Delivered to School Students (VDSS) program gives secondary school students the chance to explore their interests and gain credits for their Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) or VCE Vocational Major (VCE VM). They will also obtain unit competencies towards a qualification at a Certificate II or Certificate III level.

It's another way to learn and grow, that complements traditional secondary schooling.

How does VDSS work?

Students will attend Box Hill Institute for one half day per week as part of their usual secondary schooling. They will work towards completion of either a full or partial vocational qualification, establishing a pathway to their career and further study.

VDSS courses run for up to 2 years and are open to students in Years 10, 11 or 12.

Get the best of both worlds. Combine your VCE or VCE VM with accredited vocational training at TAFE.


