In May of this year it was reported at a 19-Day Feast that the financial position was healthier than at any time for several years. A request was made by many that a second series of lectures be held at Caxton Hall in the Autumn. Unfortunately the flow of funds within the last few months has not been satisfactory. The Treasurer now reports that after paying the expenses of the Caxton Hall meetings, £6.2.6. is still required to meet the quarterly bills of the Centre (rent, light, heat, telephone).
