Minutes of a Meeting on Thursday 14 January 2016, 3.45pm in school

Present: Ben Lough (present PSHCE coordinator), Fr Gerald Beauchamp (PSHCE Governor)

In the new curriculum PSHCE is being given a higher profile and is being integrated into all subjects. Ben showed Fr Gerald the current PSHCE Curriculum Map which is based on the suggested programme of study from the PSHE Association (Health Education Partnership: Tri-Borough PSHE Wellbeing Framework for Primary Schools).

Oral Health In the school this generally good but following up the commitment from the last meeting a school assembly in 2015 included a presentation by a dentist. Ben thought that although useful the presentation was not quite appropriate for such young children.

Sex Education This continues within the policy agreed by the governors. Ben will research what other local schools are doing.

Friendship Day This had a very beneficial impact last year and was combined with an E-Safety Day which also involved the parents.

Healthy Living Week This was a success last year and will take place again in the summer term: 27 June- 1 July.

Healthy Eating Ben has worked with Evelyn, Matt and Theresa to encourage healthy eating. What has worked well is giving out tokens to children making healthy eating choices at lunchtime. Classes have competed for who gets the most tokens in the same way that classes compete for best attendance/punctuality etc. This has helped generate a healthy eating culture - an interesting example of 'nudge'.

Mental Health Monitored using Are You OK? Days.

Culture When issues arise children are encouraged to ask appropriate questions and staff are trained to explain taboos.
