BAHA'I ADMINISTRATION

SOURCES of the ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

'.bdu'l-Baha, Who incarnates an institution for which we can find no parallel whatsoever in any of the world's recognised religious systems, may be said to have closed the Age to which He Himself belonged and opened the one in which we are now labouring. His Will and lestament should thus be regarded as the perpetual, the indissoluble link which the mind of Him Who is the Mystery of God has conceived in order to ensure the continuity of the three ages that constitute the component parts of the Baha'i Dispen-The period in which the seed of the Faith sation. had been slowly germinated is thus intertwined both with the one which must witness its efflorescence and the subsequent age in which that seed will have finally yielded its golden fruit.

The creative energies released by the Law of Baha'u llah, permeating and evolving within the mind of 'Aba'l-Baha, have, by their very impact and close interaction, given birth to an Instrument which may be viewed as the Charter of the New World Order which is at once the glory and the promise of this most great Dispensation.....

The Administrative Order, which ever since 'Abdu'l-Baha's ascension has evolved and is taking shape under our very eyes.....may be considered as the framework of the Will itself, the inviolable stronghold wherein this new-born child is being nurtured and developed. This Administrative Order, as it expands and consolidates itself, will no doubt manifest the potentialities and reveal the full implications of this momentous Document - this most remarkable expression of the Will of One of the most

remarkable Figures of the Dispensation of Baha'-u'llah. It will, as its component parts, its organic institutions, begin to function with efficiency and vigour, assert its claim, and demonstrate its capacity to be regarded not only as the nucleus but the very pattern of the New World Order destined to embrace in the fullness of time the whole of mankind......

To what else if not to the power and majesty which this Administrative Order - rudiments of the future all-enfolding Baha'i Commonwealth - is destined to manifest, can these utterances of Baha'u'llah allude: "The world's equilibrium hath been upset through the vibrating influence of this most great, this new World Order. Mankind's ordered life hath been revolutionized through the agency of this unique, this wondrous System - the like of which mortal eyes have never witnessed.".

In the Tablets of Baha'u'llah where the institutions of the International and Local Houses of Justice are specifically designated and formally established; in the institution of the Hands of the Cause of God which first Baha'u'llah and then Abdu'l-Baha brought into being: in the institution of both local and national Assemblies which in their embryonic stage were already functioning in the days preceding 'Abdu'l-Baha's ascension: in the authority which the Author of our Faith and the Centre of His Covenant have in their Tablets chosen to confer upon them; in the institution of the Local Fund which operated according to 'Abdu'l-Baha's specific injunctions addressed to certain Assemblies in Persia: in the verses of the Kitabi-Addas, the implications of which clearly anticipate the institution of the Guardianship: in the explanation which 'Abdu'l-Baha, in one of His Tablets, has given to, and the emphasis He has placed upon, the hereditary principle and the law of primogeniture as having been upheld by the

Prophets of the past - in these we can discern the faint glimmerings and discover the earliest intimation of the nature and working of the Administrative Order which the Will of 'Abdu'l-Baha' was at a later time destined to proclaim and formally establish.

LOCAL and NATIONAL HOUSES OF JUSTICE

It should be carefully borne in mind that the local as well as the international Houses of Justice have been expressly enjoined by the Kitab-i-Agdas; that the institution of the National Spiritual Assembly, as an intermediary body, and referred to in the Master's Will as the "Secondary House of Justice", has the express sanction of 'Abdu'l-Baha; and that the method to be pursued for the election of the International and National Houses of Justice has been set forth by Him in His Will, as well as in a number of His Tablets. Moreover, the institutions of the local and national Funds, that are now the necessary adjuncts to all local and national spiritual assemblies, have not only been established by 'Abdu'l-Baha in the Tablets He revealed to the Baha'is of the Orient, but their importance and necessity have been repeatedly emphasized by Him in His utterances and writings. The concentration of authority in the hands of the elected representatives of the believers; the necessity of the submission of every adherent to the Faith to the considered judgement of Baha'i Assemblies; His preference for unanimity in decision; the decisive character of the majority vote; and even the desirability for the exercise of close supervision over all Baha'i publications, have been sedulously instilled by 'Abdu' 1-Baha as evidenced by His authenticated and widely scattered Tablets. To accept His broad and humanitarian Teachings on one hand, and to reject and dismiss with neglectful indifference His more challenging and distinguishing precepts on the

other, would be an act of manifest disloyalty to that which He has cherished most in His life.

Extracts from "Guidance for Today and Tomorrow" compiled from the writings of Shoghi Effendi.

THE REMAINING TASKS on the HOME FRONT

1. CONSOLIDATION

The Baha'i community is moving into a new phase since Teaching Conference. Strengthened through a crisis which has demonstrated to all men the spiritual sacrifice and the world-wide unity of the Cause. Our hearts have been inspired and uplifted by the calm unwavering purpose shown by the young Baha'is in Morocco. The news brought the Faith suddenly out of obscurity with reports in the National and local press, and in Television announcements. The growing realisation of the divine institution of the Local Spiritual Assemblies was befittingly demonstrated when they arose unitedly throughout the country, with speed and dignity, to launch an appeal for justice, under the guidance of the Hands of the Cause, and the National Spiritual Assembly. The local Press Officers, some newly appointed to the L.S.A's,

intended primarily as links in the publicity for the World Congress, have had an unexpected initiation.

Together with these larger issues, the communities are daily achieving a greater maturity, in the steady deepening through prayer and study by the individual pelievers, in increased personal teaching. in encouraging each other, a more humble approach to personal service, in sublimating personality in community achievement. Added to this is a greater care in the arranging of the 19 Day Feast and the celebration and understanding of the Holy Days. All these things form the warp and woof of the intricate pattern of consolidation, the twin goal of the beloved Guardian's Crusade. The fruits of fulfilling our goals are the promised "unprecedented increase in numbers"; this fact must never distract us from the task of deepening in unity and love within the communities under the shelter of the Covenant: a love which we in turn give out to humanity: a love which is the attraction; a love which will prepare us to befittingly gather in the harvest.

- PORTSMOUTH will be reduced to 7 when Edgar and Pearl Boyett leave for Australia on 28th February. There are hopes of one pioneer, This Assembly needs a pioneer family.
- SALISBURY have been helped by the arrival of Naomi Long. Their Assembly will be assured when Moira becomes 21 in Feb.
- SOUTHPORT reduced to 3 by the departure to
