Dear Friends,

Work in London is showing signs of greater vitality - the public meetings are better attended and many new contacts have been made. Thus a problem arises - these people must be taught and the Baha'is themselves must be qualified to teach. This problem is not peculiar to London, but arises all over the country. We need more and more teachers. Every Bahá'í, on accepting the Faith, is under the inescapable obligation to teach the Cause in every way he can. The way of teaching will vary with each individual, but the need is the same, we must know more and more about the Teachings. we must seriously and carefully prepare ourselves. With this in view, the Spiritual Assembly has organised a study class to be held once a week, and it is urged that everyone who possibly can should attend this, whilst those who cannot are reminded that the Lending Library contains books which can be studied at home. Let us devote this winter to steady preparation for the work which Bahá'u'lláh in His Great Bounty offers us, so that we may not fail whatever the demands made upon us as individuals and as a community.
