Dear Friends,

The world of today moves in aimless circles, bereft of vision and understanding, because it has lost the secret of integration. A writer, crying from the depths of his heart, has recently uttered these ominous words: "At present we are a world of individualists".

Within the fold of the Cause of God we come to learn how to integrate our lives with the organic and growing body of the Faith. We cease to be self-seeking individualists. Thus the Guardian speaks of the followers of Bahá'u'lláh: "Conscious of their high calling, confident in the society-building power which their Faith possesses, they press forward undeterred and undismayed, in their efforts to fashion and perfect the necessary instruments wherein the embryonic World Order of Bahá'u'lláh can mature and develop. It is this building process, slow and unobtrusive, to which the life of the World-wide Baha'i Community is wholly consecrated, that constitutes the one hope of a stricken society".

Let us recall the moving appeal of the Master: "O ye friends, Fellowship, fellowship! Love, love! Unity, unity! - So that the power of the Baha'i Cause may appear and become manifest in the world of existence".
