HOW THE BRITISH CAMEROONS WERE OPENED

A little while ago we told of the journey made by car across Africa from east to west to place pioneers from Uganda in several different goal territories. The following extract from the final report of this journey, written by Violette Nakhjavani, tells how the last goal of the journey was achieved and one of our British goals was opened.

'On the 10th of October we had crossed the border of the French Cameroons and had raised the cry of Yá-Bahá'u'l-Abhá for the first time in that virgin territory. This is a beautiful country, all green, with good roads running through cocoa, coffee and banana plantations. Natural springs, rivers and falls abound. Yaounde, the capital of the French Cameroons, was reached the following day. It is a small town but beautiful and clean.

'According to our plan, we expected to cross the border of the British Cameroons on the 11th by driving day and night. We actually succeeded in this, only to find in the British Customs that the road ahead was closed. We were forced to return to French territory and to take a much longer road, crossing the border further north. It was on this road that we waited two days in a garage for the repair of the car. Our greatest desire was to reach British Cameroons before the end of the Holy Year, and God helped us, for in the early morning of October 15th we left the garage, crossed the British border for the second time, raced on to Mamfe and from there, in the middle of the country, Enoch sent his cable to the beloved Guardian announcing his safe arrival. On that historic night, in the government rest-house at Mamfe, the three of us celebrated this great occasion with prayers of thanksgiving.'

Enoch Olinga, the pioneer, after a couple of months of difficulty, obtained a residence permit and a job and is happily established there. Moreover, the fruits of the sacrifices made and the difficulties overcome in achieving this goal are beginning to become evident—already there are thirteen new believers in the British Cameroons.

EUROPEAN NEWS

SHETLANDS

Brigitte Hasselblatt writes: 'How I love this island with its warm-hearted people. Every mind seems receptive and every heart happy. But I think as the hills—their real beauty and majesty is revealed through the sun—so with the people, their real selves have to be revealed to themselves (through constant effort on the part of the Bahá'ís!) through the Divine Teachings.'

MALTA

From Olga Mills we hear that she 'has met an old lady who knew Prof. Browne and his family in Oxford, and seemed alert. Also a young Maltese woman who would like to know more about the Teachings.'

FAROES

'I have, as you know, given the message to a great many—they know of the Teaching and they accept and see the right thing and its necessity for the world to come in its proper shape . . . I have a contact who is as close as can be to the Faith . . . he talks to people about the Faith, and they are listening to him, too. The other day he talked to a man who got so interested that he said, "I must meet Mr. Bahá'í".' So writes Eskil Ljungberg.

ORKNEYS

Charles Dunning has had a visit from a Bahá'í, Sgt. Ben Levy, of the American Forces in Germany, who has spent his leave on a travelling visit to our communities. He was a most welcome visitor and his stay with Charles was a great help to our pioneer and to the committee.

HEBRIDES

Mrs. Marion Mihaeloff is planning a similar visit to see Geraldine Craney, who is happily settled, with a job she likes, good accommodation and many friends amongst whom are several interested in the Faith.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Miss Baxter has now returned from this 'holiday island' while the tourist season is on. Mr. Asgharzadeh remains alone; he will be visited shortly by Mr. St. Barbe Baker.

CYPRUS

A report on the general conditions in this island was sent by Hugh McKinley, summarised here: 'Through the influence of the Cause of God, the name and nature of the island — which really has the name of "Devil's Island", given by the Turks — will be changed and purified.' So he introduces his report.

Several conditions make teaching both unusual and of necessity both indirect and slow. Cyprus is a British colony, *i.e.* governed by outsiders, against whom there is some local feeling and verbal agitation. There is the Greek Orthodox Church, heading the movement of Enosis, or the self-determination of the Cypriots and return to Greece. There are the Turks, a small and poor minority with very little say in affairs. Turkish life is mostly in small villages and Islam has no force.

The British are very British, and for most occidentals social life is mainly in clubs and cabarets, as they are

there mainly for short terms and are out to enjoy themselves and have a good time. The only possible common meeting ground is the church. The Greeks fear they may take away their money and the Turks fear they may be in league with the Greeks against them and against Islám. They, however, welcome the British administration as security for their rights that would vanish were Enosis a fact.

Greeks and Turks live a very exclusive family life and it is not easy to make any contact with them. Hugh's job gets him in touch with a variety of business people; he has been given Bahá'í Holy Days off.

He writes that generally they do not speak directly of the Faith, but strive to live it in their dealings with everyone; they are members of the British Council Club and are registered as Bahá'ís. When they think of any project they view it on a permanent basis—'We're here for ever', and do not wish to be too hasty or precipitate at the beginning.

The group has lately been visited by the Hakim family on their way to the Holy Land, and they brought that love and living of the Teachings which is the attractive force for the non-Bahá'ís and the

example to us all'.

All independent states, principalities European Continent - excluding Soviet Republic, satellites - opened. All territories North, Central, South America, excluding Labrador, opened. All territories Asiatic Continent outside Russian orbit opened except Tibet, Bhutan. All islands Mediterranean, all islands North Sea opened except Spitzbergen. All African sovereign states, colonies, protectorates, trust territories, exception Togolands, Spanish Guinea, Bechuanaland, Swaziland, Gambia, French Cameroons opened. All islands North, South Atlantic except St. Helena, St. Thomas, Anticosti, Falklands opened. All Indian Ocean islands exception Socotra, Cocos, Comoro, Mentawei, Nicobar, Chagos, Kuria Muria opened. All islands North, South Pacific — exclusive Soviet controlled territories — opened except Galapagos, Gilbert Ellis, Admiralty, Loyalty, Marshall, Mariana, Brunei, Portuguese Timor.

Concourse on High hail (with) delight phenomenal rapidity victories Bahá'í pioneering virgin areas globe. Encouraged address urgent plea all National Assemblies concerned, as well as each, every prospective pioneer assigned aforementioned territories, expedite every means disposal arrival respective posts ere expiry swiftly passing three-month period separating them conclusion opening year auspiciously unfolding decade.
